

Sara Gordon To Receive Michael A. Cherry Tikkun Olam Community Service Award At Annual CNT Fundraiser

Congregation Ner Tamid will honor Sara Gordon, Interim Dean and William S. Boyd Professor of Law at UNLV's William S. Boyd School of Law, with this year's Michael A. Cherry Tikkun Olam Community Service Award, at a Champagne Brunch celebration on Sunday, May 22, 2022, at Bottiglia, in Green Valley Ranch, from 11:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

This special honor is given at CNT's annual fundraising gala to those dedicated to "Tikkun Olam," which reflects the highest ideal of the Jewish people, namely to "repair the world," and demonstrates the same commitment to social justice as the award's namesake, former Nevada Supreme Court Justice Michael A. Cherry.

This award is given by Congregation Ner Tamid to recognize distinguished citizens who have made a difference in the Southern Nevada community and who pursue a vision of justice for all.

"CNT is honored to recognize Sara Gordon for her leadership and vision she has brought to the legal community, specifically to UNLV's William S. Boyd School of Law," Tikkun Olam Committee Co-Chair Julie Marcus said. "CNT holds the prestigious Tikkun Olam award in the highest regard. The commitment to 'repairing the world' is something to be celebrated."

Gordon has been on the front lines of drug and mental health law reform and has written several Law Review articles about those topics. She teaches courses in criminal law, mental health law, and evidence and is a member of Boyd's Health Law Program. Before joining the faculty at Boyd in 2006, Gordon practiced commercial litigation and employment law at Hale Lane, now Holland and Hart, in Las Vegas. Gordon was born and raised in Las Vegas, and starting at age five, attended Sunday School, Hebrew school, was a member of Ner Tamid Temple Youth (NTTY) and celebrated her Bat Mitzvah at Congregation Ner Tamid.

Previous Michael A. Cherry Tikkun Olam Community Service Award recipients include former Nevada Supreme Court Justice Michael A. Cherry, U.S. Senator for Nevada Jacky Rosen, and former Mayor of Las Vegas Jan Jones Blackhurst.

This year's Tikkun Olam Committee Co-Chairs include Julie Marcus, U.S. Senator Jacky Rosen, former U.S. Congresswoman Shelley Berkley, Nevada Supreme Court Justice Elissa F. Cadish, The Honorable Joanna S. Kishner, Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County, Nevada, Lexy and Sam Lionel, and Colleen Freedman.

Rabbi Akselrad Thanks CNT For Ukrainian Refugee Fundraising Efforts

In a special *Shabbat* in the Round, on Friday, April 22, 2022, Rabbi Akselrad talked about his recent pre-Pesach rabbinic mission to Poland and the Ukrainian Border in support of the Jewish Community Center of Krakow's refugee relief efforts. Rabbi Akselrad joined a group of 27 rabbis in Krakow, Poland, from April 10-14, to bring supplies and funds and to bear witness.

"We raised nearly \$800,000 to support the Ukrainian refugees," Rabbi Akselrad said during his Friday sermon. "Our Congregation alone raised nearly \$75,000! I was hoping we would raise \$10,000. Boy, was I happily wrong. The outpouring of support was just incredible. Thank you. Thank you, everyone. But it was more than simply 'incredible.' It was a reflection of the desire of everyone, everyone to do 'something' to make a difference... We did not stop a war. We did not save every life. But for the people we touched, it has made all the difference in the world."

Yom HaShoah Observance, Holocaust Memorial Park Dedication

The newly-constructed Holocaust Memorial Plaza at King David Memorial Chapel & Cemetery, 2697 E. Eldorado Ln., was dedicated at The Board of Rabbis of Southern Nevada's Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, commemoration on Sunday, April 24, 2022. It will serve as a monument of perseverance and a timely history lesson.

"We study the Holocaust to learn not only about what happened to our people but to learn lessons," Rabbi Akselrad, Yom HaShoah Chair, said. "Through these lessons, we hope to prevent genocide from happening to any people."

