

TORAH THOUGHT:

Chayel Sarah: Well, what do you know?

Jeff Raskin has lived in West Orange for over 50 years and is one of the current VPs at OT. He has been practicing Gastroenterology in North Bergen, NJ for the last 27 years. He is married to Chagit and they have 4 children, Perry, Ariel, Yonatan and Keren. Keren is the co- author of today's Dvar Torah. She graduated lower and middle school at Kushner and is currently a senior at Maayanot. She is a starter on the reigning champion Maayanot's volleyball team and student body president of Maayanot.

Well, well, well. Here we are again. Another year has passed, and we find ourselves at Parshat Chayei Sarah where we see the devoted servant Eliezer searching for a wife for Yitzchak at a well. But, why a well? What is the significance of a "well?"

Firstly, let's point out the importance of "water." The Talmud Bava Kama on 17a states ואין מים אלא תורה
There is no water except Torah. This statement equates Torah with water. How may this be? Torah and water share some unique basic characteristics: for example, they both promote growth, quench thirst, and make the arid land flourish. Therefore, it's no surprise that many key encounters in the Torah revolve around water.

There are 3 famous people in the Torah that found their wives at a well: Yitzchak, Yaakov, and Moshe. In this week's Parsha, it's Yitzchak's mate that is found at a well. We mentioned that water is so important that it's equated to Torah, but is there something else special about wells that makes them the proper site for our fore-parents to find their soulmates?

Maybe the answer is simple: it's a practical answer. It was the young single girls of the household who had the task of trekking down to the well to gather water for the house. So, it makes sense that if one wanted to find a young unmarried girl, a well would be the perfect spot.

Or maybe the answer is a bit more complex. In those days, the well was the center of all village life. It was the source to sustain life and was the hub for human

activity. At this vantage point, people's actions and character could be readily observed and shared with others. Yaakov showed the strength of his love for Rachel by moving the huge rock from the well. Moshe demonstrated his character by protecting Yitro's daughters at the well. And in our Parsha, Eliezer is able to observe Rivka's kindness and eagerness to serve at the well.

To go one step further, a well as a "location" is not the only connection. A well is also found to be used as a metaphor for a woman אשה. We see this on Mishlei 5:15-18 where women are referred to as, "Drink water from your cistern, and flowing waters from your own well. May your fountain be blessed and rejoice with the wife of your youth." And Shir Hashirim 4:12 and 4:15, "An enclosed garden is my bride, a spring shut up, a fountain sealed." Also, the well that served the Jews in the desert when they left Egypt, was called "The Well of Miriam."

So, what really happened is that our patriarchs went to the well (באר) to find their precious well (אשה). There is no "WATER" without Torah. There is no Jewish woman - אשת חיל - without Torah. It is the Jewish mother who inculcates the children in the home with Torah and Torah values and is a living example of these values.

This is the lesson that our family learns from Parshat Chaye Sarah, and what we concentrate on when our women close their eyes on Erev Shabbat lighting the candles and saying the Shabbat prayers. **Shabbat Shalom.**

A regular feature of the newsletter is to have different people write a D'var Torah for the newsletter. The goal is to hear words of Torah from other Ohr Torah members and learn a little about who they are. I encourage everyone to participate. 


