*Yizkor* means “remember.”

As Jews, it is a sacred and profound obligation to recite the Mourner’s *Kaddish* for our loved ones at prescribed times during the year: communally, on the afternoon of *Yom Kippur* and on the last mornings of our three major Festivals (*Sukkot/Sh’mini Atzeret*, *Pesach*, and *Shavuot*); and as individuals on the specific *Yahrzeit* (anniversary of passing) of our loved ones.

By reciting the Mourner’s *Kaddish*, we not only honor the lives and perpetuate the names of those who have passed on to eternity, but we also enable their acts of goodness to continue to live among us and inspire us. Doing so publicly, in the midst of fellow worshippers, testifies to the power and strength of community. It demonstrates our collective faith in a God of life and love, who binds one generation to another.

In the midst of our hectic and stressful lives, it may be difficult to remember or make the time to join with others in our congregation family for *Yizkor*. To ease that difficulty, Temple Emanuel will be offering lunchtime *Yizkor* opportunities for Festivals that fall on a weekday. We hope that you will avail yourselves of these meaningful opportunities.

## MEDITATIONS ON LOSS

### A *Yizkor Kavanah*

A *kavanah* is a meditation to help direct our intentions as we pray. *Kavanah* comes from the Hebrew word *kivun*, which means both direction and intention.

As we prepare for *Yizkor*, the Memorial Service, we must acknowledge that, for some of us, this is a particularly difficult time. Some of us mourn for loved ones whose memories are a blessing; others have troublesome memories, unfinished business with those who have died.

Those who have not reconciled ourselves with family members cannot extol their lives or exalt their memories. Neither can we live forever with bitterness, anger, or rage in our lives.

While Judaism does not require that we forgive those who have perpetrated evil against us, in order to move toward *sh'leimut* – wholeness and personal integrity in our lives – we can use this time of memory for our own personal healing and growth.

The *Kaddish* is not a prayer that praises the dead; it is a prayer that praises God and the power of God in the world.

As we recite *Kaddish* together with Jews all over the world, we remember that death is an inevitable part of life. We mourn those who died before their time, those who died in suffering and pain, those whose lives enriched the world, and we remember the living, asking for healing for all who suffer so that they can move on.
