FESTIVALS, INCLUDING ROSH HASHANAH

Candles should be lit eighteen minutes before sunset on the first night or when the Festival eve coincides with Friday night. On the second night, or on a Saturday night, candles should be lit one hour later than they were lit the previous night.

Omit on the last two days of Pesah

Barukh attah adonai eloheinu melekh ha-olam, she-heḥeyanu v'kiy'manu v'higi'anu la-z'man ha-zeh.

Praised are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, for keeping us in life, for sustaining us, and for helping us to reach this day.
