# PRESIDENTIAL PERSPECTIVES



Three years ago I was asked to assume the presidency of the Board of Trustees for the second time. My first stint was in the early 1990s when we were a much smaller Congregation located on Emerson Avenue. The biggest challenge we faced at that time was expanding our facility.

We met the challenge.

This time around the challenges were far different, and at first seemed overwhelming. Literally overnight our campus was closed, services went remote (how many of you were familiar with Zoom or YouTube?), activities and programs were postponed or cancelled, and the Kantor ECEC shut down. It was presumed our Membership would decrease, and some, convinced that we would not be able to meet our

financial commitments, were prepared to take additional drastic action. Simply put, a degree of panic had set in. So, we (clergy, staff, and my fellow Trustees) took a breath, adapted, improvised, and planned for the next day, week, month, year, and eventually the end of the pandemic by expanding our administrative staff beginning with the recruitment of Ed Simon as Executive Director; modernizing our internal systems and communications with our Congregants; updating our financial reporting and forecasting; placing greater emphasis on Membership recruiting and retention; reopening the Kantor ECEC; adding programming for all of our constituencies; enhancing our financial condition and liquidity, including both significant increases in our budgets (always balanced) and significant paydown of our mortgage; beginning to remodel our campus; and addressing the retirement of Rabbi Akselrad in late 2025. Looking back, we did not simply maintain the status quo.

During my previous stint as president and this stint, Congregants and others asked why I (or anyone) would take on this responsibility. Some repeated their favorite Jewish Congregant president joke. The implication was self-inflicted misery. But for me, these last three years have been especially rewarding. With all of your help and support, CNT not only survived the pandemic but used this time to accomplish so much for all of us and for generations to come.

So, thank you for allowing me to serve you for the past three years, and to now, once again, become a "former president."

# RABBI'S REFLECTIONS Rabbi Sanford Akselrad, rabbak@lvnertamid.org

I'm baaack! It's been a bit over three months since I was actively involved in Synagogue life. I am so appreciative of this time for a sabbatical given to me by our Temple Board. It turned out to be the perfect opportunity for me to celebrate 35 years of service to the Congregation and 40 years of marriage! During this time Joni and I had a lot of travel adventures spending time in Israel, England, Iceland, Alaska, and on a Royal Caribbean cruise as a chaplain for Passover. Like many in their 60s, Joni and I have been bit by the "travel bug" and we love seeing new sites, learning about different cultures, and digging into the history of other countries. Many of our destinations provided us with the opportunity to enrich our knowledge of Jewish history. In England, for example, Joni and I made our way to the Westminster Synagogue which



ended up housing more than 1,600 Torah scrolls originally collected by the Czech Museum in Prague. Many of these scrolls are on permanent loan to Synagogues throughout the world, including Congregation Ner Tamid. Another highlight was visiting the Mikvé Israel-Emanuel Synagogue which was built in 1730 and serves as the oldest continuously operating Synagogue in the western hemisphere. Located in Curação, its most notable feature is the sand flooring in the sanctuary. While many think that this is in keeping with the spirit of the Caribbean, some scholars feel it is actually a custom carried over from life in Portugal and Spain. Jews who practiced their religion in secret would use sand to muffle the sound of worshippers. In Israel, I attended a remarkable conference of Reform rabbis from all over the world. During this time Joni and I had the opportunity to visit many important places where the Reform movement is making a tremendous difference in the lives of ordinary Israelis. The Bet Daniel Synagogue located in Tel Aviv's Old North hosts hundreds of weddings and B'nai Mitzvah every year. Founded in 1991, it has quickly become a cultural institution in Tel Aviv. It also houses the largest non-orthodox conversion program in Israel. I also had the opportunity to meet with members of the Ethiopian Jewish community, the Reform kibbutz movement, and members of Parliament. A highlight was protesting with 200,000 Israelis against proposed judicial reform – a decision that will determine the future of Israel and its democracy for generations to come.

