#### **TORAH THOUGHT:**



#### ARCHAREI MOT: A TIME FOR SILENCE AND A TIME FOR SPEECH

To a great extent, reaction to defeat and tragedy is the true defining moment of

one's inner strength and faith. Aharon's silence in the face of the loss of his two older sons is reckoned in Jewish tradition as an act of nobility and sublime acceptance of the unfathomable judgment of Heaven.

Contrast Aharon's silence and humble acceptance of fate with the response of Iyov to his troubles and tragedies. Iyov has a great deal to say, to complain against, to bitterly question and to debate almost endlessly with his companions and visitors as to the unfairness of what has befallen him.

To the human eye, we are all aware that life and its events are often unfair. There is no one that I am aware of that has successfully "explained" the Holocaust. So it seems that we are faced with two diametrically opposed choices as to the proper response to mindless fate and tragedy. Are we to remain mute and silent or are we to rail against the arrogant fate that has brought misfortune to us?

The Torah does not seem to inform us about this and in fact, as shown above, apparently even contradicts itself regarding this continually recurring facet of human existence. Yet the Torah and all of the books that it contains is one seamless whole, and the seeming contradictions lie within us and not within its holy words and exalted ideas. Thus we are brought

to study this matter with greater introspection and with less judgment and personal bias.

I think that the Torah means to teach us that there is no one correct, one-size-fits-all response to the failures and tragedies of life. Aharon is correct in his response to inexplicable tragedy and so is Iyov. King Solomon correctly noted that there is a time for silence and a time for speech. So too there are people for whom mute silence is the proper response to tragedy and there are people who must give expression to their feelings of grief and frustration by words, debate and even complaint.

In most instances the rabbis of the Talmud voted for silence over speech and acceptance of one's fate over complaint and public debate. Yet the rabbis did not exclude the book of Iyov from the biblical canon of holy books. In that act of inclusion they allowed for varying degrees of response to troubles and travail.

Iyov also has a place in the pantheon of heroic human views regarding tragic events. Within limits and with a faith-based attitude one can question and complain, express wonderment and even somehow demand answers. But, deep down, all humans understand that they cannot fathom Heaven's wisdom, decisions and the individual fate that is visited upon us all. So the death of Aharon's sons serves as a template for life, a lesson for all of us. Rabbi Berel Wein

I wanted to get to the beach in Herzliya Pituach to watch the sunset over the Mediterranean. Maybe if I left about three hours earlier, I would have made it - it's only ten miles between the towns. While I'm sitting there waiting for the cars to move, a man came up to my car window. I rolled down the window - it was a Lubavitcher asking if I put on tefillin today.

#### AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM OHR TORAH PRESIDENT DAVID GOLDSTEIN

"There is a Chinese curse which says 'May he live in interesting times.' Like it or not, we live in interesting times." - John F. Kennedy

"I do not know why G-d spared my life in my Poway synagogue. All I can do is make this borrowed time matter." - Rabbi Yisroel Goldstein

There is much debate over the origin of the Chinese curse President Kennedy mentioned. But for Jews in the United States today his statement is true. We are indeed living in interesting times.

Six months to the day after our world was shaken by the events in Squirrel Hill, Pennsylvania, we were again confronted by an attack at a shul. This time it was at Chabad of Poway, California. An equipment malfunction kept the number of victims to a minimum but it easily could have been much worse.

These events, as well as recent events at houses of worship for other religions around the world from Sri Lanka to New Zealand, underscore the importance of being vigilant while at shul. The armed guard at the front door on Shabbos morning helps keep us secure but there is still a need to be aware of one's surroundings and look out for ourselves, our children, our parents and each other.

The safety of everyone who comes to Ohr Torah is paramount. The Executive Committee is discussing ideas to fill in our security holes as well as augmenting existing security protocols that are already in place. But the success of everything we do depends on the vigilance of all of us.

How can you help? As our security procedures continue to evolve, I will publicize any opportunities that may arise for people to get involved. For now, we can still use more volunteers to help with security on Shabbos and Yom Tov mornings. As mentioned previously, you do not need to be big and strong for this job. The security guard will do all the heavy lifting if a situation occurs that requires action. There is minimal training that will teach you certain things to look for and when to alert the security guard. Please reach out to Mike Diamond to get yourself on the volunteer list.

I will conclude with some inspiration from Rabbi Yisroel Goldstein, the Rabbi of Chabad of Poway. Rabbi Goldstein wrote in an Opinion column in the Tuesday edition of The New York Times entitled "I Was Attacked Because I Am a Jew" about pride and defiance. Just one day after being released from the hospital for injuries sustained in the attack, Rabbi Goldstein said "From here on in I am going to be more brazen. I am going to be even more proud about walking down the street wearing my tzitzit and kippah, acknowledging God's presence. And I'm going to use my voice until I am hoarse to urge my fellow Jews to do Jewish." If Rabbi Goldstein was able to write these words just one day after being shot then we should certainly heed his call and make every day matter.
