Dear Chaverim/Chaverot-

The basic definition of Community is having a camaraderie with others where one feels included. If a person doesn't feel comfortable in a community, they won't stay. A Temple depends on it's community in order to grow.

In Torah our first role models are Sara and Abraham. Once when there were three strangers coming near their tent Abraham rushed out to greet them. They were offered to rest while he and Sara provided them with food and water. When the strangers left Abraham even walked them away from the tent to assure they found their way to where they were going. Genesis 18:1-8. In this passage it's very clear of the importance in creating a welcoming environment especially to those we don't know. It's felt the three guests were actually angels sent by G-d. However, it was known that Sara and Abraham treated every stranger the same way...as being worth the attention. Some scholars feel it was Sara's influence on Abraham to open all sides of their tent to be able to see all who approached. This way no one was overlooked and missed. In Midrash a connection is made between the holiday of Sukkot, Sara and Abraham's hospitality and the three angel guests. It was thought that part of their preparations for the guests was to shelter them by building the first Sukkah.

What would our Jewish communities look like if every person who came through our doors were greeted in the manner Sara and Abraham did for their guests? How would our schools and places of work look like if everyone was treated as being worthy of attention? How would the world look if we treated even those who seem so different from us with Chesed (loving kindness?

In psalms Chapter 104 it says, "G-d spreads a tent over us (all) with light like a garment." Some scholars interpret this to mean it is our obligation to emulate G-d's request to bring that light to others. In our homes, Temples and everywhere we go we have the ability to greet others making them feel a part of something greater than ourselves.

Sara and Abraham taught us we all belong equally in their tent. We can learn from them and

immolate their kindness. By welcoming the stranger we only make our communities stronger. There is no greater blessing than to provide comfort,

inclusion and belonging to others. It's really that simple.

May all who come through our doors feel welcomed and apart of OUR community.

What do you want from your Temple?

I asked this question in my Rosh Hashanah speech, and now is the time to start really thinking about it. We're back in our post-High Holy Days groove. Our committees are in full swing to make the 2023-24 year a great one. But there is one thing missing – you. Well, a lot of you. Some of you reading this do a significant amount of work for the Temple, and I don't think we can thank you enough.

Speaking of people that do a significant amount for the Temple, I want to acknowledge our office staff of Andrea and Jill, who put this very email digest together, and our maintenance team of Fredy and Eli. All four of them are responsible for making Temple Avodah the second home it is to a lot of us. To paraphrase Rabbi on Rosh Hashanah, they are the glue that hold this place together.

This still leaves the question that I started with – what do you want from your Temple? What would you do if you were in charge? What would make you say, "I can't wait for this Temple event!"? We have a good amount of people that are on the board or volunteer for committees, but without new ideas, and new people to help implement them, we can get stuck in a rut.

There are certain things we do annually. We've just held our welcome back BBQ - a little late, yes, but we wanted to make sure a lot of people could come. We'll have our Chanukah party on December 8, our Purim Schpiel in March, and our Memorial Day/end of year BBQ as well. But... there's always more. We always have more events, whether sponsored by Sisterhood, Men's Club, the Fundraising committee or others. Some events are in the Temple, like the upcoming Combating Antisemitism forum on October 16. Others aren't, like a lot of the events that are planned for Mitzvah Day – and all of these things are sponsored by our Social Action committee. This doesn't mean that any of these things will appeal to you, but we hope they do. The fact is that we're a congregation with a lot of diverse interests. We'd love to hear some of yours.

Lastly, I hope none of you missed Rosh Hashanah or Yom Kippur services, whether you streamed it or watched from home. All of the services were incredibly meaningful, and I was incredibly honored to call the Shofar. I will admit - my back finally started to hurt after sitting on the bimah for all of those days! Rabbi Shai did warn me to bring a cushion, so I have no one to blame but myself.

That all being said, please ask yourself the question that tops this article. See if you can answer it and let us know!



We were so happy to welcome our students back to school on Monday, 9/11, and Tuesday, 9/12 - both familiar and many new faces. As is our custom, we start each day gathering as a kehillah (community) in the Garden Room. We celebrate a 'delayed' Kabbalat Shabbat with lighting of Shabbat candles, grape juice, and challah, reciting the corresponding blessings. In keeping with the Rosh Hashanah tradition of eating sweet things, we dipped apples in honey and ate round challah. A few students even tried the pomegranates which contain 613 seeds, corresponding to the 613 mitzvot in the Torah. Rabbi Shai joined us to blow not one, but several different shofars. Our younger students enthusiastically voted on which shofar sound they liked the best. We discussed the significance of the ram's horn (a reminder of the binding of Isaac by his father Abraham and the ram that was substituted in his place) as well as the shofar blowing serving as an 'alarm clock' or wake up call to do better in the year ahead.

Our 7th graders performed their first mitzvah of the school year by attaching flyers to the bags that were distributed during the holidays to collect food for Hatzilu, the local food bank in Baldwin (see photo). Our K-4 th graders participated in a 'mock' tashlich ceremony. Each student was asked to think about something they would like to improve upon. The older students wrote this down on special 'spy' paper that disappeared when thrown in our makeshift 'pond' (my grandson's blowup pool) while our younger students threw in Cheerios (see photo). The Jewish holidays offer us so many opportunities to celebrate the joys of being Jewish. Each holiday contains special meaning and excitement, and we try to envelop our children in the ritual and spirit of each hag (holiday).






