I got my start and Cantor Hutchings is someone who always let me lead. I write a lot of Jewish music and she always let me share my music on the bimah. Even before I made this decision to go to Cantorial school, I had a lot of experience leading a community as a prayer leader just throughout my time volunteering at CNT. So I'm super grateful to the whole CNT community for all the opportunities they gave that prepared me to be the Cantor that I am about to become. I'm also going to be traveling to congregations and Jewish communities all around the country as a visiting Cantor and Artist-in-Residence. As someone who writes a lot of Jewish music as a composer, this is a great way for me to be able to share my music and share my teachings with communities all across the country. I want to have as wide of an impact as possible and be able to spread my wings."

Congregation Ner Tamid hosted a Rainbow Shabbat on Friday, March 31, 2023, to remind the community that all people are welcome at the Temple, no matter who they are or how they love.

The Service featured CNT's Cantor Jessica Hutchings and Cantorial Soloist Raymond Zachary (they/ them) and their Drag persona Miss Livinya Karr.

"Shabbat is one of the holiest experiences you can have in Judaism," Zachary said. "We just wanted to give it a little 'zhuzh.' It was a wonderful Shabbat Service to promote inclusion and love."

"Through the lens of loving others as ourselves, we welcomed a spectacular weekend," Cantor Hutchings said. "I loved sharing the bimah with Raymond Zachary and his Drag persona Miss Livinya Karr for a memorable and meaningful Rainbow Shabbat. I am abundantly grateful."

The evening started at 6:00 p.m. with a Tot Shabbat with Cantor Hutchings who gave a ruach-filled service for Preschool and Religious school students and their parents. Kids dressed in rainbow attire and ate rainbow challah.

At 7:00 p.m., CNT's Rainbow Shabbat Committee was honored on the bimah and lit the Shabbat candles, and Cantor Jessica Hutchings and Cantorial Soloist Zachary and their Drag persona Miss Livinya Karr presided over Services.

Zachary is a classically trained countertenor who has sung in more than 20 synagogues and performed as the lead singer of Disney's first Jewish band Mostly Kosher at Disneyland. Zachary is also an award-winning musical theater actor and Drag Queen.

Zachary attended American Jewish University as a Jewish studies major and served as a Cantorial soloist for several years. Zachary is a proud member of the Guild of Temple Musicians in association with the American Conference of Cantors. In addition, Zachary has been a religious school teacher passing on the traditions of the Jewish people to the next generation.

Zachary's Drag persona, Miss Livinya Karr, has been officiating B'nai Mitzvahs, weddings, and baby namings in addition to bringing the art of live Drag to the masses.



Clayton Greb Spends Spring Break in Poland, Learns Lifelong Lessons

Congregation Ner Tamid Religious School alumnus Clayton Greb gave the D'Var Torah at Shabbat Services Friday, April 21, 2023, and talked about his recent trip to Poland through "Living Links." This Chabad-organized inspirational student trip to Poland explores the persecution of Jews during the Holocaust, and how we live as Jews today. Clayton's group traversed through cemeteries, death camps, ghettos, and other vestiges of Jewish life and loss across Poland and he was struck by how places of death and horror are now tourists traps, with food courts,



where people are profiting off the historic pain of the Jews. The eye-opening and life-changing weeklong journey caused Clayton, a proud Jew and sophomore at University of Nevada – Reno, to question how he should channel his anger and instinctual need for revenge. "As a Jew, we are not supposed to seek grudges," he said. "So we should sing 'Am Yisrael Chai,' (To The Israel People) and celebrate that we, the Jewish people, are still here and that is our revenge. Our revenge is that we are able to visit Auschwitz and, unlike 80 years ago, walk out. Everyone should think of a Jewish resolution to get more connected with their Judaism like going to Friday Night Services, driving their kids to Sunday School, and acknowledging their mezuzah when coming home.

"I saw this trip as an opportunity to expand my own personal knowledge and spread what I would learn," he said.
