Jews are prohibited from using or even possessing any *chametz* (*leaven*) *during Pesach*.

We clean our homes and, just to make sure, we also transfer ownership of any remaining chametz to a non-Jew for the duration of Pesach. This form authorizes the rabbi to sell your chametz for Pesach this year.

From noon on the day before Pesach (Monday, April 22, 2024) until 10 pm on the night after Pesach ends (Tuesday, April 30, 2024), the chametz will not belong to you, and you can't eat it.



A Message from your Rabbi, Steven Schwarzman

The Hebrew calendar starts with Nissan, the month of Pesach. (That's why Rosh Hashanah comes in what the Torah refers to as the seventh month, and as I've written previously, that's a nice metaphor for being able to correct our course in life halfway through.)



But why is Nissan the first month? That's when our ancestors left Egypt and set out for the land of their ancestors - a land that they themselves hadn't seen. They had only heard about it from their parents and grand-parents, who heard about it from theirs. All they knew was the slavery of Egypt. The Exodus was the defining moment in the history of the Jewish people, so the Torah tells us that the month of Nissan would thereafter mark the beginning of the Hebrew calendar.

And if the Hebrew calendar starts with Nissan, then it ends with Adar, the month of Purim. So, on the Hebrew calendar it might make sense for Bettina and I to have timed our return to Israel after Purim.

But as it works out, we will be here in Edmonton for Pesach, and then set out to our new/old home in Jerusalem. Yes, at the seders this year - likely the last time we will ever do two of them - we will say *Next Year in Jerusalem*, but with renewed meaning this time. And then, with the gift that is the modern state of Israel, we will get on an airplane (or two) after Pesach and fly there. It is a dream that Jews were generally prevented from fulfilling for 2,000 years...and a dream that is strikingly easy to fulfill today. We will return to our homeland, and to the city that we have thought of as home since we met there.

Perhaps one day you will join us, and of course we'll also be delighted to see you when you visit.

We leave with warm feelings for the people of Beth Shalom and the Edmonton Jewish community and for the many non-Jews we have met who go out of their way to support the Jewish people in true friendship, especially in these dark times of war. We leave you knowing that there remains work to do here, and trust that others will do that work faithfully in their way and in their time as we have tried to do in ours. We made it through the pandemic as a community, and that is something we can all be proud of.

In the Mishnah's tractate Avot, Rabbi Yehoshua ben Perahia teaches: אֶשָה לְךָּ חָבָר

Appoint for yourself a rabbi, and acquire for yourself a friend.

I want to thank you for entrusting me with the pleasant work of being your rabbi and for allowing me to acquire your friendship, as you have mine.

Next year in Jerusalem, and may we all go from strength to strength!

The costs associated with manufacturing **Yahrzeit Plaques** and maintaining the memorial boards in the sanctuary continue to climb. In turn, Edmonton Beth Shalom adjusts the fees we assess for the purchase of a yahrzeit plaque from time-to-time.

In 2022, we began inviting members who have purchased a yahrzeit plaque on our newest memorial board to make a \$180 donation to reserve one spot adjacent to the plaque just purchased, so that the only fees owing will be the cost for casting and shipping the additional plaque.

Going forward, in the interest of aligning the fee our office assesses for the purchase of yahrzeit plaques with the reservation fee introduced in 2022, Edmonton Beth Shalom will separate the fee assessed for the purchase of the plaques into two portions:

- The current cost of manufacturing each plaque casting and shipping.
- A \$180.00 donation to Edmonton Beth Shalom Congregation to help offset the costs of maintaining the memorial boards in the sanctuary.

A charitable receipt will be issued for each portion of the fee.

Beth Shalom understands that some members may be unable to pay their annual dues in full.

No one will be denied membership at Beth Shalom by virtue of financial

hardship, and anyone who seeks a reduction of membership dues, in whole or in part, is invited to make an application for a reduction with the Beth Shalom office at 780-488-6333 ext.301, or by email at:

info@e-bethshalom.org.

All requests for fee adjustments are kept strictly confidential.

There is a 10% discount available to seniors, if needed.

Payment Method: Membership dues can be paid at one time or dues may be paid in installments. When membership dues are paid in installments, payment-in-full is required by July 1, unless other arrangements have been made.

If, however, you do not have a Hebrew name for this person or they are not Jewish then an English name will do. If a name on the list should no longer be listed, can you kindly let us know so we can remove the individual from our list?

Due to the Canadian privacy of information laws we require that congregants get permission from the ill person(s) to have their name(s) read aloud from the Bimah on Shabbat.
