#### From Rabbi Sarah's Desk



My beloved dog Patches died unexpectedly less than a week ago, as I write this in early August. I'm heartbroken. He had just turned nine and had been coughing. We brought him to the vet for a cardiac

workup, and he died during the echocardiogram. Apparently, his poor heart was in such bad shape, it couldn't even handle the procedure. My poor heart is struggling with his loss.

I wish I could write an inspirational message or bring enthusiasm for the new Jewish year ahead. Instead, I bring you grief and a tribute to the dog I inherited and fell in love with. Some of you know that I acquired Patches unexpectedly. He was my Uncle Steve's dog. In fact, I have a photo of two-year-old Rena meeting one-year-old Patches at Thanksgiving. It's adorable. Patches became a regular at Rosh Hashanah dinners and Passover seders, quietly lying under Uncle Steve's chair.

When my uncle passed away nearly 5 years ago, there was no one else to take the dog. Reluctantly, I became the owner of a fluffy, shedding, anxious, heartbroken dog. I wasn't sure if I'd be able to keep him. It didn't take long for the two of us to bond. I fell in love with that little guy. He became my constant companion, my "light shadow." Patches loved coming to Temple Beth Shalom. He picked me up at Kiddush most Friday nights and could often be found sleeping under my desk during the pandemic. I keep expecting to see him lying at my feet or waiting on the other side of the door. But he's not there.

Luckily, as a rabbi, I have language and tools around grief. Granted, they typically apply to the loss of a human loved one. I've been able to talk to my kids about their feelings sadness, anger, loss, a sense of injustice – and name them as grief. Judaism has a great deal of wisdom around mourning that can help us through our grief. While mourning for a pet doesn't have the same formal mourning structures of shiva, shloshim, and yahrzeits,

the emotional needs are similar.

Immediately following a loved one's death, we are disoriented and often shocked. The focus at this time is on arrangements for the funeral. After the burial, a mourner sits shiva, a week where we stay home from work and other obligations, and the community is meant to come to us, providing food, company, and memories of our loved ones. In our case, we mourned Patches' loss with two rituals and had friends over to keep us company.

This is followed by shloshim, which is the period up to 30 days from burial, when we start to dip a toe back into our daily lives. The grief is still ever present, and normalcy is far away. For a year, we mourn, reciting the Mourner's Kaddish daily, and adapting to a new normal. With a pet, we don't say Kaddish, but it's important to create the space to revisit the loss without allowing it to take over your life. When you read this article, my family and I will be in this phase of mourning.

Grief doesn't leave us, but like water, it morphs: a flood, a fog, a trickle. Following the first yahrzeit, the anniversary of death, we set fixed times to mourn. We never forget our loved ones, their memories are always present, but we have recreated a life without their physical presence. I know that eventually, I will get there with Patches. But I'm certainly not there yet. I'm looking forward to a new Jewish year and a fresh start.

There is a lot going on at Temple Beth Shalom this year. Peruse these pages and be sure to check your emails for all of the exciting events and opportunities. I'm looking forward to seeing you soon.

#### A Message from Our Educational Director by Bria Gunzburg

I'd like to welcome our returning families and those new to TBS! I hope that your summer brought time with family and friends and you are now feeling reenergized for the fall season!

We are excited to kick off Religious School for the 2023-2024 school year with in-person classes starting on Sunday, September 10th at 10:30am! After classes that day, we will have a Welcome Back Celebration as well as a special TBS Teens kick off, both starting at 12:00pm. Don't miss out on these enjoyable opportunities to celebrate the start of the new school year! For students in grades 3 through 7, Hebrew instruction will continue to be held remotely via Online Jewish Learning on Wednesday afternoons and Sunday mornings. OJL classes start on September 13th at 4:30pm.

The following weekend is Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year, and Youth Services and Programming will be offered on the first and second day of Rosh Hashanah, as well as on Yom Kippur.

As we enter the year 5784, we commemorate the Jewish New Year with apples and honey, blowing the shofar, and gathering together in prayer. When my non -Jewish friends ask what Rosh Hashanah celebrates, I like to give a simple explanation by deconstructing the words. 'Rosh' translates to 'head', 'Ha' translates to 'the', and 'Shanah' translates to 'year'. By breaking down the word, it's easy to see that the holiday

celebrates the "Head of the Year".

