

### **Presidents Message**

At Agudath Achim, we are in transition. We have been without a Rabbi for a few months, but we are in contract negotiations with Rabbi David Laor, to bring a full time Rabbi back to the Shreveport Conservative community. We have folks who are new to the community who are looking to join our congregation, and folks who are wanting to join the community from other faiths, but we have lost families to cities nearer their families and better job opportunities. We've gotten an insurance payout for the roof and a grant for the windows, at the same time, our long term financial situation cannot be seen as anything other than untenable.

If nothing changed from the end of the last full year of Rabbi Sydni's time with us, that is no new members, no amazing fundraising ideas, and no loss of membership to other areas or death, and Rabbi expenses staying the same, then we project only being able to function for around 7 years. This isn't a new problem. We ran projections before we hired Rabbi Sydni, and we've been working with a deficit as long as I've been involved with the board. A few weeks ago, we had a congregational meeting. At it we chose to take what seems like contradictory steps. We are hiring a Rabbi with a multi-year contract and at the same time, we are exploring ways to reduce our expenses, up to and including the potential of selling or sharing our building.

These ideas have been kicked around before. The empty part of our property has been listed for sale for a number of years, without a reasonable offer. This building means a lot to all of us. Dave Ginsburg has made sure that it stays sound and is grateful to share that the roof repairs finally fixed the leaks we were dealing with for so long. More important though is the people, and our opportunity to come together to learn and to pray, to celebrate, to mourn, to eat and play games, to watch movies that we wouldn't likely come across in local theaters, and that, that is what Agudath Achim is. In 1902, when our synagogue was founded, we didn't have a building, we didn't start building for another 2 years, and moved into our first building in 1905, we moved in 1938, and in the 1960's we decided to move, but weren't sure it was a good idea because the population was declining- that sounds like arguments we hear at board meetings today. We finally moved here to this building in 1981. Now 42 years later, at 121 years of age, we are ensuring that Agudath Achim will continue even if it means changes.

For this to happen, I need you. As each and every one of us is enjoined to grapple with Torah and bring it into our lives, I need each of you to find ways to ensure this Congregation continues. There are many ways do this. First, of course, is dues and donations. We do watch what we spend while ensuring that we can continue to provide the services all of us depend on but costs keep going up. Second is ideas- I famously have said there are no ideas that are too out there. . .. and while of course there are ideas that may not be able to be implemented, that idea can spark other ideas.

Come to services or events, and participate. Jump into our 929 class- you don't have to come every time or have read the chapters for the week for it to be meaningful but we're reading texts we may not normally engage with and seeing parallels to issues we see around us as well as getting a better understanding of our history. Prep or donate food for oneg or kiddush luncheons.

Come play games with us on the third Shabbat of the month- we actually survived the Oregon Trail Rosh Hashana. Probably because we all asked to be inscribed in the book of Life all day. Once Rabbi Laor arrives, welcome him and his wife to our area, take the opportunity to learn something new with him and to teach him the *minchag hamakom* the customs of our community.

### **Cemetery News**



Mother Nature has been the biggest force to contend with over the decades in maintaining our cemetery. This year has seen that with a vengeance. The storms in June took down two large oak trees that just happened to fall across our chain link fence. This was on top of the oak tree at the front gate that died from the drought last year. Then there is the cost of the one hundred feet of chain link fence that needed to be repaired and replaced. Eight foot security fencing runs a lot more per foot that four foot residential. Fifteen hundred here, \$2600 there, \$2000 again: real money. A significant hit on the budget of a service that is to last to perpetuity! Total is coming to \$6000 with one more trip by the tree crew. And that is not including monument maintenance.

Most of our crowd has been very complimentary of the management that I have given to the cemetery program. For that, I thank you, knowing it is noticed and acknowledged. Now if you can pitch in and help with a donation to help offset these expenses, it will help guarantee the availability of this facility for future generations in a quality way. Please make your check out to Agudath Achim Cemetery or let Joyce know if you call it in that this is what the funds are for. Thank you for taking the time to read this and respond to our growing need.
