Vayelizel: Serving HaShem Differently

Alexandra and Levi Herman serve as the West Orange NCSY City Directors. NCSY is an international organization focused on Jewish education for high schoolers both in Public School and Yeshiva Day School. They are dedicated to connecting, inspiring and empowering Jewish teens through Torah and Tradition. Levi is originally from Los Angeles, and Alexandra from Twin Rivers/East Windsor, NJ. They moved to West Orange in 2017. They are excited to continue their work for years to come and get to know all our teens through NCSY's programming and incredible work.

Parshas Vayeitzei is the first of the last six Parshios in Sefer Bereishis, all of which are about the life of Yaakov. As we see here and throughout the rest of the Sefer, Yaakov was the first and only Patriarch who succeeded in raising all of his children according to the Torah, completely committed to Hashem and His mission of bringing Godliness into the world. It is for this reason that we as the Jewish people are also known as, "B'nei Yisrael," descendants of Israel, Yaakov's other name.

All 3 of the Avos served Hashem in different ways: Avraham was known as an "Ish Chessed", a man of kindness, he was a man a "kiruv," bringing people closer to Hashem and His divinity whether they were qualified and no matter how they dressed or acted, but he lacked that final push to bring them fully to the Torah. Yitzchak was known as a man of restraint and strength, "Gevurah," lifting those around him bringing them closer to Hashem, like Yaakov and Esav, but he didn't get to that mark of having everyone around him reach Hashem on their own. Yaakov encompassed both these traits, known as a man of "tiferet", harmony, he brought the Oneness of Hashem down to reach the lowest levels, as we see from his journey to Egypt and how he changed a country, and in his own home with his 12 sons and one daughter all being in the ways of Hashem, no matter the challenges. So too their beliefs in G-d and relationship with Him all came in different ways.

Avraham's belief stemmed from logic, he came to his own awareness through logic and convinced others that logically there is a G-d in the world. From Avraham, Yitzchak came to that same belief in Hashem, that the only logical explanation for this reality and the world created is a G-d. Yaakov, on the other hand, related to Hashem in a more calculated yet naïve way. Because of this belief, putting aside the logics and rationality, his commitment and love to Hashem was unconditional and due to his great and strong belief, he was able to inspire others to feel the same way. He was therefore able to raise all his children to serve and believe in Hashem, putting aside their differences, and bringing the high levels of divinity into the mundane world around them. Therefore, we are B'nei Yisroel, Yaakov/Yisrael is the last of the three patriarchs yet the most modeled one, it is his life, more than Avraham's or Yitzchak's, that we strive to fashion our own lives similar We see an incredible similarity and difference in Parshas Veyeitzei regarding the passing of the torch from father to son. We see this week Yaakov does as his father said, gets married, builds his family, while establishing great wealth as well. Yaakov pursued these in a different way than Yitzchak did, however. Whereas Hashem told Yitzchak not to leave Israel, he allows Yaakov to do as he wishes; whereas Yitzchak was told to marry one wife, Yaakov married two, and eventually their handmaids as well. Whereas Yitzchak avoided any detractors, Yaakov takes them head on. We notice here, Yaakov is a lot more like Avraham than Yitzchak. On this, we see how just like Avraham in all his journeys, Yaakov was not fazed by anyone and went out into the world on his own. He took the challenge in order to spread the message of Hashem as widely as possible.

We learn an incredibly strong message from the words in Parshas Vayeitzei, meaning, "He went out." In order for Yaakov to start his own chapter and spread out into the world, he had to leave and go out, leaving the spiritual and physical comforts of his home, and facing the challenges of the hostile and outside world, both physically and spiritually when it comes to praising G-d and raising His awareness and love. Only at that point was Yaakov able to mature and become the ultimate forefather, setting examples of how to live a life of physical and spiritual Godliness, and raising his family capable of setting the chosen people on to who they are and will be.

Every day is a challenge and one we are always to be facing head on. We must accept the challenge of maturity and contribute to the world, whether understanding Hashem through logic like Avraham and Yitzchak, or spreading the love of Hashem like Yaakov, regardless of any rationalities. We shall always look at every corner of life working ourselves to make this Hashem's true home, through our businesses, relationships, and all else. This is what we live for, this is our passion in NCSY, for Jews to understand what it means to be Jewish, to live a healthy and meaningful Jewish lifestyle, while incorporating fun and Jewish knowledge into everything we do. We should be able to continue to inspire each other and bring G-d into all our lives, serving and loving Hashem through Torah and Middos for many years to come. **Shabbat Shalom.**