Our Religious School is fortunate to have amazing teachers that are proficient and passionate about educating our youth! Miss Aimee has been with us for many years, educating our younger students in Kitah Gan, Alef, and Bet. Mrs. Samson will teach Kitah Vav and Zayin again this year. Her kindness and deep knowledge of Judaism makes her well suited for the role as teacher for our eldest students. I will continue to teach Kitah Gimel, Dalet, and Hey. We are blessed to have Miss Aimee, Mrs. Samson, as well as our partners at Online Jewish Learning.

In mid-July, I attended a virtual conference titled "Learning to Lead Together" sponsored by USCJ. It is an annual Jewish educational conference led by the New Directors Institute. During the conference, I was able to collaborate with fellow US and Canadian Jewish educators new to their position. This enabled me to further hone my leadership skills and experience a variety of teaching methodologies, with an emphasis on experiential and interactive models of teaching and learning.



- Shemini Atzeret is 10/6-10/7.
- Simchat Torah is 10/7-10/8.

#### From 'Our Favorite Dishes" Yorktown Jewish Center Cook Book

#### SWEET CARROT KUGEL

- 2 lbs. cooked carrots (until tender)
- 6 eggs
- 1/2 c. sugar
- 6 T. flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 1/2 stick melted margarine
- · Ingredients for topping:
- 1/2 cup cornflake crumbs
- 6 tsp. brown sugar
- 4 T. softened margarine

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, grease 9 x 13 pan. Boil and purée carrots. Add remainder of ingredients into blender and blend until smooth. You can mix everything in original pot if desired. Pour into baking pan. In a separate bowl, mix ingredients for topping together. Mash with fork until crumbly. Then sprinkle on top. Bake approximately 1 hour until it is not jiggly and corners are lightly browned.

#### ROSH HASHANAH APPLE AND RAISIN KUGEL

- 1 lb. (16 ounces) egg noodles
- 6 eggs
- 1/4 c. of margarine
- · 1 c. applesauce (chunky or smooth)
- 1/2 c. white sugar
- 1/2 c. brown sugar
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- · 1 c. raisins
- cinnamon to sprinkle

Boil noodles a minute or two less than directions on bag. Combine all ingredients and pour into 9 X 13 baking dish. Sprinkle cinnamon on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

#### "We Are Such Stuff" by Allen Hochberg

For as long as I can remember, back to the 1950's at the Forest Hills Jewish Center with Rabbi Ben Zion Bokser (z'l), the Unetaneh Tokef of the High Holy Days has been lauded as the most touching and profound of Jewish writings. I have come to agree and have always questioned what is meant in the poem that we are *a dream that flies away*, a *v'chalum yauf*.

The expression comes just after we are told that we are nothing more than flesh and blood, from dust, and to dust we shall return. We gain the food we eat by the peril of our lives. We are fragile, like a broken piece of glass (potsherd). We wither and fade like the grass and flowers, no more than a fleeting shadow, a passing cloud, as the wind that blows, and as the floating dust. We are as ephemeral as a *dream that vanishes*.

That's it? How depressing! No wonder, when we hear "Yom Kippur," so many of us think only of the Fast Break. Mmmm! Bagels, cream cheese, scrambled eggs, lox, herring in cream sauce, coffee and cake. Who wants to think about being in synagogue all day? Hungry. Thirsty. Tired, and even bored, not to mention the crushing accountability? "For the sin we committed before Thee...." Who? Me?

Judaism is, by its nature, a happy religion. Yismechu. We spend the year in celebration of Life. We are not condemned in original sin, having to seek salvation with ongoing admissions of guilt. We are obligated daily, however, to do right, and be holy.

We are directed (Lev. 16:30) to take an inventory, and account for our actions, speech, and thoughts only once a year. Keep in mind, however, that review of an entire year's worth of behavior is concentrated in that one Day of Atonement. It is like not drinking coffee for a whole year, and then drinking all of it in one espresso cup in one day. We have ten days of Awe from Rosh Hashanah building up to the judgment and decree of Yom Kippur. What are we in Awe of?

