

PRESIDENTIAL PERSPECTIVES




When Congregation Ner Tamid was established almost 50 years ago, the founders adopted a policy that no one would be turned away from Membership because of financial constraints. This commitment has never changed, and today a significant number of our families are on reduced dues and fees. Of course, this policy of reduced dues has an impact on our ability to pay our bills and provide services and programs. So, 30 years ago, we established the Menorah Membership Program to recognize those Members who provide more than the annual standard dues and fees. When the Menorah Membership Program started, we committed to providing those Members who joined with special events throughout the year and enhanced benefits. Over the years, Menorah Membership increased, and we held annual events such as a Spring BBQ

and a Chanukah Party where Members received unique menorahs and candles. However, in recent years, and specifically because of the pandemic and lockdown, the Menorah Program has languished.

Over the past year, we had the opportunity to refocus on and reinvigorate the Menorah Program. We revamped the various levels of Menorah Membership beginning with the threshold of \$3,600, added benefits such as High Holy Days parking on Campus, and held events including a get-together for a sneak preview of the Chernikoff Torah and Chanukah party at the home of Bruce and Sarah Familian on Wednesday, December 14 (photos below), and are planning a Spring BBQ at the home of Steven and Stacey Lewis. These events allow us the opportunity to socialize and support a basic commitment of CNT and its founders – that no one is turned away from Membership because of finances. Menorah Membership has increased to a record 60 families, and our goal is to increase the Menorah Program Membership to 100 families. This will be approximately one in six of our families. It seems like eons ago that I joined nearly two dozen colleagues on a special mission to Krakow, Poland, in order to bring support to the refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine. Proudly our Congregation raised more than \$75,000 and half a dozen duffle bags filled with supplies. Altogether our group of 22 rabbis raised more than \$800,000 and two tons worth of supplies. Beyond this concrete expression of support, what we saw and experienced made an indelible impression on every member of our delegation.

Surprisingly, since last year, I connected with a second cousin who was doing genealogical research. I discovered that my grandfather came not from Poland, but from Ukraine! I am, in part, Ukrainian! This revelation only added additional texture to an already impactful trip.



Like many life-changing experiences, one is called to ask, "What if this had been me and my family?" Through a twist of fate, my grandfather Morris decided to leave and made his way to America. Over time he brought other members of his family to this country, thus sparing some but not all from the fate of the Holocaust.

One might think that Rabbis of all people would refuse aid to the Ukrainian people. After all, the Ukrainians were one of the worst offenders during the Holocaust. But, Jonathan Ornstein, the Chief Executive Officer of the Krakow Jewish Community Centre who housed our mission, explained, "What was not done to help our people, we must do for these people." Through his actions and leadership, he wanted to not only make a difference but show the citizens of Poland and Ukraine, that the Jewish people truly believe in Tikkun Olam.

With deep gratitude to the Stralser and Alterwitz families, we will be bringing Jonathan to CNT during the weekend of **January 20 - 22, 2023,** to give an update to our Congregation on how the JCC continues to save lives and bring leadership to the hundreds of thousands still seeking assistance of every kind. He will also educate us as to the rise of the Jewish community itself as slowly but surely a new generation is arising to bring back Jewish life and culture. It is a fascinating story. One filled with sadness and tragedy to be sure, but also one filled with determination and heroism as well.

I look forward to everyone attending our special Shabbat on **Friday, January 20, at 7:00 p.m.** Be sure to bring your children and grandchildren as well. Jonathan is an example of how one person has made a difference because his Jewish values compelled him to stand up and not turn aside. Is there a more important lesson than this we can give our children?

Wishing you a happy new year, with prayers for hope, healing and peace for the year to come.

CANTOR'S CORNER



After years of "trying" to become pregnant, I finally experienced success through IVF (in vitro fertilization). Sadly, seven weeks later, I lost that pregnancy and fell into the deepest depression imaginable. There were no words, no songs, no hugs of consolation. I was numb, weak, and in the deepest need of healing. My partner in prayer, Rabbi Sanford Akselrad, suggested I take a meaningful mikveh. On my own, I went to our local mikveh and I took the most meaningful plunge. I did not have a guide. I did not have words. I did not have a voice strong enough to sing. I did, however, have tears... and sacred waters. While it is not magic, it was transformative. In the weeks that followed, I found healing, hope, and strength to go on. I was forever broken, but light had

repaired the crack in my heart. While back in seminary (already a Cantor, now working to become a Rabbi), I took a class called Creative Liturgy. Using the gorgeous text and traditions already written for us and the creative and spiritual flexibility that is Judaism, we were asked to "Create" "Liturgy" for a moment in our lives. When I experienced the missed abortion, I had one small prayer in the CCAR Reform Rabbis manual to read before going in for the D&C (dilation and curettage) operation. It was lovely but it was not enough. The mikveh was what I needed. I wish a ceremony had been available to me, so I am making it possible that a ceremony is available to those who come after me.

This R'fuat T'vilah, Immersive Healing, can be used for any traumatic experience that requires healing waters. *I created immersion ceremonies for pregnancy loss, divorce, life-altering experiences, and the loss of a loved one. The ceremonies are meant to take place in a mikveh. It can be out on the ocean, inside a dwelling with a ritual bath, or in any body of water that can be defined as living water.



It can be done at any time of day, but I recommend sunset. Candles can be set around the ritual bath to create a healing ambiance. Essential oils can be diffused around the space to create a calming atmosphere — I recommend eucalyptus. The ceremony can be with a Cantor/ Rabbi and you alone, or with a spouse, partner, or even a few dear friends.

May the Holy One of Blessing guide you through the journey of renewal, re-imagination, hope, strength, comfort and well-being. You should be proud of yourself for taking this step towards wholeness.

