

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS



It was in December 1974 that Congregation Ner Tamid officially came into being. This was after many meetings and support from what was then the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. It is hard to believe that this is our "Jubilee year!"

As many of you recall, I came to Congregation Ner Tamid in February 1988. At that time a lot had been accomplished. Several Rabbis had been at the helm – Rabbi Weissberg z"l, Rabbi Hecht, and Rabbi Maline. Each one of them brought leadership and direction to the Synagogue. A building on Emerson was built and that was what I "inherited" when I moved here with my wife Joni and our daughter CJ in tow. I knew that there was a lot of potential for Congregation Ner Tamid to grow. And grow we did. From some sixty families to nearly 600 families.



Over the last 50 years, thousands upon thousands of people have come through our doors for simchas and sorrows. Baby namings, weddings, B'nai Mitzvah, funerals, and celebrations of life. Some have been touched by our worship services and others by our programs and our activities. And still others have found a spiritual home here where they have raised their children with pride.

The other day, I officiated at a baby naming where the father had been my Bar Mitzvah student more than 20 years ago. And of course, our Cantor, Jessica Hutchings, is a product of our Temple. I also officiated at her Bat Mitzvah.

But it isn't just about my memories. This is a time to share all of our memories and to rejoice in our good fortune! Throughout the year we will have special activities that we will be branded with our 50th Anniversary logo. In the winter of 2024, the year will culminate in a very special weekend of remembrance and celebration. More info on that to come...

It is also a time to take a look at our current facility. It is hard to believe that we have been here since February 2007! As such, we are in need of refurbishing our facility. Yeshiva Day School has been a tenant for many years, and they will be moving out in January 2024. There will be a need to remodel and repair various parts of our building that have seen heavy usage. But, beyond this, we will have a chance to grow our vision of what our campus can and will become. We will recapture the use of our classrooms, and repurpose our open areas adding playground equipment and areas that will enrich the experience of being on the CNT campus. There will be new naming opportunities and it will be a very exciting time in the history of Congregation Ner Tamid!

Have you ever stood with one foot in Nevada and one in California at the same time? At the same time two sets of laws, two opinions, and two possibilities. It's a duality I had never thought about before October 7th, 2023... and now I feel as if my entire being is standing in two places at once every moment of every day. I am not just talking about wholeheartedly loving and supporting Israel in one place and also praying for an end to a brutal war. Mourning the victims, yearning for the safe return of hostages, and also needing to have the presence of mind to celebrate the joys that are right in front of me. Duality. We are all living in duality right now. It brings on a whole new meaning to "If I forget you, Jerusalem, let me forget my right hand."

A couple of weeks ago, I had the honor of sitting down in an intimate setting with the families of the hostages who are still in captivity. Lunch was ordered, people were sharing the events of their days, and there were smiles as we greeted one another. It felt like any other day, except... I could not eat, smile, or think of anything else but these people who had just entered the room. I said to the aunt of one of the hostages, "It feels strange to eat while you are sharing your niece's abduction." She said, "But we have to eat. We have to light the Chanukiah, and we have to live FOR them until they are home."

Duality. Living and yearning. Smiling for our today and crying for theirs. It's exhausting and also necessary.

Two days later, I had another heart-wrenching honor... to speak and sing at the vigil memorializing the victims of the UNLV shooting the week prior. Finding the words and the song to capture the immense sadness we all felt seemed impossible. This moment felt less like standing in two states and more like standing in Arizona, Utah, Colorado, and New Mexico all at the same time. To mourn loss, to feel anxious about our own safety at any given moment in our schools and places of work, to feel a responsibility to bear witness, and to feel glad that we survived were a mixed emotion like none other.

I share these stories to say to you, "shamati." I hear you. I see you. I feel what you feel. You are not alone in feeling everywhere and everything at the same time. If we hold onto hope and each other, we will find strength and gratitude so that we can continue to do our part in making this world a better place.

Duality. I pray for the hostages' safe return, an end to violence, peace for all of us, and also for the ability to be present in this moment and experience joy whenever possible. For if we live life to the fullest, they do not suffer in vain.

Today, let us acknowledge our fears and sadness and also find a reason to genuinely smile.

CNT's Rabbi, Cantor, MENSch Club Featured In The News In December

The Las Vegas Israelite published nine articles about CNT in its December 1, 2023, issue. Both Rabbi Akselrad (front page) and Cantor Hutchings wrote inspiring articles about Chanukah and the holiday season, and CNT's MENSch Club was featured in a full page spread, frying latkes.

On Thursday, December 7, Rabbi Akselrad was featured in *The Las Vegas Review-Journal* in an article entitled, "I Tell Myself To Be Strong – Local Rabbis Overwhelmed By Israeli War As Hanukkah Nears." The newspaper also published a moving photo of Rabbi Akselrad sitting in the middle of empty seats in CNT's Sanctuary with signage representing the Israeli hostages held by Hamas.

