# From the Rabbi's Study

The Power of Stories

The book of Genesis is one of the most engaging parts of the Torah, filled with interesting stories; some that we love to share, and others that describe moral situations which are unflattering and even embarrassing.

Yet despite their difficulty our tradition never hid these stories or disowned those relatives. They've all kept their place in our holiest of texts. It's a decision that's led me to appreciate the Torah even more, because it provides an unvarnished portrayal of our founding families, detailing their successes as well as their failures.

This is one of the enduring gifts, not only of our Torah, but of 'stories' in general. It's why I frequently listen to the Moth Radio Hour on NPR; a program where people from all walks of life share stories about their challenging moments. While their situations don't always relate directly to me, listening to someone describe difficult moments in their life almost always creates an emotional connection between them and me.

The truth is, I often get choked up listening to these stories of strangers. So much so, that by the end of the story, even though I wouldn't recognize them if we were standing in the same room, I no longer think of them as strangers.

The act of listening creates a bond between us. It opens my heart, touches my soul, and

leaves me richer than I was before.

I've encountered this same type of feeling when I've sat with families who've suffered a loss, as they share stories of their loved one. I feel privileged to be present for these conversations, and sometimes a bit sad — that I never realized quite how extraordinary a person I 'thought I knew' was, until after they were gone. And how much more I would have treasured them if I had known them better.

#### The stories we carry within us are precious; priceless gifts we don't share often enough.

Experiences of challenge and heartache, triumph and tragedy — they're all part of what it means to be human; part of what makes us who we are. They're experiences that all of us have at one time or another, but rarely acknowledge to ourselves — let alone to others. And yet, those who are brave enough to tell their stories, rather than keep them locked up inside, offer gifts to the rest of us — precious, priceless gifts that remind us of the challenges we all face, and provide us with the opportunity to build deeper bonds of caring and connection.









#### **Yahrzeit List**

A yahrzeit is the anniversary date of the death of a loved one, which is marked by the lighting of a yahrzeit candle on that day, and by reciting Kaddish in their memory. Yahrzeit reminders are emailed to the mourner (paper letters are mailed to anyone who does not have an email address in our system) approximately one month prior to the yahrzeit date. If your loved one has a memorial plaque, their name will automatically be included on the Yahrzeit list that is read during the corresponding Shabbat Service. If your loved one does not have a memorial plaque, please reach out to the temple office so we can add their name to the Yahrzeit list.

#### **Kaddish List**

Kaddish is a prayer said by a mourner to show that, despite the loss of a loved one, we still praise God. It is also a way to honor the life of the deceased. Our Kaddish list contains the names of loved ones who have passed away within the last year. TBE member names remain on the Kaddish list for a full 11 months. The names of extended family of our members are placed on the Kaddish list for 30 days (Shloshim) and can be included for the full 11 months if requested by the TBE member.

#### Mi Shebeirach List

The words Mi Shebeirach translate to 'the One who blessed.' It is a prayer that asks God to bring about healing for those in need. Our Mi Shebeirach list is read every week immediately prior to Shabbat services and contains the names of any TBE members or loved ones who are in need of healing

prayers. Those attending the service are also invited to share names of loved ones in need of healing during the Mi Shebeirach prayer.

#### **Memorial Plaques**

Memorial Plaques are displayed on the walls outside our worship spaces and serve to memorialize family members who are no longer with us. Plaques may be purchased for \$750 and include your loved one's English name as well as their English and Hebrew date of death. The names of those who have a Memorial Plaque are automatically included on the Yahrzeit list which is read on the anniversary of their death.

#### **Trees of Life**

Purchasing a leaf for one of our 3 Trees of Life is a wonderful way to celebrate milestones and achievements of our friends and family. Leaves (or stones — contact Leslie for more details) may be purchased for \$154–\$1,000 and can accommodate up to six lines of text. The Trees of Life are located in the foyer.

#### **Bricks**

Inscribing a brick in our garden pathway is also a meaningful way to remember a significant moment in your family's life and add beauty to our TBE grounds. Bricks may be purchased for \$180 and can accommodate up to three lines of text.

Biblical commentators explain away parts of the Bible that seem out of chronological order with the phrase "Ein mukdam um'uchar

baTorah" — There is no earlier or later in the Torah. That's to say that the whole of Torah happened in a non-linear way, different then how we understand time. I am aware of that phrase as I write these words for our November and December bulletin. I can reflect on the beautiful American themes of Thanksgiving and the increasing light we aim to bring the world during Chanukah, but at the "same time", I am writing these words less than two weeks after the massacres in Israel.

How can I access gratitude, and focus on light, when engulfed in emotions that encompass fear, vigilance, and sorrow? By focusing on what I have...this exact moment.

And so. I turn to the mindfulness and meditation work I have been exploring through The Institute of Jewish Spirituality. I share that perspective with you here, in case you ever encounter moments of difficulty, and want to access gratitude and light.

If I close my eyes and focus on this moment, right now, and this breath, I can let go of all my concerns about the future, or the past...at least for this moment.

It isn't an instantaneous release....more like a hamstring trying to stretch, all tight and achy, but one that releases as we allow it to stretch. Our thoughts will race around, no doubt, but we can notice that and release the thought, and return to breathing in this moment. Once I can get fully present to the moment I am in, and let go of the worries and concerns about the future or past, I realize that this moment, right now, is like any other moment in time. If it were July, this moment, right now, might feel the same. If it were the season of Thanksgiving or Chanukkah, it would feel the same in this exact moment. So in this exact moment, I can allow myself to experience gratitude for that of which I am grateful. I can be present to the light in my life. We know not of what happens next, but we can be present to what is happening now. To that end, I hope this finds you well in this moment, and pray that your next "this moment" is as fulfilling as possible.

# Education Apolate Finding Light in the Darkness

How do we find light in the darkness? How do we find gratitude in the most challenging times?

The Talmud teaches that part of a Chanukkah celebration is to "publicize the miracle" by displaying our hanukkiot where neighbors and people passing by can see them. It can be so hard to find the joy in these dark times for the Jewish people, and yet, expressing our Jewishness, celebrating our simchas and living our lives proudly is exactly what we must do in the face of adversity!

In addition to celebrating Sukkot and Simchat Torah last month, our students in school helped to spread that extra light to soldiers in Israel. They decorated beautiful, handmade Israeli flags with peace doves and words of encouragement in Hebrew and English. The cards were sent directly to Israeli soldiers to remind them that we are standing with them and to show our love and gratitude. We spoke with all

our students in age-appropriate ways about the special connection we have to Israel, our Jewish homeland, even if we are far away. We ended by singing Hatikvah, (the Hope) the Israeli national anthem. Later in the month, our 6th and 7th graders learned about the special Chicago trip IsraelNow, an 8th grade, 8-day trip to experience Israel with their peers. It is my hope and prayer that ALL our students will be able to visit Israel and experience it for themselves.

To me, the goal of Jewish Education is to light a spark in our learners. A spark that continues to glow, grow, and mature with the learners. The spark inspires our learners to ask more questions, to explore and try new things and be proud of the heritage, tradition, and values it carries.

As sparks find one another, the light grows brighter and stronger as it lights the way for all those around it!
