

The following pages from *Luah Hashanah 5780* describe home rituals and prayer services to help you prepare for and experience a meaningful Passover.

The instructions for prayer services apply to those praying with a minyan.

If you are praying *without* a minyan, omit all instances of:

- קַדִּישׁ Kaddish
- בָּרְכוּ Barekhu and response
- קְדוּשָׁה Kedushah
- Repetition of the Amidah
- Torah Service

Instead, read the designated Torah and haftarah selections from a *humash* or other resource, *without* reciting *berakhot* (blessings).

May we all experience a safe, kosher, joyous, and meaningful holiday in these unprecedented times.

Pesah In Preparation

Searching for Ḥamets

The search is performed the evening before Pesah by the light of a candle (traditionally) or a flashlight. Before the search begins, most people distribute token pieces of bread around the home so that the search is successful. (Some wrap the pieces of bread to prevent inadvertent spilling of crumbs.) Brush any **חָמֵץ** *hamets* found into a wooden spoon using a feather. (Alternately, collect any wrapped **חָמֵץ**.)

The associated **בְּרָכָה** *berakhah* and nullification formula appear at the beginning of the **הַגְּדָה** *haggadah*.

1. Recite the **בְּרָכָה**.
2. Search darkened rooms of the home by the light of a candle or flashlight.
3. Collect all token pieces of bread and any **חָמֵץ** not designated for sale or for consumption in the morning.
4. Recite the first formula for nullification of **חָמֵץ** in a language you understand.
5. Set aside the **חָמֵץ** you found until morning.

Disposing of Ḥamets

We are allowed to possess **חֵמֶץ** *hamets* only during the early part of the daylight hours. Consult your rabbi for the exact time limit in your community. At or before that time, any remaining **חֵמֶץ** in your possession must be destroyed. The associated nullification formula appears at the beginning of the **הַגְּדָה** *haggadah*.

1. Do not recite a **בְּרָכָה** *berakhah*.
2. Destroy the remaining **חֵמֶץ**, including the **חֵמֶץ** found during the search the previous night. Traditionally, this is accomplished by burning. Other methods also are acceptable (e.g., flushing it down the toilet, crumbling and scattering it to the wind, disposing of it in a *public* waste receptacle).
3. Immediately afterward, recite the 2nd formula for the nullification of **חֵמֶץ** in a language you understand.

Wed 8 Apr (morning) **תַּעֲנִית בְּכוֹרִים** **Ta'anit Bekhorim**
Fast of the Firstborn (individual fast, begins at dawn)

Fast of the Firstborn

A firstborn male of a mother or a father observes this daytime fast on the eve of Pesah, recognizing that in Egypt the firstborn of Israel were saved, while the firstborn Egyptians died in the 10th plague.

If the firstborn male is a minor, the father fasts in his place. However, if the father is also a firstborn, the mother fasts in the child's place.

Fast of the Firstborn is an *individual* fast. Unlike a *communal* fast, it does not introduce liturgical changes or a special Torah reading.

Siyyum and Se'udat Mitsvah

If possible, hold a **סִיּוּם** *siyyum* (completion of study of a tractate of rabbinic literature) to exempt those attending from the obligation to fast.

1. Conduct the **סִיּוּם** after Shaḥarit.
2. Conclude the **סִיּוּם** with the special prayers and expanded **קְדִישׁ דְּרַבְּנָן** *kaddish derabbanan* for this occasion. Texts can be found at the end of a tractate in many editions of the Talmud and in the *Moreh Derekh* rabbi's manual.
3. Hold a **סְעוּדַת מִצְוָה** *se'udat mitsvah* (festive meal celebrating the performance of a *mitsvah*, in this case, the **סִיּוּם**).

As participants in the **סִיּוּם**, all firstborns present are permitted to eat at the festive meal and during the rest of the day as well.

Before Pesah – Day 1

Preparing an Eruv Tavshilin

When Yom Tov falls on a weekday, cooking is permitted, but only to prepare food for that particular day. On Shabbat all cooking is forbidden. Therefore, preparing food for a Shabbat that follows a Friday Yom Tov presents a difficulty.

To allow cooking for Shabbat on the preceding Friday Yom Tov:

On Wednesday before Yom Tov, perform the ritual of ערוב תבשילין *eruv tavshilin*, the combining (ערוב *eruv*) of the cooking for Yom Tov and Shabbat.

Start the Shabbat cooking Wednesday afternoon, following this procedure:

1. Before Yom Tov begins, take two prepared foods, customarily a baked food (e.g., מצה *matsah*) and a cooked food (e.g., a hard-cooked egg or a piece of cooked chicken or fish).
2. Recite the ברכה *berakhah*: ^{L78 S306 F716}

3. In a language you understand, recite a declaration that cooking for Shabbat was begun before—and will be completed on—Yom Tov. ^{L78 S306 F716}

By means of this combining (*eruv*), we are permitted to bake, cook, warm, kindle lights, and make all the necessary preparations for Shabbat during the festival (*yom tov*), we and all who live in this city/locale.