U.S. Senator for Nevada, and CNT Member, Jacky Rosen was a featured speaker at the Holocaust Memorial Plaza dedication, and she said Yom HaShoah is "a time to turn pain into reflection and reflection into purpose and that purpose and that pain into promise and hope."

"Most of us do not know where our murdered loved ones' remains are," Esther Toporek Finder, president of the Holocaust Survivors Group of Southern Nevada and Generations of the Shoah – Nevada (GS-N), said. "This Memorial can serve as a symbolic resting place."

"This Holocaust Memorial Plaza will allow rabbis and educators and community members alike to be able to learn more about the Holocaust," Jay Poster, general manager of King David Memorial Chapel and Cemetery, said.

When Rabbi Akselrad was in Poland in April, he was able to collect six bags of soil from outside all six extermination camps (Chełmno, Belzec, Sobibor, Treblinka, Majdanek, and Auschwitz-Birkenau). He brought the bags of soil back with him to Las Vegas, and during the Holocaust Memorial Plaza dedication, several local Holocaust survivors installed the soil in the Plaza to be permanently preserved.

Both Rabbi Akselrad and Cantor Hutchings collaborated on the observance service, and Cantor Hutchings arranged the music and designed the ceremony's program using her photos of Holocaust memorials from around the world. CNT Junior Cantors also participated.

PRESIDENTIAL PERSPECTIVES



When Yvonne and I returned to Las Vegas after I graduated from law school, we joined Beth Sholom at which my family were members and where Yvonne and I were married. But when our daughter, Sara, was 4-years-old we joined Congregation Ner Tamid because it was where we wanted to educate our children as Jews. This is a decision that parents make. Where do we want our children to be exposed to institutional Judaism?

As part of their growing up, Sara (as did her brother, Jeffrey) attended Religious School, celebrated B'nai Mitzvah and Confirmation

at CNT, and participated in youth activities and organizations at CNT. To state the obvious, we are proud of Sara and Jeff in their transition from childhood to adulthood and CNT's role in this.

As for Sara, she is being honored on Sunday, May 22, with the Michael A. Cherry Tikkun Olam Community Service Award for all she has accomplished as a Professor of Law, Associate Dean of Academics, and now Interim Dean at the UNLV Boyd School of Law. Previous recipients have included CNT past presidents, Justice Mike Cherry and Senator Jacky Rosen, and former Mayor of Las Vegas Jan Jones Blackhurst. Sara's selection to join this group of past recipients is an honor and an accomplishment. I hope that many of you will join Yvonne and me at the event.

In looking back on Sara and Jeff transitioning from childhood to adulthood, Yvonne and I know their experience at CNT had an impact, even though we cannot quantify it. But, we also know that our children's experience is not unique. CNT has been a part of Jewish life in this Valley since 1974, so we have all witnessed the impact that CNT has had and continues to have on our children.

As parents, we assume responsibility to make decisions that will impact the future of our children. The decision Yvonne and I made to raise Sara and Jeff at CNT was a good one.

As I sit down to write this latest message, it has been one week since my return from Poland. Twenty-seven rabbis gathered in Krakow and together we raised nearly \$800,000 and brought more than two tons of supplies! I am so appreciative of everyone who donated to this cause. Visiting the JCC Krakow and the refugee hubs firsthand, I can tell you how badly these funds are needed. This is the greatest refugee crisis in Europe since World War II.



While it was difficult seeing so many refugees, knowing how much they lost, it was nonetheless heartwarming to see the hope that was given

to them by the welcome of the Polish people and thousands of volunteers from around the world. Our Congregation can stand tall knowing that we made a difference in the lives of people, who, "there but for the grace of God, go I." Indeed, many of us have ancestors who immigrated to America from the Pale of Settlement. My paternal grandfather for example was from Poland. My maternal grandmother was from Romania.

Often times when there is a tragedy people ask, "Where is God?" I would like to think that when there is a catastrophe such as an earthquake, a hurricane, or war, we find God in the people who are running towards the disaster; the people who do whatever they can to help those whose lives have been turned upside down. Each of us can be "that angel" who does his or her part to make a difference.

