From the Rabbi's Study

If I am not for myself, who will be for me?

"If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?"

This oft quoted saying of Hillel offers a balanced perspective on how to prioritize our responsibilities. The first phrase teaches that our primary responsibility is towards own well-being and that of our family. The second, reminds us that if we only focus on our own needs, we are missing the mark. And the third, makes us aware that both of these our obligations must be continuously met, rather than focusing on the first one now, and the second one later on in our lives, perhaps because we can never be certain of what the future will bring.

I was thinking about this teaching in the context of our upcoming High Holidays and realized that the structure of Hillel's teaching is opposite of how the High Holidays arrive. For rather than beginning by focusing on the self, as Hillel directs, our Rosh Hashanah focuses on the world as a whole. It is not until 10 days later on Yom Kippur that we direct our attention towards ourselves and our own needs. I was curious why on these days we uprooted Hillel's pattern of starting with the personal – making sure that we are in a healthy, stable place, before we expanded our attention outward into the world. Why the difference?

Perhaps it's because there are times when it's really hard to look at ourselves. Times when things might not be going the way we want or expect, and the

thought of figuring out why might be more than we can face.

When those moments arise, and they do for all of us, it's helpful to be able to look out at the world and be met by warm, caring people who are looking out for us and ready to lend a hand; to find a world like the one that God intended for us, where we can find comfort and support and realize that we're not in this all by ourselves. A world that enables us to let go of some of the reasons that prevent us from looking in the mirror taking an honest stock of ourselves. When we know there are people who will provide support, it's easier to let down our guard and see our flaws.

Perhaps our High Holidays begin with Rosh Hashanah, with the communal, to remind us that the support we need is around us, so that when Yom Kippur arrives we can take on the hard work we need to do to lift ourselves up.

When it comes to what we do in the world, we start with the personal and work outwards, never forgetting our obligation for both. When it comes to the work we need to do for ourselves, it often starts with seeing that there's loving, caring people around us who will support our work along the way.

May we take good care of ourselves, our family and community, and may we provide good support to enable each of us to reach our fullest potentials.









When is the office open?

The building has programs on Monday, Tuesday and sometimes Wednesday evenings. We are generally closed (or dark) on Thursday evenings.

Where do I enter Temple Beth-El?

Most people enter the building at our West or "back door" because the parking spaces are closer to the door and it is where our accessible parking spaces are located. All of our internal doors are locked for security purposes. Within the vestibules, you can press the appropriate button to have the door remotely unlocked by a staff member (one for when the office is open, another for when the office is closed). If you find the outer door is locked, please press the outside button to reach the building attendant.

What are some of the different spaces within the building?

Beider Social Hall: Beider is our upstairs social hall used for our weekly "pre" Oneg shabbat and many of our other large group gatherings. There is a full-service kitchen attached to Beider because who can gather and socialize without food? In this room you will find the wall of honor for those members who have contributed to our endowment fund.

Werner Social Hall: This lower-level social hall is larger than Beider and provides us with a second gathering space for our congregation. Werner Hall also has an attached kitchen.

Brown Family Sanctuary: Our beautiful sanctuary seats up to 250 people with room to expand thanks to a moveable wall between the sanctuary and Beider Hall. This space, designed by the architect Fred Bernheim, is modeled after a sanctuary in Germany. Bernheim wanted to recreate his childhood synagogue, which was destroyed on Kristallnacht. He vowed to one day recreate that sanctuary and TBE is the lucky recipient of his fond memories. The two pillars (that you see from the outside of the building) are a center point of the design and the stained glass honors the 10 Commandments. The Bimah is flexible, providing the clergy options for different types of services. Our Ark symbolizes a Torah and houses our many scrolls.

The Mishkan: The word MISHKAN means "dwelling" or "tabernacle". It was a "Tent of Meeting" for G-d and Moses, and was considered a holy place. Our Mishkan is our second worship space and provides us a very beautiful space for more intimate worship experiences.

The sweet innocence of grabbing living room couch cushions, and securing them in their cubical formation with a blanket placed

atop. The comfort of climbing in and dwelling in that new fort. That's a cherished hallmark of childhood, with Saturday morning cartoons lilting in from the television ("I'm just a bill, and I'm only a bill..."), as heaters chase off the licks of winter's chilly intrusion. That little hideaway was so flimsy, but it felt so safe. Precious, was that incubating nook, in a big overwhelming world that can make little sense to a child.

We have just come through the Days of Awe. Rabbi Alan Lew^(z") writes, in his magnificent book "This Is Real, And You Are Completely Unprepared", about how we journey from the summer observance of Tisha B'Av through the High Holy Days, and conclude this segment with Sukkot. Rabbi Lew notes how we start by tearing down the walls of our safe dwelling (Tisha B'Av marks the destruction

of the Holy Temples in Jerusalem), and then we lay ourselves bare during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Only then, after being at our most vulnerable, and allowing for our deep cleansing, then we can begin to rebuild with the flimsiest of structures... the Sukkah. It's a nice shelter in an overwhelming world that can make little sense to an adult. It is a fancy fort that each person can decorate with their own touches, be it gourds, paper chains, or other trinkets. Together, we can build the most magnificent structures, gorgeous dwellings.

These past six months have already seen an amazing renaissance at Temple Beth-El.

The vibrance of this community grows exponentially, and yet we always strive to maintain the intimacy and connections that have been the hallmark of TBE. We are building our congregation moment by moment, and each person adds their own decorative touch. As this season continues to unfold into the year to come, let us continue to revel in the sweet innocence of dwelling together.





Education Apolate Beyachad - Coming Together

Each word is based off a 3-letter root and each root can sprout tens if not more

words. The root ד-ה-י (yud, chet, dalet) pronounced yahad means united. Add a ב bet and it becomes ביהד beyachad usually translates as together. Take just the yud and the dalet and you have the word יי which means hand. It is also the word that we use to describe the tool used to help us read Torah so that our fingers don't touch the parchment. The word beyachad then can be looked as "hand in hand" literally describing what it means to be together. Add a love and another yud and you get יהודי Yehudi, meaning Jew! There are so many of these connections and spirals off just one root!

I love this exploration of Beyachad because it truly captures the essence of Jewish community: it means being together, in hands-on partnership to build the world we want to see. We can still learn on our own, we can still do the work of tikkun olam, repairing the world on our own; but its inherent in our language that we should be **together.**

This year in school we will be exploring ביהד beyachad from every angle! We will be TEMPLE BEYACHAD בית TOGETHER



focusing on building friendships and strengthening our community. We will be diving deeper into the Hebrew language and both the literal and figurative meanings and how they apply (or don't!) to our lives. We will be using our hands to build, to explore and create new things **together**.

There will be so many opportunities through the year to **come together**, whether is weekly for school and Shabbat, monthly for youth programming and holidays, or for special events such as the Family Retreat up at OSRUI. I can't wait to see how our lives are enriched by deepening our friendships and how our world will change for the better when we are together.




