By the time you read this, the Annual Meeting for Mizpah will have occurred. As I shared with you last month, Mizpah is a special congregation. The warmth of our members is noticeable.

Last month **Rabbi Lewis** talked about the importance of community. I would not be a member of Mizpah if it were not for our community. And my daughters, **Alex** and **Marissa**, would not be a part of our community without that warmth. They both teach for Machanooga. Alex is the Education chair and Marissa is our Youth Group advisor, as well as a Hebrew tutor.

I am so proud to be a part of this congregation, a place for all of us to feel friendship with our fellow members in very different ways.

I feel friendship with my fellow learners at Torah Study. I feel friendship with those members who attend our Jewish Book Club, which meets bi-monthly at various members' homes. [Reform Judaism] has enabled the Jewish people to introduce innovation while preserving tradition, to embrace diversity while asserting commonality, to affirm beliefs without rejecting those who doubt." A MESSAGE FROM YOUR RABBI...

By the time you read this, I will be long gone...to Israel... But please don't worry, I will be back. Israel is my spiritual home. Chattanooga is my home home. As they say, "Home is where your mortgage is...," or something like that. And no matter what, Mizpah is always on my mind. I sincerely hope that what I gain by participating in the Shalom Hartman Institute's Rabbinic Torah Seminar will expand my knowledge and translate directly into some good teaching for all of you. The theme for the program is "The Choosing People: What are the core commitments of modern Judaism and Zionism?" You can count on something or some things from this ten-day course popping up during the High Holy Days, not to mention some reflections on the state of the State of Israel.

I am so excited to be in Jerusalem, to represent Mizpah, to study with great teachers, to learn with colleagues, and to invigorate my rabbinate with new ideas. I thank you for providing me with this opportunity, the time, and professional resources to make it happen. So, the first ten days of my stay in Israel will be devoted to work, but as they say, "All work and no play makes Craig a dull rabbi...," or something like that. Following the seminar, I have a couple days overlap with my brother who will be in Israel at the same time. Would you believe he is also attending a Shalom Hartman seminar for Hillel professionals. What are the odds? Then **Jen** and **Eden** will arrive for two weeks of vacation. Jen and I have each made several visits to the Holy Land, but only once together, for my first year at HUC-JIR, during which we celebrated our second wedding anniversary (mentioned for context to demonstrate just how long ago this was). This will be Eden's first time traveling internationally, aside from a couple Caribbean ports of call during a cruise. We cannot wait to share our memories and experiences with him, and to watch him respond to the incredible sights and sounds as we build new family memories together.

And then of course, many of you remember **Nicole Taege**, who is not our daughter, though she lived with us for a few years, so in many ways is like a daughter, whom we are very close to and proud of, and who is like an older sister to Eden, even though we never filed any paperwork or agreed to take on financial responsibility, and just the same many of her belongings reside in our guest bedroom which we still call Nicole's room. She made Aliyah and teaches high school English in Israel; Nicole will spend time traveling with us, her non-parent parents. It is sure to be a great reunion. We also hope, of course, to connect with some of our past Chattanooga *shelichim*. This is going to be a great trip for many reasons.

We are excited about the number of activities and tours we have planned. Yet I am even more excited about the discoveries and meetings that are impossible to plan for. I wonder what will be the unexpected conversations, like the last time I was Israel and spoke French with a Moroccan Jew who had relatives I used to know in Kansas City? I wonder what will be the new fun place, like the umbrella street leading to Kikar Hamusica with a live music stage surrounded by various cafes? How amazing will it be just to sit on the beaches of Haifa and Tel Aviv and truly feel the Mediterranean sun radiating on our Ashkenazi skin? How much sunscreen will we need and which SPF, and then how much aloe?

The questions go on. But these are things I - and we - have been waiting a long time to ask and find answers to. Most importantly I - and we - cannot wait to come back and tell you all about it. For me, it will probably be at least a sermon or two. For the rest, it will be a shared love for the State of Israel, its land and its people, a place that unites us all as the Jewish homeland.

Again, I thank you for this opportunity. During my absence, I leave you in the hands of wonderful volunteers, for whom I am deeply grateful. Please be nice to them.



MIZPAH ANNUAL MEETING

Sunday, June 25, 2023

Mizpah held their Annual Business meeting on Sunday, June 25th, at 3:00 pm, in the Temple sanctuary. President Vicki Lewis conducted the meeting. Board Secretary Beth Thomas along with Temple Administrator Angela Rickert, signed members in and assured a quorum was present, to include members present plus proxies. All Mizpah committees submitted in advance their annual reports. Minutes from last year's Annual meeting were approved. President Lewis presented her Annual report, citing the excitement of all our volunteers and the profound sense of community in our congregation. Rabbi Lewis issued a stirring commentary on stepping up and speaking out, how numerous small acts can result in large results.

The business of the meeting was conducted, namely the approval of the Temple Annual Budget, created by the Finance Committee, Steve Cohn, Treasurer, Chair, as well as approval of the recommendations of the Nominating Committee, David Israel, Chair. Also following is a report of the Nominating Committee for Officers and Board and new or reappointed members of both the Cemetery Board and the Trustees.






TIME TO MEET ANOTHER NEW MEMBER!

MIZPAH SOCIAL ACTION

Family Promise is a non-profit providing shelter and food for temporarily homeless families. Mizpah partners with St. Paul's Episcopal, providing coverage for seven (7) nights, four (4) times a year. Family Promise now owns its own home off Main Street near Dodds Ave. This is a great program for a parent or parents to bring their school-age children to help. We provide a hot meal, visit a while then go home. Family Promise now employs overnight staff as well as an on-site Social Worker. Their goal is to help these families find permanent shelter and employment.
