This is for everybody:

We respect each other.

We look after our FRS property, this means all the things that belong to the synagogue.

We listen to each other, we listen to teachers and madrichim and do as they ask us.

We join in and we express ourselves, and we help other people to join in and express themselves as well.

We behave well towards each other.

We all take extra care of people who need more help or who feel they are different in any way.

This is about our teachers and madrichim

Our teachers and madrichim will explain our lessons properly, and make sure everyone understands what is going on and what will happen if you do really well, or what will happen if there is a problem.

We will support you, help you to grow, treat you fairly and respect you.

We will make sure that you will learn in a safe and organised way.

Important points

No-one is allowed to treat anyone else unfairly. This includes stealing, bullying, breaking things or stopping other people from joining in.

If we think any bullying is happening, we will take it very seriously, and find out what is going on. We will also make sure parents know about it.

We do not use mobile phones or chew gum at Kochavim, TAP or Friday Group (with the exception of using phones at FG as a means of listening to recordings).

How we will help everyone to behave really well

We notice and comment on behaviour that is thoughtful, helpful and kind.

We make sure every chanich knows that they are made in the image of God, that we appreciate you, and know how important you are to us and to your group.

If there is a problem with how you are behaving

1. First of all we will notice the good and positive behaviour that is happening.
2. If it is the right thing to do, we might talk to you after the lesson.
3. If the problem continues in an activity, we will ask you to stop.
4. If we think you need a break from the activity we will give you some time to take a break inside the lesson, or outside the lesson.
5. If we are worried about how you are behaving we will tell the Director of Education, who will speak with your parents to work out how to help you to take part.
6. We will work closely with your parents to work out a plan for how to support you, and for how you will find a way to take part. We might ask you to take a break from the programme if we feel that this is necessary.
