TORAH THOUGHT:

Yitro: A lesson in Humility

The Kurz family have been members of Ohr Torah since moving to the West Orange community where 2 of their 4 children were born. Lisa is a pediatrician and is currently working in drug safety. The Kurz Family

The Parshah begins this week recounting to us how Yitro, Moshe's father-in-law, heard about the wondrous miracles that Hashem performed for Moshe and for Bnei Yisrael ("leMoshe uleYisrael,") in taking them out of Mitzrayim. Indicating that the initial reports that Yitro heard were not just about Yisrael, but primarily about the great successes and triumphs of their leader Moshe. However, when Moshe himself relates to Yitro what actually happened, Moshe omits his own name entirely. Everything that had transpired, everything was done by Hashem and Hashem alone, and everything that Hashem had done to Pharaoh and to Mitzrayim was for the sake of Yisrael ("al odot Yisrael").

Moshe was the leader of an entire nation that had done the impossible. What no single slave was able to do - escape from Egypt - Moshe had managed to do - defeat Pharaoh and lead an entire nation out of Egypt. Moshe could have easily developed a conqueror mentality and a sense of arrogance. But as we know, not only was Moshe not arrogant, he was a leader who was able to maintain a profound sense of humility and selflessness throughout his life ("vehaish Moshe anav mikol adam").

Rabbi Lamm suggested that perhaps Yitro's blessing in reaction to Moshe's account can be explained in this manner as well. Yitro pronounced, "Blessed is the Lord who has saved you from the hand of Egypt and from the hand of Pharaoh". There is the physical salvation from Mitzrayim, a harsh nation, and then there is the more subtle but arguably even greater salvation from leaders like Pharaoh, a harsh ruler. Hashem saved Bnei Yisrael "from the tragedy and misfortune of being led by people who are obsessed with their own importance, who become intoxicated with their own egos and their own power, and who rapidly degenerate in character and personality to the point where they become inconsiderate, ungrateful, and insensitive megalomaniacs. The Jews were saved not only from the Egyptians – they were also spared the excruciating burden of a Pharaoh-type leader".

In our turbulent times, where politics and leadership has run amok the selflessness and altruism of Moshe Rabbeinu is something we can all aspire to on our own level. Thankfully, we have unique individuals in our community who exhibit this trait and from whom we can learn a great deal. Even if it does not come naturally. Even if we are engrossed in our own lives and our familial obligations, we can gain tremendous inspiration from those that do so much for our community with no expectation of accolades or recognition. True gemilut hasadim, is the act of losing yourself in an act of helpfulness for someone else. As Rabbi Lamm puts it, "the greatness of man consists in transcending his own petty involvements with his self. This is true greatness – for it is a paradox, yet true: the more you think of yourself, the less there is to think of."








SMILE TIME: Alfie comes home from an exhausting day at work, plops down on the couch in front of the television, and yells to his wife,
