

Fee: Members \$10.00 Nonmembers \$15.00 Cost includes a glass of wine for those 21+. The cutoff date to sign up is March 15.


10. Bus Trip to Kehila Kedosha Janina Synagogue and Museum/Lower East Side

Kehila Kedosha Janina Synagogue and Museum located at 280 Broome Street, Lower East Side of New York City was built in 1925-27 and is the only remaining Romaniote rite synagogue in the Western Hemisphere. Our visit includes a history of the immigration of the Greek Jews to this area, unique aspects of religious observances and a tour of the sanctuary and museum followed by a kosher Greek lunch. This is followed by an optional tour at the Tenement Museum or 2 hours free time before we board the bus for dinner at Harold's. The Tenement Museum and dinner at Harold's are at the expense of the individual attendees. We do get a private tour at a reduced rate for those who choose to enjoy the Tenement Museum.

Date: April 14, 2019. The cutoff date to sign up is March 10. The bus leaves Adath Emanu-El's parking lot at 9:00 a.m. sharp and returns at approximately 8:00 p.m.

Fee: Members \$60.00. Nonmembers \$75.00

The course will cover the basics of Hebrew from the alphabet and structure to common prefixes used. The atmosphere is relaxed and supportive using both instructor and classmate pairing techniques as well as helpful handouts. Student questions are welcomed and encouraged.

There will be 8 sessions meeting the following Mondays from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m.: February 11, 18, 25; March 4, 18, 25; April 1 and 15.

Fee*: The fee for members of Adath Emanu-El is \$18.00 per semester, nonmember guest fee is \$25.00 per semester.


This class is free to students enrolled in the Adult Confirmation Class.