We can turn ourselves around, repent, pray, and aver righteousness, but we first must take the deepest dive into ourselves for reflection and an accounting. This is not entertainment. It is Life and Death. The true Yom Kippur journey, to look at the places where we have transgressed, caused hurt, failed, and are broken, can be devastating. We pound our hearts.

The Unetaneh Tokef strips away our ego, arrogance, and self-righteousness. There are no distractions. No grooming in the mirror, which should be covered, as in

a house of mourning? There is no wondering about leftovers for lunch. You might say it is an existential state of no exit, no escape. As Leonard Cohen recites, "I see where you're hanging. I think I can see how you're pinned. When you're not feeling holy, your loneliness tells you, you've sinned."

There is a concept in Kabbalah called *bittul*. It is a state of emptiness (in Zen, *sunyata*), usually attained by meditation, in which you get out of your own way. You stop the internal narrative to yourself of how wonderful you think you are (or even how deficient you think you may be). You drop your rationalizations. You literally **empty your mind**.

Once you stop all that chatter about your pseudoreality, you have created an empty space for a peek at Reality with a capital "R". If you are adept at this, eventually you reach Satori, or Enlightenment, with the accompanying state of Peace (Nirvana/Shalom). The ironic caution is to be suspect of anyone who claims to be Enlightened. That is the first sign that there is no enlightenment, just more arrogance.

Bittul, in Judaism, is to be empty, not merely for the sake of emptiness, sunyata, but to make a space to Receive God. The word *kabbalah* means to receive. The quote, "Where will man find G-d? Wherever he lets Him in," is often attributed to both Abraham Joshua Heschel and Dov Ber.

What must "At One Ment" feel like, to make a space in your soul for G-d to visit, and be one with you (devekut)?

This is the offer of Yom Kippur, beyond the fasting and taking oneself to task: At One Ment with HaShem. We cannot get there if we are checking our watch, worrying about food, the stock-market, where we left our cell phone, or the look of our new holiday clothes.

People usually quote Shakespeare's Prospero in The Tempest as saying "We are the stuff that dreams are made of." The quote is actually "... made on." "... and our little life is rounded with a sleep."

What does it mean for us to be the stuff that dreams are made **on**? I have repeated this phrase to myself many times without understanding it. I now realize that it is human sentience, the conscious, the unconscious, and sometimes the collective unconscious, **upon** which dreams are made.

I see our lake in the fall. The lake has stored all the

heat of the summer, and in the fall, the air cools, causing the lake to release that heat and summer's history in wisps of steam and cloud. We are the lake (of sentience), and the wisps are the dream. When we are no more – run out of heat - the dream vanishes.

Our daily reality is created by the dream we channel through our sentience/consciousnesses. As Herzl said, "If you will it, it is no dream; and if you do not will it, a dream it is and a dream it will stay."

Return to the Holy Land was a dream turned into a reality by will. Today's Israel started out as no more than a dream, a wisp arising from a collective unconscious. No dream. No Israel. The rest of Herzl's quote is, "Dream and deed are not as different as many think. All the deeds of men are dreams at first, and become dreams in the end."

And then, the dream vanishes. Flies away. V'chalum yauf.

Van Morrison sings: Enlightenment says the world is nothing, Nothing but a dream. Everything is an illusion. Nothing is real. Good or bad, baby you can

change it anyway you want, you can rearrange it.
Enlightenment, don't know what it is. There is nothing but the Dream. The Dream comes from us. Is built on us. We are in charge of it and say how it goes.


Unetaneh Tokef does not tell us we are nothing – just dust in the wind. It tells us we are living sentience (in the image of G-d) upon which comes the Dream, and from the Dream, with will, comes this reality. It tells us WE are responsible for making things the way they are, and have only a short time in which to do it, because when our life is over, when our heat of summer is gone, our sentience is gone, and then there is no "stuff" for dreams to be made on. That is how important we are. Reality is made on dreams, and we are the stuff that dreams are made on. What an AWE-some responsibility that is.

When the gates close at Neilah, emerge cleansed, and pure enough to take on The Task.

May you be written in the book of Life.






