

3404 (429BCE) Haman casts lots, Esther goes before the King, Haman is hung.
3405 (428BCE) Jews turn the tables, Haman's sons are hung, Jews celebrate.
3406 (427BCE) The Megillat Esther is written and becomes part of the Tanach.

Vayikra : On My Birthday

Dr. Elliot Grossman is a Pediatric Neurologist at Children's Specialized Hospital, a division of RWJBarnabas Health Center. He lives in West Orange with his loving wife Suzanne, and both of them enjoy learning Torah. He has two sons, Gideon, and Jonah along with his daughter-in-law Charlotte, and two daughters Tali and Hannah, and a new grandson in little Herman Irving.

I am about to turn 65. (the government has a nice way of reminding you.) As all birthdays it is time of reflection and reassessment; how have I been as a husband, father and friend (and how was I as a son)?

When G-d dictated the Torah to Moshe and told him to write "Vayikra el Moshe," Moshe preferred to write "Vayikar el Moshe", "happened upon Moshe" as if by chance rather than being summoned by G-d (G-d was planning to use vayikar when addressing Bilam.) When G-d saw that Moshe left off the aleph, he commanded Moshe to add the aleph. Moshe obeyed but he wrote it with a smaller aleph consistent with his humility (Baal Ha Turim).

Our parasha continues with the various sin offerings by the Kohen, the whole community (members of the Sanhedrin), the ordinary individual and the leader. The Torah states that the "if" (eem) one sins pertains to three of the four above. But only for the leader does it say "when" (asher). Rabbi Jonathan Sacks in "Lessons in Leadership" attributes to Rabbi Ovadia Sforno and Rabbenu Bahiya that rulers tend to become arrogant and haughty and can lose their moral compass. Rabbi Sacks offers Lord Acton's aphorism "Power tends to corrupt and absolute power corrupts absolutely".

Moshe's humility stands in stark contrast to that of King Saul. As in our haftarah this Shabbat Zachor, Saul does not heed G-d's command, through Samuel, regarding Amalek, that is, to have no pity on Amalek and to destroy all that he has (man, woman, child and animal). Saul killed all the people except for Agag, the king, and the best of the animals. Samuel then tells him that G-d has rejected him as king. Saul never takes full responsibility for his actions; he does not admit unconditionally that he has sinned.

Regarding offerings, Samuel says " Does Hashem delight in burnt offerings...In obedience to the voice of Hashem... it is better to obey...than be attentive to the fat of rams."

Our parasha ends: "The Kohen shall provide him atonement before Hashem and it shall be forgiven him for any of all the things he may do to incur guilt."

Regarding " Vayikra el Moshe" why the "el"? But as the Torah does not use redundancy lightly, Rashi states that the "el" indicates that only Moshe heard G-d calling him, a voice only he heard.

Today we have no sacrifices to help us atone and we hear no voice from G-d but we have the mitzvot of t'fillah (prayer), tzadakah (charity) and t'shuvah (atonement) to help us correct our errant ways.

In Rabbi Avraham Trugman's "Orchard of Delight" he says Chassidut emphasizes that although Rashi teaches that only Moses heard the call, or in effect, G-d is constantly calling to each and every Jew to draw near to Him... and that the Zohar teaches that there is a small spark of Moshe within every Jew.

In studying our sources to prepare for this dvar Torah, I recognize more so the profound significance of humility and the ease of susceptibility to the dangers of arrogance.

I am reminded of a mother of one of my patients many years ago presenting me with a framed quote saying "No one cares how much you know until they know how much you care."

... the small aleph

...the small silent voice

In having the privilege of preparing these few words, I have been given a wonderful birthday present.