Local Fox News affiliate Fox 5 KVVU-TV featured CNT's Shir Shabbat Chanukah with The Shabbatones, Consecration Ceremony, and Latke Dinner, on the news on Friday, December 8. The station's cameraman shot some exclusive video of CNT's MENSch Club frying latkes in the kitchen!

Both Rabbi Akselrad and Cantor Hutchings attended a memorial vigil at UNLV on Wednesday, December 13, that honored the three faculty members who were killed and one who was left critically injured in the deadly campus shooting that took place a week prior. Rabbi Akselrad was quoted prominently in an article about the vigil published by *The Las Vegas Sun* on Thursday, December 14.

And, on Tuesday, December 19, Rabbi Akselrad gave the invocation at the Clark County Commissioners meeting. It was held at the Clark County Government Center and broadcast on Clark County Television. Rabbi Akselrad was introduced by County Commission Chairman Jim Gibson, and Rabbi's blessing was featured after the Call to Order and before the Pledge of Allegiance.

David Weinstein 2023 Congregant Of The Year



David Weinstein is the Temple's man behind the camera, capturing the moments that make Congregation Ner Tamid a special place to belong.

"I've been lucky to photograph multi-generations of life events for families at Congregation Ner Tamid for more than 40 years," Weinstein said. "Over thousands of pictures, I can't begin to tell you how much fun I've had being able to capture these events. I adore seeing all the successes of the young adults I've photographed over these many years."

You can see Weinstein's credited photos of Shabbat services, B'nai Mitzvahs, birthdays, weddings, galas, fundraisers, and special events on CNT's social media and website, and in eblasts, Bulletins,

and in the Las Vegas Israelite.

Weinstein's passion for photography started in high school when he began to shoot concerts in Connecticut. He shot promotional and concert photography for i95 ROCK radio (WRKI-FM) and was the first i95 Moose mascot. The job gave him access to perfect his professional photography at many acclaimed theatrical and music performances of that time.

In 1979, Weinstein took a transformative trip driving across the country to visit a friend who was moving out of his studio apartment near UNLV in Las Vegas. He had two weeks of paid rent remaining. "I needed a new adventure and challenge, and I'm still in Las Vegas," he said.

In the early 80s, Weinstein began photographing B'nai Mitzvahs and weddings at CNT on the Emerson Campus. On February 5, 2007, he photo documented the Torah Walk to CNT's current location on Valle Verde Drive and took photos of the first Bat Mitzvah held in the new Sanctuary. He's still taking photos of special celebrations at CNT today: www.nofujifilm.com.

"We only take pictures for two reasons, good ones and bad ones," Weinstein said. "My advice is to take pictures for good reasons. Don't wait until 'the summer when the weather is warmer' or 'until my hair grows three more inches.' All our family pictures are meaningful and beautiful. Take them now!"



Rabbi Lerner To Host '50 Years Of Zionism' Zoom Lecture





Rabbi Leigh Lerner will host an adult education lecture for CNT Members on **Wednesday, February 7,** from 7:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.

"50 Years of Zionism: A Look at the Early Leaders of Modern Zionism From the Late 1800s to the Creation of the State of Israel in 1948" will look at early Zionist leaders such as Theodore Herzl and Ahad Ha'am and the impact that their vision had in the formation of the State of Israel, and the impact their vision has had in guiding Israel today.

The free lecture will also feature a Q&A.

Rabbi Lerner was a Senior Rabbi at Mount Zion Temple, in St. Paul, MN, from 1974 to 1989. He chaired the Jewish Federation campaign, renewed a Black-Jewish

Dialogue, and created an outreach and long-range planning program.

From 1989 he was spiritual leader of Temple Emanu-El-Beth Sholom, in Montreal, Canada. The Congregation became recognized as an NGO by the U.S. State Department for its work against human trafficking. An extensive outreach program saw the creation of Montreal's first Jewish PFLAG support group for LGBTQ+ persons and their families.

Rabbi Lerner also created a Hebrew/ English/ French siddur and brought art and interactivity into the Congregation's life, becoming Rabbi Emeritus in 2012. For seven years he helped Italy's Reform Jewish Synagogues in Milan, Florence, and Rome and still teaches online there.

His novel, The Mossad Messiah, is available on Amazon.

"I've wintered in Las Vegas from time to time, but now, retired from 23 years of leadership at Temple Emanu-El-Beth Sholom of Montreal, I call Sun City Summerlin home," Rabbi Lerner said. "I'm looking forward to offering my services to teach adult study and discussion at Ner Tamid."






