Sept. 2023

Every year between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur Jews spend a lot of time talking about forgiveness. We are familiar with the gesture of apologizing to those we have wronged. But, Is it mandatory? Can't we just ask G-d for forgiveness and leave out the "middle person"? And by apologizing does that mean we can send an e-mail? How about the same e-mail to everyone? Where is the rule book and what does it say exactly about forgiveness?

Let's first look at the Hebrew word, Selichot. In Mishnah it is referenced to as the prayers for forgiveness which features encouragements that end with "He will answer us". The idea being G-d is compassionate and always understanding (from G-d's 13 Attributes). These prayers were put into a special service in the ninth century by King David when he realized the Temple would be destroyed. In Leviticus 16:30 it says: For on this day G-d shall effect atonement for you to cleanse you. Before G-d, you shall be cleansed from all of your sins..."

The Torah is filled with stories of people who have hurt their loved ones and then returned to ask for forgiveness. There is Cain and Abel, Jacob and Esav and Joseph and his brothers to name just a few. It's nothing new. So, how does this "I'm sorry" process work?

Jewish law distinguishes between two forms of "sin". 1. Bein Adom Lamakom (between an individual and G-d) AND 2. Bein Adom Lechavoro (between two individuals). When it's between two individuals then the process of Teshuva is required as mentioned by Maimonides. It's basically your very first twelve step program but in this case only four steps. These steps requires self-evaluation and self improvement. They are: 1. Recognize and stop 2. Confess the action 3. Regret and evaluate the impact 4. Promise to not do again by sincerely apologizing to the person hurt.

When we apologize in person it can feel more challenging but it makes us more sincere in our apology. The process is therapeutic when used in this way. Today, there is a lot of supporting research to show how the process of forgiveness is psychologically beneficial. To think Jews have been doing this therapy for centuries...

As Rosh Hashanah approaches I wish each and every one of you a sweet year.

May 5784 bring lots of nachus, simcha's and good health! שנה טובה

This summer, amid all the hype and publicity around the "Barbie" movie, something caught my eye. It wasn't the touted 1.18 billion dollars grossed worldwide or the myriads of discussions about the various messages of the movie. It was something said by its writer and director, Greta Gerwig, in a New York Times article. Gerwig said she wanted her film to make "people feel like I did at Shabbat dinner. I want them to get blessed." (Wow, I didn't see that coming!) Interestingly, Gerwig is not Jewish. However, she grew up with close family friends who were observant Jews. Gerwig was often a guest at their Shabbat table and would be included in the father's Blessing of the Children based on the priestly blessing that was recited by the Kohanim (High Priests) which asks for God's blessing for protection, kindness, and peace. She elaborates so beautifully: "I remember feeling the sense of whatever your wins and losses were for the week, whatever you did or you didn't do, when you come to this table, your value has nothing to do with that. I put my hand over you, and I bless you as a child of God at this table. And that's your value. I remember feeling so safe in that and feeling so, like enough."

My family came late to reciting the Blessings of the Children as part of our weekly Shabbat Seder, the Friday night table service. When I first introduced this blessing to my three pre-teen daughters, their eyes rolled in that inimitable teen way. My husband, Elliot, smartly advised them to 'humor' me and they did, week after week, until the ritual became familiar and natural. For me, invoking this traditional blessing including "May you be like Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah", our ancestral mothers and their positive characteristics is not only a tie to our past but an opportunity to remind my daughters that I love them, and they are special. When sons-in-law joined the family, we added the blessing for sons that Jacob bestowed on his grandsons, Ephraim and Menashe (Joseph's sons): "May God make you like Ephraim and Menashe," who maintained their Jewish identity growing up as Egyptian nobleman and are also noted as being the few siblings in the Torah without rivalry.

As our school year begins, my hope is that all our students will feel safe, accepted and seen and that our school kehillah (community) provides them with a space in which they can thrive and flourish.

DID YOU KNOW... THAT THE GERMANS, MEETING LITTLE RESISTANCE IN THE INVASION OF DENMARK IN OCTOBER, 1940, ALLOWED THE DANES TO SELF-GOVERN THEMSELVES. HOWEVER, BY MID 1943, AFTER SUFFERING SEVERE LOSSES IN NORTH AFRICA AND STALINGRAD, AND WITH THE DANISH RESISTANCE FIGHTERS MORE AGGRESIVE IN THEIR SABOTAGE ACTIVITIES, THE GERMANS TOOK FULL CONTROL OF THE DANISH GOUT. UNTIL THEN, THE 7500 OR SO JEWS IN DENMARK HAD FEW PROBLEMS, BUT NOW THEIR LIVES WE'VE IN JEOPARDY.

PLANS HAD BEEN ALREADY FORMULATED TO ROUND UP
THE JEWS ON OCT. I (THE 2 DAY OF ROCH HASHAWA IN 1943)
AND TRANSPORT THEM BY TROOP SHIPS AND BUSES TO
CONCENTRATION CAMPS THROUGHOUT EUROPE.

IT WAS ON SEP. 11 TH WHEN GEORG DUCKWITZ, A GERMAN NAVAL ATTACHE HEARD OF THIS, AND HE IMMEDIATELY FLEW TO BERLIN TO SEE IF HE HALT THE DEPORTATION OF THE JEWS. MEETING WITH NO SUCCESS, A WEEK LATER HE FLEW TO STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN, OSTENSIBLY DISCUSSING GERMAN SHIPPING, BUT CLANDESTINELY MEETING WITH SWEDISH PRIME MINISTER HANGSON IN HOPES THAT SWEDEN WOULD TAKE IN THE DANISH JEWISH REFUGEES. UNSURE OF ANY SUCCESS IN SWEDEN, DUCKWITZ (WHO HAD

GEORG F. DUCKWITZ SEP 27:1904-FEB.16.1973

GREAT FEAR OF THE GESTAPO) RETURNED TO COPENHAGEN, AND CONTACTED THE SOCIAL DEMOCRAT LEADER HANS HEDTOFT, AND TOLD HIM TO WARN THE JEWISH LEADERS AND RABBI MARCUS MELCHIOR OF THE IMMINENT DANGER TO THE JEWISH POPULATION.

IT WAS THEN WHEN THE DANISH PEOPLE "ROSE TO THE OCCASSION", HIDING ALMOST TODO JEWS...AND THEN GRADUALLY SMUGGLED THEM ACROSS THE DRESUND STRAITS INTO SAFETY IN SWEDEN.

BOTH DUCKWITZ AND THE DANISH RESISTANCE HAVE BEEN HONDRED AT YAD VASHEM AS "RIGHTEOUS AMONG THE NATIONS!"






