

A Message from our President

A few months ago, I made phone calls to ensure there was a minyan for my nephew's yahrzeit. While I'm still saying kaddish for someone else when I can, it was important to me to be able to say it for Josh, and for that I needed at least ten of us here, in the building, during services. I'm grateful for those of you who helped make that possible. Without that effort, it's likely I wouldn't have gotten that chance this year.

It isn't just the folks who are mourning who miss out. We have a Bar Mitzvah coming up (God willing) this summer, and he needs us to have a minyan so he can see the whole service and learn it. We have beautiful torahs that we don't get to take out unless we have a minyan.

This is frustrating to those of us in attendance, and back in November, Jessica Weiss pulled a few folks together to meet and as a group we decided to work on getting a minyan at least once a month.

Of course, it's ideal to have a minyan for every service, and I'd love to see your faces any time you want to come. Still, I'm asking that you **attend services, in person, on**January 20th, and arrive by 10:45 so we can have the full Torah service, and later say kaddish.

I also know that many of us have dates we want to be able to say kaddish, repeat a bnai mitzvah haftarah or need connection with other Jews. Yahrzeit letters come out 4-8 weeks before a yahrzeit, so feel free to do as I did and ask folk to attend on the day you need them to be there, and if possible, come to help make a minyan when someone is asking the same. I also want to remind everyone that while services are long, it is perfectly acceptable to get up and walk around, go get a cup of coffee if some is made, read a book, or just enjoy being in the company of our Jewish community.
