For details, please see below:

• Who should come to services?

Anyone who is healthy and would like to come is welcome.

• Who should NOT come to services?

Anyone with a health condition that puts them at risk, anyone who lives with someone with such a condition, and anyone who is not healthy.

• Do I need to wear a mask?

Yes. If you don't have your own, we will give you one when you come in, right after you sanitize your hands.

• Can I have an aliya or other honour?

Yes and no. Aliyot will be as usual, but we are limiting other honours to minimize close contact.

• Can I sit with my friends in my usual seat?

Unfortunately, no. You can sit with your own family. Friends need to keep two meters apart. Also, we have blocked rows of pews to allow for the necessary distancing, so your favourite seat may not be available.

• What has the synagogue done to sanitize the building?

Yuri has disinfected all surfaces in the sanctuary, all doorknobs and handrails, and other surfaces.

• How long will things stay like this?

We don't know, of course. We will adjust what we do based on guidelines from the Province and from our medical experts.
