

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

As the Bulletin is put together several weeks before its publication date, I am writing this article in the midst of my health challenge which caused me to miss High Holydays this year. It was the first time I have missed the Holydays since I began attending as a little boy. Being on the sidelines this year was difficult on many levels. I did not want to disappoint my community being one. Facing my ego – not being on the bimah during the most significant time of the Jewish year. Thirdly, I am not used to being the focus of concern, but rather prefer to be in the position of "pastor" ministering to my Congregation and providing comfort to all of you during your times of need. These reasons though pale in consideration to facing the fact that I, like all of us, are mortal and must deal with the challenges of the



body. I have been spared any surgeries or major scares for my entire life. In talking with folks this is rather rare, but not uncommon.

It goes without saying, how appreciative I am of Cantor Hutchings who rose to the occasion and led beautiful Services. There are a lot of moving parts and she did a fantastic job in making sure that the needs of our community were met and that Services were especially meaningful. I am grateful too for our staff, our Temple Board, and all of the many volunteers who stepped up to make sure that Cantor received all the support she needed. The power of community is "being a community." Stepping up and supporting one another. The outpouring of personal support was amazing and touched me deeply.

A word of Torah... soon it will be Simchat Torah. One of the primary meanings of Simchat Torah is not just the celebration of the Torah itself, but in understanding that life is cyclical. We read from the end of the Torah and then immediately read from the beginning. With every ending there is a new beginning. Having completed a task, we realize there is more to be done. With death, comes new life. Every stage of existence is connected one to the other. It is a powerful metaphor and one that we should not take lightly.

But life is often taken for granted. Perhaps, that is how it should be. We could not live our lives if we spent it worrying each day about the next. Just as we take for granted that the sun will rise each day, so do we live with the faith that we will rise up each morning.

Tradition teaches us to live in gratitude. That is our compromise. To live simply without appreciating our lives would risk leading our lives hedonistically at worst or ignoring the needs of the body at best. Gratitude gives us perspective and balance. Modeh Ani are the words we say each morning... "Thank you God for..." I greet the New Year with gratitude and pray that the year to come will be one of health and joy for us all.

CANTOR'S CORNER



From Cantor Hutchings' Erev Rosh Hashanah Sermon 5784

Here we are. New Year. Blank Slate. We've returned.... To love, to truth, and to You, God. But this begs the big question. The question most of us grappled with while thinking about attending these Services, and while we were picking out our special attire, while we drove here, as we entered these doors, and as we sit here right now... What is God? Who is God? Where is God? Is there God?

So tell me... How do *YOU* view God?

Thanks to learning Biblical text not in its ancient Hebrew and Aramaic forms but in a shaky version of English translation, many of us were raised

to believe that God was a gray-bearded man in the sky. Even if it wasn't explicitly taught this way in Religious School, it was the only tangible way young minds could grasp the concept. The problem is, that never really changed for many of us, and that is why many have turned away to think, that's a character in a story, and there is no God at all...

I remember being 12 years old at one of my first Services at CNT. It was Rabbi Akselrad's sermon at a Family Service. He said, "You can see God however you want to. However God makes sense to you."

Wait, what? Excuse me? I thought one God meant one visual interpretation! (I know, I know... but I was 12, and my mom had spent my life telling me that God would catch all of the balloons we let go of into the sky.)

But that was it. THE MOMENT I began to struggle to understand who God is in my life. Would it surprise you to know, that even as a Cantor almost Rabbi, I still struggle today? My guess is you do, too. That's not a problem. Why? Because Our Jewish text constantly reminds us that we are supposed to be digging, questioning, and interpreting. That's why we are encouraged to study every day and never stop until the moment we die. Even if we think we "know" all there is, there is STILL more to be discovered in the white spaces that surround the black text....

There is a midrash that teaches that when we say we cannot see God's face, it's because we can see God's back. Now, think about it... if we were to embrace God from behind and our eyes see through the Compassionate One's eyes and feel with those hands, what would our world look like? Perhaps if we cared that much and were that cognizant of our connection with The Vastness, we would build a better humanity. We would work harder and smarter. We would be kinder. We would be more thoughtful. We wouldn't treat prayers like wishes, but instead as motivations to achieve our deepest desires.

Perhaps, through the All-Knowing One's eyes, we could realize that we are only going to be our best selves if we reflect on our own actions, show deeper gratitude, and love deeper than we believed we could.







CNT's Clergy Reads To Kantor ECEC Preschool Kids



It literally means "war on anti-Semitism." The fight against anti-Semitism is essential to protect the rights and safety of Jews around the world, and it is also important for promoting tolerance and understanding between people of all faiths and backgrounds.






The Forums are designed to gain a greater understanding and awareness of the diverse belief traditions represented in Southern Nevada. We hope you attend and support your Clergy at these events.






