# Executive Message

It's been a busy time at the Synagogue, and the High Holidays will be here before you know it. Rosh Hashanah's first night is September 7th this year. So many major holidays coming in September. I'm happy we get to convert the new Pergola to a Sukkah this year for the first time, and would like to thank Bob Gordon, Tyler Gage and David Ginsburg for their help last month in its waterproofing. David is in the process of adding power to it so we can have lighting and use it in the evening hours. We're still going to need help getting the roof covered with palm branches so don't be shy to offer a hand.

I want to thank Susan Gross, Deena Lachman, Rosa Padin and Howard Silberman for clearing out the classrooms that were being used as storage rooms with items from years past. They've made those rooms usable again!

In another positive development, Rabbi Feivel and I mounted the video projector on the ceiling in the social hall and fished wires all the way back to the streaming camera area. This will be a nice addition, as we can use it for presentations or social events like the Men's Club breakfast. New emergency exit doors have been installed in the social hall as part of the homeland security grant, and Carnell is again back at it helping with the Onegs and Kiddush luncheons.

The board has been working on a renewal contract for Rabbi Sydni and has made great progress. We are negotiating an extension of four more years. I am extremely excited that she has indicated her interest in continuing to be our Rabbi for the foreseeable future.

It's not all good news though. We have three families—the Zweigs, the Luries and the Serkins—leaving Shreveport due to retirement (or other reasons), allowing them to live closer to children, grandchildren, and other loved ones. These members have been very generous donors so it will be a shock to our purse as well as to our attendance at services. I've seen the books and have to say honestly many of our congregants can do more to help financially. I'm not going to sugar coat anything. There is a big disparity among us. If you can afford to contribute more and enjoy the great services Rabbi Sydni and Rabbi Feivel are providing us, then please be more generous. If you can't, that's understandable. Most synagogues put considerable pressure on members to contribute but we have never done that. With the pandemic winding down and our operations going back to full throttle the bills of the synagogue will go up as well.

On another note, we have a staff of people at Agudath Achim that are there to help serve you. If you have an issue that is nagging you, please contact Tessa Miller, the Rabbi, or me and let us know. We will do our best to resolve your problem. If we don't know about it then we can't correct it.

If you enjoy preparing food, you are welcome to sponsor an oneg during our High Holy Day season or to bring a dessert to share on Erev Rosh HaShanah! And finally, if you're out of town or time, donations are always appreciated at this time of year. Your contributions will help fund extra security guard hours, utilities, technical assistance, and everything else needed for a meaningful High Holy Day experience.

# Louisiana Jewish Coalition

The Jewish Federation of Greater New Orleans, in conjunction with other Jewish organizations across Louisiana, is pleased to announce the creation of the Louisiana Jewish Coalition, a statewide coalition of Louisiana Jewish leaders. Seeds were planted for this unprecedented coalition in 2020 when Louisiana synagogues and Jewish agencies came together to offer funds, staff, and volunteers in response to the two hurricanes impacting central and southwestern Louisiana in 2020.

"In the aftermath of Hurricane Laura, our three Louisiana Federations mobilized to provide aid and assistance to southwestern and central Louisiana," said Arnie D. Fielkow, CEO of the Jewish Federation of Greater New Orleans. "It was only natural that we would seek to collaborate more broadly, and we're excited to see what our Louisiana Jewish Coalition can accomplish in the coming months and years."

Currently the coalition is planning a leadership conclave and a 2022 Yom Ha'atzmaut event, which will be held in collaboration with Louisiana Governor John Bel Edwards.

The coalition will kick off their partnership with a virtual August Speaker Series on Israel, with morning webinars scheduled for Sunday August 15, 22, and 29. Registration for all three events is open now.
