### PREPARATION AND REHEARSALS

### **Preparation**

Each student will receive an annotated siddur for the outdoor ceremony and a picture of their Torah portion from the Torah scroll that will be used at their ceremony.

### **Rehearsals**

All students will have two rehearsals during the week of their Bar/Bat Mitzvah – Thursday afternoon on Zoom for the cantor and student and Friday morning IN PERSON for the rabbi, cantor, student, and all participating family members. Your officiating cantor will send you the Zoom link for the rehearsal in the weeks leading up to your ceremony.

#### FRIDAY EVENING PARTICIPATION

### Ceremonies May 15-May 29

**Torah Blessings Video:** Our Friday evening worship will still be virtual during this timeframe. We will invite each Bar/Bat Mitzvah family to create a video of one or both Torah blessings so that we can honor you during the Friday evening service.

## Ceremonies June 5 and Following

**In-Person Candle Lighting and Kiddush:** Beginning in June, we will host in-person outdoor worship on Friday evenings. We invite all B'nai Mitzvah students and their immediate family to participate in the ceremony by lighting the candles at the beginning of the service and leading the Kiddush at the end of the service.

#### SATURDAY MORNING DETAILS

### Guest Information - Attending in Person - 50 People Total (excluding clergy)

The ceremony will be on the Temple Lawn between the Grape Street and Forest Street parking lots (parallel to I<sup>st</sup> Avenue) between two large, beautiful trees (and in the shade of the Sanctuary roof). Please park in the Grape Street parking lot on the right-hand side as you are facing the building. There is a sidewalk from that side of the parking lot that leads to the ceremony site. Please remind guests that we require mask and social distance protocol at all times before, during, and after the ceremony. We will not be able to provide extra masks for those who forget.

### Family Participating in Ceremony

We suggest that you and your immediate family arrive at Temple 30 minutes prior to your ceremony time. We will have a pop-up tent and a table set up for the ceremony leaders (mostly clergy and student, although sometimes also for parents) and two stationary wireless microphones. We will also have 50 folding chairs ready to be arranged in socially distant set-up that works for your family. We will practice from the actual Torah once, review the set-up, and sign the B'nai Mitzvah certificate before the ceremony officially begins.

## **Family Honors**

Our outdoor ceremonies continue to offer the opportunity for family members to participate and be honored as part of the ceremony. Our outdoor ceremony includes:

- The Torah Pass for Grandparents and Parents socially distant and reformatted as a blessing that grandparents and parents speak out loud to the student
- Aliyot/Torah Blessings the chance for different family members to bless the Torah before and after the student reads the Torah portion
- Parent Blessing a space for parents to offer personal words to their student

# Photography/Videography

We will be able to take a small number of photos outside before the ceremony. If you would like, you can also have a stationary photographer and/or videographer photograph and record from a distance during the ceremony. A reminder that since we are streaming the ceremony, we will have a video of the ceremony recorded that we can share with you after that day.
