TORAH THOUGHT:

BEHAR: PROCLAIM FREEDOM



David Gleaner is a Dentist in Bayonne, and has lived in West Orange for almost twenty-five years with his wife Leslie and their three children, who mostly come home now only to do their laundry and give us naches with our granddaughter. He is a proud member of Ohr Torah, B'nai Shalom, and an active participant of almost every other minyan in West Orange that will tolerate him.

This week's Torah portion, Behar, contains 24 mitzvot, and on the surface, it

could be said almost all of them have no direct correlation to our life in the 21st century. It is not surprising that over 40 years ago this young bar mitzvah boy who was lucky enough to get one of the shortest parshiot in the Torah chose the laws of shmita in his d'var torah, as well as the yovel, the Jubilee year. The latter was only deemed to be followed if the majority of the Jews lived in Eretz Yisrael. This has actually been discussed recently by halachic authorities as to whether the yovel, the 50th year after seven shemita years should be followed, now that Israel is where the majority of the Jews live.

The laws of shmita are agricultural laws, which actually help the environment by replenishing nutrients and lead to more successful crop production. The difficulty of strictly practicing the shmita year has led to many halachic "work arounds" which allow, for the most part, agriculture to continue in the land of Israel without major economic or commercial problems. We can read all about these factors and their halachic solutions during the next shmita year in 2021. My dvar Torah, however, was written in the seventies, a time when "Earth Day", talk of ecology and saving the planet was the rage. There was an obvious connection to tie in the concepts of respecting the environment with the shemita year. However, as I re-read the parsha, I recognize a much deeper connection to all the mitzvot in Behar. Besides the laws of shemita and the yovel, laws of fair trade practices, rules against charging interest, treating slaves fairly, and prohibitions of idol worship are also included. In the first aliya, we read the famous words:

וּקְרָאתֶם דְּרוֹר בָּאָרֶץ לְכָל-יֹשְׁבֶיהָ

"You shall proclaim freedom throughout the land for all its inhabitants" which gives us the clue of what connects all of the mitzvot found in Behar. Much discussion in Washington and throughout the world today concerns the vast inequality of income between the top 5% of income earners and the rest of the population. Communism or even the early concepts of Israel's kibbutzim

were meant to avoid such discrepancies, and allow all wealth to be distributed equally. Most would say that that is not a tenable model for our capitalist society today. There is much debate about a "livable wage", which would supplement a family's income to allow them to provide the basic needs for their family. Behar approaches the problem from a different angle. Recognizing from the start that we are only "tenants" in this world, with Hashem ultimately the owner of all we have, we are to return it to Him every seven years. For us to "own" other humans is also contrary to laws found in the parsha, and slaves must be freed in the Jubilee year.

Many of us can admit that money concerns add much stress to our lives, and we only have to look at the continued efforts to keep Jewish education options affordable for our children to see that it is affecting our day to day life. What better way to be truly "free" if we had no debts or financial obligations. Is this really practical in today's world? It is clear that Torah values hard work as we are told to "work for six days, and then rest on the seventh." In Pirke Avot it states, "It is good to combine Torah study with a worldly occupation," and Maimonides wrote in his Mishneh Torah, "Anyone who makes up his mind to study Torah, and not work, but lives on charity, profanes the name of God." This leaves us with a tricky balance in our lives. We should work, try to support our families, pay our debts, but do not become enslaved in doing so. God reminds us in Behar that it is all His, whatever we amass. Freedom should be for all the inhabitants, including those less fortunate, to have the opportunities to provide a living wage. We cannot allow people to lose dignity due to their lot in life. Those of us who feel blessed have the responsibility to give tzedakah, not charity, but the "just" thing to do, to help "free" all the inhabitants throughout the land from economic hardship. And for us, on the seventh day, we are reminded that it is not ours anyway, and by the seventh year, we will be returning it to the One that so generously provides us with all the riches that we have received. 
