# **OUR CZECHOSLOVAKIAN TORAH**

A Bridge From The Past To The Future

In early June, 1981 I read a small article in Newsday that told how the Suffolk Jewish Center in Deer Park had just acquired a Czechoslovakian Torah. I remembered reading something about these Torahs, so I called their chairwoman at the Jewish Center and asked for information. She referred me to the Westminster Synagogue in London, England. I then spoke to Rabbi Berger and our Temple president, Ed Fried,

and asked for permission to pursue acquiring such a Torah for Temple Avodah. Permission was granted and I wrote to Westminster Synagogue.

I learned that Westminster Synagogue was the custodian of 1,564 Torah Scrolls that had been discovered in a warehouse after World War II. These Scrolls had been stolen by the Nazis from destroyed synagogues all over Czechoslovakia and were to be displayed in a museum showing artifacts of an "extinct society." Although most of Czechoslovakian Jewry did not survive, 1,564 of their Torahs did. The Synagogue asked for a small honorarium to help with their expenses of housing, classifying, examining and repairing these torahs (when possible).

I immediately sent out a flier asking for 60 checks in the amount of \$18.00 (chai). I indicated that I would *not* print a list of donors, and I would *not* send out thank you letters. This would be a very private mitzvah where only the donors would know, and

that was what was important. I received 70 checks. I immediately sent the money to London in August of 1981. In December, 1981 I received a phone call from British Airways to come down and pick up our Scroll. I truly cannot describe the emotion that we (Ros, our children Steve and Amy, and I) felt

when we opened the wooden crate and saw the Torah for the first time. Our eyes filled with tears as we recited the 'Shehecheyanu.'

On April 23, 1982, Yom Ha-Shoah, the Czechoslovakian Torah was rededicated outdoors at our Holocaust memorial. I was given the honor of the first aliyah in its new home, an honor that I truly cherish

But all we knew was that the Scroll was written in the early 19th century and originally came from a little town called Telc. After again communicating with the Westminster Synagogue, we were referred to Dr. Fred Hahn, a world-respected scholar of the history of Czechoslovakian Jewry. On April 19,1982, Yom Ha-Shoah, Dr. and Mrs. Hahn were our guests. At services that evening Dr. Hahn described the history and fate of the Czechoslovakian Jews, and told us whatever information he had been able to glean about Telc from his overflowing files.

I placed all the correspondence in a book that I gave into the custody of our Rabbi. It is interesting to note that the Westminster Synagogue does not give the Scroll to the temple or synagogue. The Scroll is placed on permanent loan. It is of emotional and sentimental consideration and is used in Synagogues and Temples for religious and educational uses.

I find it emotionally overwhelming that our Torah, which was part of a Jewish community that started in 1426, and that no longer exists after the holocaust, has found a loving home in Oceanside, New

Composer Spotlight: Nava Tehila

Welcome to the first entry in my Composer Spotlight series! We all have our favorite tunes for Shabbat and holiday prayers, but where do those melodies come from? You may be surprised to discover a typical weekly service at Temple Avodah includes music spanning hundreds of years of history and Jewish communities across the globe. In this series, I will be introducing you to some of the fascinating and diverse composers who created the music we sing each week.

This month's composer spotlight features the contemporary Jerusalem-based group, Nava Tehilah. Melodies by Nava Tehila that we sing at Temple Avodah include:

Nava Tehilah is a unique ensemble of musicians that composes original Jewish music as well as leading innovative and experimental prayer experiences. The group was founded by Rabbi Ruth Gan Kagan, who grew up in the modern Orthodox Religious Zionist community in Israel. After graduating from Hebrew University with a degree in law, Gan Kagan moved her family to Colorado to study with Rabbi Zalman Schachter-Shalomi. Reb Zalman, as his students refer to him, is often credited with founding Jewish renewal, a deinstitutionalized movement which emphasizes mysticism, egalitarianism and ecstatic spiritual practices. Interested in using music as a path to spiritual experience, Rabbi Gan Kagan teamed up with young musicians Daphna Rosenberg and Yoel Sykes to form Nava Tehila after her ordination in 2004.

Nava Tehila facilitates a monthly Kabbalat Shabbat service in Jerusalem that draws attendees spanning the spectrum of Jewish identity from secular to Orthodox. They are especially dedicated to introducing secular-identified Israelis to Jewish prayer. In addition, they travel around the world appearing in concert and as guest leaders at congregations.

The group's music and prayer leadership style draws inspiration from Buddhist chant and Chassidic nigun (melody). Many of their compositions, including all the examples above, employ a two-part AB melodic structure and limited text, usually a single verse or sentence, and build energy through repetition. Through this technique, their music creates a trancelike, meditative effect or a joyous, ecstatic atmosphere. Because of this emphasis on repetition, Nava Tehila's kabbalat shabbat services can last up to two hours, which most attendees spend on their feet dancing.

Pick up a parenting book and it will usually have a chapter on the importance of 'cultivating an attitude of gratitude' with your children. The Rabbis of our tradition recognized long ago that Hakarat Hatov - recognizing the good in our lives - could have a significant impact on how we see ourselves in the world. While it's true that based on their nature, some people see the 'glass half full' while others see it 'half empty,' the practice of hakarat hatov involves stepping back and taking the time to acknowledge what is positive in our lives. And like anything else in our lives that we want to improve on, it requires consistent practice.

In school, we always look for opportunities to encourage our students to express gratitude. Certainly, when we recite blessings, i.e. over challah/grape juice, lighting Shabbat or holiday candles, when we experience something new or welcome a new holiday, we look at these experiences through a special prism. We are teaching the Modeh(ah) Ani prayer, which is said in the morning, before you even get out of bed, and expresses gratitude that we have woken up to face a day of possibilities. It provides a marker to start our day, which also ends with the recitation of the Shema.

This month, most of us will celebrate Thanksgiving. While a secular holiday, it provides us and our families with a chance to share what we appreciate in our lives. I found 'A Thanksgiving Prayer' that I will share at my table this year:

For the laughter of the children,
For my own life breath,
For the abundance of food on this table
For the ones who prepared this sumptuous feast,
For the roof over our heads.
The clothes on our backs,

For our health, And our wealth of blessings,

For this opportunity to celebrate with family and friends,

For the freedom to pray these words without fear, in any language, in any faith In this great country, whose landscape is as vast and beautiful as her inhabitants.

Thank You, God, for giving us all these. Amen.

AND SHORTLY AFTER A COPY OF THIS SERMON-"THE PUREST DEMOCRACY," WAS PRINTED IN THE TIME MAGAZINE ... AND IT WAS AIRED ON RADIO MANY TIMES. ... AND IT WAS EVEN READ INTO THE CONGRESSIONAL RECORD GITTELSONN, THE ISTRARD TO SERVE AS A MARCHE CHANAL RECEIVED 3 CITATIONS FOR BRAVELY UNDER FIRE.

ON THE 50 TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE SERMON, AND SHORTLY BEFORE HIS DEATH, GITTELSOHN SAID, "I DETEN WONDERED WHETHER ANY ONE WOULD HAVE HEARD OF THIS IND JIMA SPEECH, IF IT HAD NOT BEEN FOR THE BIGOTED ATTEMPT TO BANIT.

As a tribute to the late Art Cooperman's z'l talent and contributions to Temple Avodah, his cartoons and commentary will continue to be run in Temple Topics.

My God, My God,
May these things never end,
The sand and the sea,

Similar to prayer in the synagogue, the communal nature of the hike enhanced all of our efforts to contemplate our lives and priorities.




