SMILE TIME: As Moshe and the children of Israel are crossing the Red Sea, the Children of Israel begin to complain to how thirsty they are after walking so far. Unfortunately, they were not able to drink from the

walls of water on either side of them, as they were made up of saltwater. A fish from that wall of water tells Moshe that he and his family heard the complaints of the people, but that they through their own gills could remove the salt from the water and force it out of their mouths like a fresh water fountain for the Israelites to drink. Moshe accepted this kind fish's offer. But before the fish and his family could begin to help, they had one demand. They and their descendants had to be always present at every Shabbat meal that would be established in the future to commemorate their part in the Exodus. When Moshe agrees to this, he gives them their command which became the name which remains how they are known to this very day, for he said to them, "Go Filter Fish!"

TORAH THOUGHT:

BECHUKOTAI: THE POWER OF COMMUNITY

Sophie Diamond is a fifth grader at Joseph Kushner Hebrew Academy. When she's not in class, she can be found in the afterschool Mishna Club or on the basketball court. Sarah Diamond, along with her husband Mike, has been a member of Congregation Ohr Torah for 14 years. When she's not directing the New Jersey Jewish Film Festival or planning adult programs at JCC MetroWest, she can be found taking care of her family, volunteering at JKHA or playing mah jongg. Parsha Bechukotai, is the end of Sefer Vayikra. Hashem promises B'nai Yisrael that if they keep His mitzvot, they will receive Hashem's Brachot. In the first half of this parsha, we read the 13 blessings that we will receive if we follow Hashem's commandments. It continues with 30 curses that will occur if we don't and ends with a final blessing of comfort. Hashem basically says that even though there will be destruction, I will still be with you in the darkness.

We were particularly interested in the pasuk (Vayikra 26:8) "and five of you will chase one hundred and one hundred of you will chase ten thousand." Rashi notes that the math doesn't add up. Proportionately, if five chase one hundred then one hundred should chase two thousand (twenty times as much). Rashi explains that you can't compare a few people keeping the Torah to a large group doing the same. Therefore, as the number of people gets larger, the ability of the group increases. This shows us the power of community. When a group unites for a cause its power is much greater than the sums of its parts. What we can accomplish as a group becomes magnified when we work

together.

We were nervous as we read all of the curses that will occur if we do not follow Hashem's commandments. It started to feel out of character as we believe that Hashem loves us unconditionally. We were relieved when we got to "even when they are in the land of their enemies, I will not cast them away; nor will I ever abhor them, to destroy them and to break My covenant with them; for I am the L-rd their G-d." (Vayikra 26:44) We knew it! He will not cast us away!

Why would this be the concluding chapter of a Sefer describing how to build and maintain a relationship with Hashem? Perhaps we can learn from this that when people are in relationship...with Hashem, or with our spouse, child, parent, friend, etc. we may make promises and vows with good intentions that we sometimes find difficult to fulfill. When that happens we are required to seriously consider how to fulfill our vow in an acceptable and equitable fashion. For the most sacred offering of all is our word. Shabbat Shalom. Sarah and Sophie Diamond.

Over the course of the next few months, we will have different people write a D'var Torah for the newsletter. The goal is to hear words of Torah from other Ohr Torah members and learn a little about who they are. I encourage everyone to participate.
