
PASSOVER SEDER

Attendees will also enjoy a



CNT's menu will include gefilte fish, chopped liver, matzah ball soup, brisket of beef with tomato barbecue sauce, fried chicken with matzah crust, roast chicken, tricolor cole slaw, baked mashed potatoes, glazed carrots, seasonal green vegetables, baby green salad with vinaigrette dressing, and delicious desserts and wine.

"This year we remember the Exodus story and how we were freed from slavery out of Egypt," Congregation Ner Tamid's Cantor Hutchings said. "And we celebrate each year. We remember year after year with this beautiful Seder where we gather together to commemorate that time in our people's history. This year with a special twist, we're bringing in superstar country star, Joe Buchanan. He is a friend of Congregation Ner Tamid, and he's also a very talented country musician. It will be a very special Passover Seder, and we're excited to share it with our community. We welcome anyone who is looking for a Passover seder."

PRESIDENTIAL PERSPECTIVES



In part, our lives operate in accordance with and are impacted by various calendars and cycles: the yearly calendar beginning on January 1st; the school calendar for many of our Congregants; the four seasons, though other than summer, not so much in Las Vegas; the Jewish calendar which seems to be a mystery to all of us given its lack of coordination with our other calendars; though not of much importance in our daily lives, various fiscal calendars. As for CNT, we operate on a combination of all of them. The Jewish calendar controls the timing of our religious services and related activities, the school calendar impacts our Religious and Hebrew School and our Preschool, our financial activities are tied to a July 1st to June 30th fiscal calendar, and

our desert heat and winds impact much of our activities.

So, as I write this bulletin article while anticipating the cessation of much of our activities over the coming weeks, we have much to accomplish. We will plan for the next year's Religious School and Preschool as well as our religious services and other programming. Our affiliate organizations will do the same, and we need to continue to refurbish and improve our facilities.

Related to all of this is the development and adoption by the Board of a budget for the coming fiscal year. While we have performed consistent with this year's budget, given the uncertainty of our domestic and local economy and the growth of our Congregation, as usual, we will be challenged in equating our needs and aspirations with our resources. While the budget process seeks to balance expected expenses with projected revenues for the coming fiscal year, the Board will also consider our needs and aspirations for years to come. Last calendar year we added 44 families bringing our membership to more than 545 families. Since the beginning of this calendar year, our growth has continued at a record pace. As such, given all of this, both sides of the budget will increase.

In June we will be conducting our Annual Meeting. In addition to electing Congregants to open Board positions, we will report and discuss the past year as well as what we wish to accomplish in the future. Congregant feedback and participation are essential. Last year we were able to restart our in-person Annual Meeting, and attendance was better than we expected. I hope that this year many more of you will attend and participate.

Former U.S. Congresswoman Shelley Berkley and Dr. Larry Lehrner To Be Honored By Congregation Ner Tamid

Former U.S. Congresswoman Shelley Berkley and Dr. Larry Lehrner will be the recipients of Congregation Ner Tamid's Michael A. Cherry Tikkun Olam Community Service Award. This special honor is given to those dedicated to "Tikkun Olam," which reflects the highest ideal of the Jewish people, namely to "repair the world," and demonstrates the same commitment to social justice as the award's namesake, former Nevada Supreme Court Justice Michael A. Cherry.

The Italian-themed awards brunch will take place on **Sunday, April 23,** at Bella Vita, 4965 Blue Diamond Rd., from 11:00 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.

"I am so excited to celebrate and honor Shelley Berkley and Dr. Larry Lehrner for this year's Tikkun Olam Service Award," Congregation Ner Tamid's Cantor Jessica Hutchings said. As we walked through the Jewish tenements of the Lower East Side during our Teen Tribe Trip in New York City last month, I watched the eyes of 12 teens glaze over, wondering what their lives would have looked like in pre-World War(s) America... They wondered what it would be like to be immigrants, to learn a new language, have limited resources, and most importantly, be without iPhones, WiFi, or TikTok. They asked, "But where did they sleep?" "Where is the rest of the apartment?" "Where is the bathroom?" "Why is the baby's crib next to the oven?" It seemed both fascinating and also unfathomable for people... their ancestors... to have lived in such a manner. For the first time in their young lives, they saw how life could have been if they

would have been born in another time and place.

With only a walk down the narrow rickety stairs and back out onto the New York City streets, they transformed back into teens living in 2023, and their everyday comforts received a little more gratitude. The purpose of our journey was not only to equip the teens with a glimpse into history but also to give them a tangible reason to continue holding tight to traditions that have connected our people for thousands of years. As they watch their Bubbe make a secret recipe for matzo ball soup, maybe they will be inclined to jump in and learn how to make it themselves. When they gather around the Pesach table, the words of slavery to liberation will resonate more keenly and encourage them to continue retelling the story for generations to come.

As our students learned on their journey in March, when Jewish people arrived in this country they were in search of a diasporic homeland and they quickly made an effort to assimilate. For many, assimilation meant leaving Judaism at the door. The repercussions of blending in led to each generation becoming less Jewishly connected than the last. Thankfully, Judaism did not wash away along the way, and the importance of tradition, uniqueness, and oneness survived all of these years. Imagine if our ancestors assimilated so fully that this generation did not even know they were Jewish! Where would we be today? Would Judaism be lost forever? Joyously, it is not lost! The more experiences like this that we can give our students, the more we promise richly engaged generations to come.

At the end of March, we gave you Rainbow Shabbat to remind you that ALL PEOPLE are welcome at CNT, no matter who they are or how they love. On **Wednesday, April 5**, we bring you a first-night Passover seder with a tableside country music concert (with a special Shabbat on **Friday, April 7**). Later this month, on **Sunday, April 23**, we honor the righteous among us, Shelley Berkley and Dr. Larry Lehrner, at our Tikkun Olam luncheon. Then, on **Friday, April 28**, we welcome Disney's first Jewish band, Mostly Kosher, for our annual Pop-Up Shabbat in Downtown Las Vegas. We do not bring our Congregation programs like this just because they are fun (I mean, they are SO

FUN!), but we also bring experiences to you because we know that engaging you means Judaism lives on with us and has the potential to live on for the generations who come after us... Therefore, we concur with our ancestors of tenement times that living secular lives assimilated in our wonderful community is a benefit of being alive in the beautiful melting pot that is America. However, if it were possible to go back in time and send them just one message, I think we would share how we have found the best of both worlds. We have found a way to also thrive by being outwardly and proudly Jewish.

Pop-Up Shabbat To Feature Mostly Kosher, Disney's First Jewish Band



And so it is a privilege and an honor to be able to take them on a journey to see with their own eyes the immigration process to this country at Ellis

Island and at the Tenement Museum to see how people lived and where they lived, and see the triumphs and tragedies of how this country became one that was accepting and welcoming and rich in Jewish culture."



The CNT's Confirmation class visited Judaica World in Crown Heights on Kingston Avenue in Brooklyn, NY, on Thursday, March 16.




RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Orna Shuman, producer of And You Chose Life will speak about her father Shraga and the film.








CNT's MENSch Club Bakes Hamantaschen, Grills, Does Windows!



Have you looked at the CNT website lately? Our mission statement is on there, as are our goals. Of the four goals, the last one says, "To promote a positive relationship with members of other religious traditions." The NCG team at CNT is doing exactly that. At this point in time, there are 37 institutions involved in NCG.

The churches encompass many denominations including the Catholic community, Episcopal, Lutheran, Methodist, and others. The nonprofit organizations include Nevada HAND, Las Vegas Catholic Worker, and the Downtown Neighborhood Coalition to name a few. 