Lastly, I am proud to announce I gathered and edited more than 100 essays I had written during the COVID pandemic and I published my first book, **Love in the Time of Corona**. I will have an official rollout and book signing event very soon, but, if you are curious, go ahead and order the book on **Amazon.com** now. Based solely on word of mouth it has already become a bestseller!

It goes without saying, how indebted and grateful I am to my entire staff, and especially, my co-clergy, Cantor Jessica Hutchings, who ensured the vitality of the Congregation during an exceptionally busy time of year. Cantor Hutchings especially went above and beyond in attending to both rabbinical and cantorial duties. She is a remarkably capable, passionate, and creative leader. We are all fortunate to have her as part of the clergy team in our Congregation.

Looking forward to being with all of you and seeing you at Temple in the weeks ahead.



It's hard to believe it has been a year since Jeremy's cancer diagnosis. June 2022 – December 2022 is like a blur. I am ecstatic to cautiously proclaim that we are on the other side of this difficult part of our journey. Jeremy looks and feels healthy, his last scan showed remission, and things are beginning to feel kind of... normal. Without this amazing community of support, incredible friends and family, the unmatched brilliance of our oncologist (a longtime CNT Member), and the tireless work of vigilant and caring nurses, we would not be here. Many are not so lucky. The number of cancer diagnoses has only gone up this past year. People seem to be younger and younger. Nobody

is immune. Even though our fight has taken a pause (hopefully forever), the search for a cure, the need for better education, and the funding to make remission happen for so many is still very much at the forefront. During Jeremy's fight, I felt helpless. Prayers were not enough. Being a steadfast wife and mother was not enough. I could not cure his cancer, and I felt lost. In the beginning of 2023, my sister said she wanted a challenge to work towards, and I was looking for something to help me show gratitude for Jeremy's remission. I told her about a hike I found through the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. We would hike up to 10,000 feet elevation in the Rocky Mountains, and we would do so in honor of Jeremy and with the hope of helping others by raising funds for this amazing nonprofit organization. It would follow the Jewish principles of pikuach nefesh by caring for ourselves and others and it would be tikkun olam, doing our part to make this world a little better. It seemed like a no-brainer and we said, "Sister, let's do this!" (Special shout out to the amazing Silas Korman and his wonderful family for being totally willing to have me miss his Bar Mitzvah in order to take this journey. You have no idea how grateful I am. I will be sending Mazal Tovs every step of the way!)

We have done great work raising funds for the LLS, but we haven't quite met our goal. You can help us do that before we set off later this month. You can support the work of our hearts. You can honor Jeremy's fight and the fight of your own loved ones who have battled cancer. You can make a difference with just a little tzedakah. If you can't spare the tzedakah, that's okay, too. Send us encouraging notes. Take a hike in honor of ours. Do a Mitzvah match and do a little something on **Saturday, June 24,** and tag us **@nertamidvegas** on social media about how you are joining our team "Hiking for Hutchings" symbolically. Pirkei Avot, one of my very favorite Jewish texts about how to live ethically and consciously in the world, teaches in 2:16, "It is not your duty to finish the work, but neither do you have the liberty to neglect it." In other words, let's do our part. Through incremental and individual efforts, we can see the world change.

CNT Religious School Students, Teachers Honored At Confirmation





# POP-UP SHABBAT

### Pop-Up Shabbat A Safe, Celebratory Success In Downtown Las Vegas

Nearly 300 people celebrated Shabbat, safely, at Pop-Up Shabbat under the stars in downtown Las Vegas on Friday, April 28, from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. The Reform Jewish community came together for the newsworthy, innovative, introspective, all-ages prayer experience right off the Las Vegas Strip at El Cortez' Jackie Gaughan Plaza.

In the wake of the FBI's hate crime investigation at Las Vegas' Clark High School, where a swastika was carved on the back of a Jewish student with autism on March 9, there were safety concerns at both Pop-Up Shabbat and at the Israeli American Council's (IAC) Celebrate Israel Festival on Sunday, April 30.

All four Las Vegas television news affiliates, ABC 13, CBS 8, FOX 5, and NBC 3, ran stories about Pop-Up Shabbat and alerted the public of increased safety measures.

