TICKETS WILL BE REQUIRED FOR 2016 HIGH HOLY DAY SERVICES



Primarily because of security concerns, the AJ Religious Committee voted to require tickets be presented by members and guests purchasing or receiving reserved seats for the High Holy Days. Attendees will be asked to show their tickets to the

ushers as they enter. Ushers will be directed not to let anyone inside the worship areas unless they have a ticket. Anyone who cannot afford to purchase seat reservations is asked to contact Rabbi Slosberg well in advance of the High Holy Days in order to receive a ticket. No one will be turned away from worship services due to their inability to pay for a seat reservation.