4. Set aside the two foods for eating on Shabbat during the day. The cooking for Shabbat may now be completed on Yom Tov.

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Preparing a Flame for Yom Tov

On Yom Tov, kindling a *new* fire is not permitted; however, the use of an *existing* fire for cooking or other purposes is permitted.

To light candles for Day 2 of Yom Tov (Thursday night), ensure that you have a fire burning before candle-lighting time for Day 1 (Wednesday) that will continue to burn until after dark on Thursday. For example:

- A burning candle that lasts for more than 25 hours
- A pilot light on a gas range (*not* a gas range with an electronic starter)

1. Before lighting candles, prepare a flame. See above.
2. Light the candles at least 18 minutes before sunset.

Each evening the Pesah סֵדֶר *seder* tantalizes all 5 of our senses as we celebrate, relive, enjoy, and learn from the events and teachings found in the *haggadah*. In addition to these meals, the afternoon meal each day is also a festive occasion, celebrated in the manner of Shabbat meals with:

- Yom Tov daytime קִדּוּשׁ *kiddush* ^{L81} ^{S335} ^{F746}
- *hamotsi* recited over 2 whole מִצּוֹת *matsot* ^{L81} ^{S313-14} ^{F746}
- *birkat hamazon* with Pesah additions ; see yellow box, below

Candle Lighting for Yom Tov – Day 2

Day 1 ends after dark: when 3 stars appear, or at least 25 minutes after sunset (at least 43 minutes after the time set for lighting candles on Day 1). Some wait longer. For the appropriate time in your community, consult your rabbi.

1. Wait until Day 1 ends.
2. Do not *strike* a match. Instead, transfer fire to the candles from an *existing* flame (see p. 125) by inserting a match or other stick into the flame.
3. Do not *extinguish* the match or stick. Instead, place it on a non-flammable tray or dish, and let it self-extinguish. Alternately, a wood *safety* match held vertically (flame up) usually self-extinguishes quickly.
4. Recite 2 ברכות *berakhot*: ^L79 ^S303 ^F718

Counting Omer

At Night

Count Omer after nightfall, preferably at least 23 minutes after sunset. See instructions, p. 212.

If your congregation conducts Arvit before nightfall, count Omer without reciting a ברכה *berakhah*. Encourage congregants to count individually later, after nightfall, with a ברכה.

In the Morning

Count Omer in the synagogue without reciting a ברכה. This counting fulfills the obligation of those present who neglected to count the previous night.

Candle Lighting for Shabbat after Yom Tov

At least 18 minutes before sunset, follow this procedure:

1. Do not *strike* a match. Instead, transfer fire to the candles from an *existing* flame (see p. 125) by inserting a match or other stick into the flame.
2. Do not *extinguish* the match or stick. Instead, place it on a non-flammable tray or dish, and let it self-extinguish. Alternately, a wood *safety* match held vertically (flame up) usually self-extinguishes quickly.

Tefillin during Ḥol Hamo'ed

Whether or not to wear תְּפִלִּין *tefillin* during Ḥol Hamo'ed is a long-standing controversy. Ashkenazic Jews tend to wear תְּפִלִּין; Sephardic and Hasidic Jews tend not to wear תְּפִלִּין. The practice in Israel is not to wear them. Some who wear תְּפִלִּין do not recite the בְּרָכוֹת *berakhot*.

- Determine your individual practice according to the following instructions:
 - If there is an established custom in your family, follow it.
 - If there is no established custom in your family, consult your rabbi.
 - Regardless of your custom, when you are in Israel, do not wear תְּפִלִּין.

On Yom Tov, kindling a *new* fire is not permitted; however, the use of an *existing* fire for cooking or other purposes is permitted.

To light candles for Day 8 (Wednesday night), ensure that you have a fire burning before candle-lighting time for Day 7 (Tuesday evening) that will continue to burn until after dark on Wednesday. For example:

- A burning candle that lasts for more than 25 hours
- A pilot light on a gas range (*not* a gas range with an electronic starter)

1. Before lighting candles, prepare a flame. See above.
2. Light the candles at least 18 minutes before sunset.

Candle Lighting for Pesah — Day 8

Day 7 ends after dark: when 3 stars appear, or at least 25 minutes after sunset (at least 43 minutes after the time set for lighting candles on Day 7). Some wait longer. For the appropriate time in your community, consult your rabbi.

1. Wait until Day 7 ends.
2. Do not *strike* a match. Instead, transfer fire to the candles from an *existing* flame (see p. 139) by inserting a match or other stick into the flame.
3. Do not *extinguish* the match or stick. Instead, place it on a non-flammable tray or dish, and let it self-extinguish. Alternately, a wood *safety* match held vertically (flame up) usually self-extinguishes quickly.