Congregation Ner Tamid's Cantor Jessica Hutchings and Temple Sinai's Spiritual Leader and Cantorial soloist Heather Klein were co-organizers of the event. Cantor Hutchings told ABC 13 that the recent antisemitic events were not going to stop Pop-Up Shabbat from taking place and that "our door is open to everyone in the community."

Cantor Hutchings told 8 News Now reporter Ryan Matthey that Pop-Up Shabbat organizers hired five times the amount of security they typically would have for the annual event. Spiritual Leader Klein said the extra measures were necessary to combat hate. "I think we just don't have a

choice," Klein told CBS 8. "I think it's something we absolutely have to do, and it's better to be safe than sorry."

Regional Director of The Anti-Defamation League Nevada and Arizona Jolie Brislin, who attended Pop-Up Shabbat with her family, said the ADL has tracked a 36 percent increase in antisemitic incidents over the previous year.

Earlier in April, NBC 3 announced the family-friendly spiritual event would feature arts and crafts for the kids, a Falafel Vegas food truck, live entertainment by Disney's Jewish rock band Mostly Kosher, a Ben & Jerry's ice cream oneg, and a young adults' after-party at Evel Pie. When Fox 5 MORE host and news anchor Jason Feinberg told his morning viewers about Pop-Up Shabbat, he said during Shabbat, "It is customary to say prayers, drink wine, and eat challah. Challah is so good, yummy."

Pop-Up Shabbat had no security incidents, and organizers said they will continue to produce diverse and meaningful experiences for the entire Reform Jewish community with the help of volunteers, renowned Jewish musicians, and co-sponsors Jewish Nevada, the JCC, and PJ Library.

Former Justice of the Nevada Supreme Court, and CNT Member, Michael A. Cherry presented the founder of the treatment court, retired Henderson Municipal Court Judge Mark Stevens, with a plaque of appreciation.

"These courts are magnificent in keeping people on the straight and narrow," Justice Cherry said. "I'm proud that our Temple could do something like this for the Veterans Court here in Henderson, Nevada."

"The whole idea is to get the veterans back on track, and the Court has a 95 percent success rate."

#### NCG's Mental Health Team 'Makes A Difference'

Nevadar sfor the Common Good (NCG) is an organizing coalition focusing on the needs of Nevada residents. Determining the needs comes from house meetings, during which citizens can feel free to express their concerns and share their experiences. As a result of the house meetings, an issue team, specific to mental health, was developed. The Mental Health Team is comprised of members from local churches and nonprofit organizations throughout the Valley, as well as members of Congregation Ner Tamid. As chairperson of this team, I have seen first-hand how important this issue is and how hard people are willing to work to make a difference.

On Tuesday, January 24, team members met with Attorney Kim Abbott of Legal Aid of Southern Nevada, who described Nevada's mental health system as a "horribly fractured, dysfunctional system," explaining that there is outpatient care, residential treatment, and nothing in between. In early March, team members met with Mayor Michelle Romero of Henderson. The team wanted to know what plans the mayor has for addressing mental health in Henderson, how funding is being used, etc. As a followup to that meeting, the mayor suggested we speak to Hayley Jarolimek, Neighborhood Services Manager; Stacy DiNicola, Community Resource Coordinator; and, Lisa Kelso, Community Resource and Resiliency Center Supervisor. We learned about Henderson's co-responder team, which consists of a police officer and a clinician, who go out on calls related to mental health and substance use issues. We also learned about the Homeless Response Team, who helps find and fund emergency lodging and resources for those in need. Lastly, our team met with Las Vegas City Councilman Brian Knudsen, who is working to develop a crisis response center. This center would provide resources, medication management, and case management services for those with mental health issues and substance use disorders. There is still much to learn and much to be done, but the Mental Health Team is on it! The CNT NCG team meets on the third Thursday of each month via Zoom and the Mental Health Team meets on the third Tuesday. Won't you join us and make a difference for your community?