To be that angel, however, we have to move beyond our doubt and indifference. We have to believe that what we do matters. While we cannot change the world, we can change a part of the world. Even if we touch one life, that mitzvah will ripple through time in ways we can only imagine.

In the press, there was a moving story of Sharon Bass whose Jewish grandmother was sheltered and saved by a non-Jewish family. By a twist of fate, Sharon was able to return the favor and be "that angel" by bringing Ukrainian refugees Lesia Orshoko and Alona Chugai to safety in Israel. It was their grandmother, Maria Blyschchik, who 80 years ago saved Sharon's grandmother Fania Rosenfeld Bass. Fate and luck both need a bit of help from people who refuse to turn away when injustice darkens our world.

One thing about "angels," they don't stay in place. Goodness can always find a home.

When the world shifted, CNT did too. We were left without a Religious School Director, and our Board of Directors asked if I would step into the role in the interim. While I was hesitant to take on a heavier load, I was super excited at the potential. Even though the school had to be completely virtual and the student body had shrunk, we had a wonderful year... But I knew my work was not done. I wanted to rebuild our school, strengthen it, and measure the success and potential of our school. If you were to ask a CNT Religious School Student if they had fun at CNT... I am confident they would say, "I LOVE CNT."

Fun aside, it is not realistic for me to continue to run the school and function in my role as a Cantor. Over these past two years, I have been privileged to work with an incredible right-hand woman, Hayley Wizig. Week after week, even though running the Religious School was a second job for both of us, we managed to double the size of our student body, triple the size of our eighth - 12th grade classes, give our teachers well deserved raises, enact special interest chugim (activities), move all of our registration to an online platform, and open the doors of our school safely in the midst of a pandemic. Hayley was instrumental in making it all happen. She is a go-getter, creative mind, and knows her way around the Google platform.

For all of these reasons and so many more, beginning in August 2022, it is my pleasure and honor to pass the yad to Hayley as our new Director of the CNT Religious School!

Feel free to reach out to Hayley anytime at **hayley@cntschool.org.** Not to worry, I'll still be very present in the Religious School, and I'll ALWAYS be there for any of your spiritual and community needs. Hayley comes to us from Kansas City, KS, where she was recruited as a Clark

County School District teacher at a job fair. She picked up and moved across the country to Henderson, NV, and became our youngest adult congregant. Immediately, she got involved in our community and volunteered anytime she was asked. She began working at the CNT Religious School as a teacher a few years ago. Over the last five summers, Hayley has helped run Herzl Camp in Wisconsin as the Assistant Director of Cabin Life. She oversaw the programming curriculum for campers and worked with the staff to create a positive Jewish environment. Hayley cannot wait to impact many future generations of Jewish learning by joining the CNT team full-time in the fall!

Sam Coffee – Saturday, May 14, 2022



How Was This Seder Different From All Other Seders?




Summer Borscht

This traditionally sweet and sour beet soup, served cold, was popular in Lithuania and is now considered a Jewish summer staple.

Ingredients – 1 cup sour cream to pass around, 6 peeled boiled potatoes
(optional), Juice of 1 lemon,
2 Tablespoons sugar or to taste,
2 lbs. raw beets, a little salt and pepper

Directions – 1. Peel the beets and dice them. If they are young, that is easy to do. If they are old and too hard to dice, simply cut them in half and, when they have softened with boiling, lift them out, cut them up, and put them back in the pan. 2. Put the beets in a pan with 9 cups of water and salt and pepper and simmer for 1-1/2 hours. 3. Let the soup cool, then chill, covered, in the refrigerator.

4. Add the lemon and sugar to taste before serving (these could be added when the soup is hot, but it is more difficult to determine the intensity of the flavoring). 5. Remove some of the beet pieces with a slotted spoon if it seems like there are too many of them and keep them for a salad. 6. Serve, if you like, with a boiled potato, putting one in each plate. 7. Pass around the sour cream for all to help themselves.

Nevadans for the Common Good represents a force of thousands of Nevadans in the Las Vegas Valley and outlying areas who work on the most pressing social and economic issues facing our community to connect and bring diverse people and organizations together – both Jewish and others – in nonpartisan ways, to help strengthen families and communities.