Congregation Ner Tamid To Host JCC Krakow's Jonathan Ornstein






When Congregation Ner Tamid's Rabbi Akselrad was on his Rabbinic mission to Poland and the Ukrainian Border in April 2022, he and more than 20 other Rabbis collected and delivered two tons of supplies and more than \$800,000 to the Jewish Community Centre of Krakow, Poland, to aid in its refugee relief efforts. Jonathan Ornstein, the CEO of JCC Krakow, will be CNT's Scholar-In-Residence from **Friday**, **January 20**, **to Sunday**, **January 22**, **2023**.

"Jonathan has done amazing work not only trying to comfort Jews fleeing Ukraine but also aiding all refugees seeking help in

his region," CNT's Rabbi Sanford Akselrad said. "We are delighted to host Jonathan in Las Vegas where he can share his stories directly with our Members and our community, and let us all know how we can continue to help the relief effort."

SOCIAL HALL DEDICATION

CNT Dedicates Gary And Lynn Kantor Hall

Rabbi Sanford Akselrad delivered the following speech on Sunday, December 4, 2022:

"Congregation Ner Tamid was founded in 1974. It had various locations until we found a home on Emerson Avenue. In February 2007, we moved to our current Campus. That was nearly 15 years ago. In all that time, nearly 50 years, we have never had a named Social Hall; until today. Our Social Hall is not just a place for gathering for Shabbat Onegs. If that were the case, Dayenu. Or a place where brides and grooms gather to celebrate their Simchas. Dayenu. Or Adult Ed, Baby Namings, Purim Carnivals, Seniors Programs, MENSch Club, Sisterhood, and Annual Meetings, all of which we could say 'Dayenu.' The list of programs is seemingly endless. No, our Social Hall fulfills the third vital mission of a synagogue community: Bet Hatefilah, house of prayer; Beit Ha-midrash, house of study; and Beit Knesset, house of gathering. A WALKING MIRACLE by Dorie Kirtman



Mike Unger, 27-year CNT Congregant, is a man of many talents and experiences. He has been married to Roberta for 47 years, and is the father of five, and grandfather of four. He has worked in the hotel and casino business for 39 years and has known numerous entertainers, celebrities, politicians, and members of the Mob. He has held leadership positions at CNT – president of the MENSch Club for three years, three years on the CNT Board, and in the Jewish community served a three-year term as VP of B'nai B'rith. He was also past president of several hotel organizations in the Las Vegas community and was involved with the United Way Campaign Cabinet for 18 years. However, what is not widely known about

Mike is that he is an eight-time cancer survivor, has beaten the odds against a variety of cancers, and is also a survivor of another wicked and pernicious disease. He is an inspiration to all of us who are facing life-threatening medical issues. Mike moved to Las Vegas with his parents and siblings in 1967 from North Hollywood, California. He was one of the first graduates from the University of Nevada's Hotel Management Program and eventually worked in management positions at various hotels – the Frontier, Dunes, Aladdin, Showboat, and Caesars – throughout the area and helped stage large sporting events for the community. It was during this time when Mike was 38-years-old that he contracted an extremely rare and debilitating disease called Guillain-Barre Syndrome. This disease causes one's immune system to affect and harm the body's nerves, causing weakness and paralysis throughout. It often affects the arms, legs, breathing muscles, and even the face. Eventually, Mike's body became paralyzed and he could only communicate with the movement of his eyes. There is no known cure.

MEMBERSHIP

Mike was hospitalized for nine weeks and his recovery took several months. He will tell you that this was one of the most difficult and scary periods of his life. Eventually, in later years, Mike faced other serious medical challenges. He contracted colon cancer at age 54 and surgically had seven inches of colon removed. He next encountered prostate cancer in 2003, was treated with oral medication, and is still under active surveillance. Then in 2004, he developed a carcinoma on the top of his head and had a Mohs procedure. Mike remembers leading a staff meeting at that time when everyone there was staring at him. Finally, someone said, "Look, you're bleeding from the top of your head!" That was a weird moment for Mike. Later in his early 60s, after seeing an oncologist and getting tested, Mike was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor on his left kidney. Although he had no symptoms at the time, a very large nine-pound tumor and his kidney were removed surgically. Fortunately, the tumor was encapsulated and the cancer hadn't spread. Mike still has a photo on his cell phone that was taken of that big baby. Then, six years ago, a dangerous tumor was discovered on Mike's neck, just below his ear. This tumor was inoperable, but fortunately for him, Mike was referred to UCLA's medical center and a worldrenowned medical specialist. A combination of chemotherapy, radiation, and a medication called Keytruda, developed in Israel 12 years ago, was used to treat Mike. At the time, each Keytruda shot cost \$8,000, but luckily Mike wasn't charged a penny for the \$64,000 treatment procedure. Lastly, and more recently, a basal cell tumor was found on Mike's head and was treated with a Mohs procedure. Then a squamous cell tumor developed on his face under his eye and was removed via Mohs. He is presently being treated for a tumor by his right

temple to be removed in early 2023. After all his encounters and experiences with illness and cancer, Mike's attitude is amazingly positive and upbeat. He feels very lucky. He wants to remind you if you get cancer or another serious illness, it's not the end of the world. New medications, treatments, and procedures are being developed and are available. It's important to try different treatments and stay positive. The survival rate for cancer has increased and is continuing to make strides. Do what you can to help yourself and get support from medical professionals, your family, friends, and Rabbi. After all, Mike is a living testament to what the human spirit can endure and what Judaism teaches us: to honor and care for our bodies and to do what we can to live each day with gratitude in the best way possible.















