Iris Fuchs, Artist and Cultural Liaison

In June, Abigail Kopen, a summer intern at Catherine Kasper Place, called the Synagogue office inquiring whether there was interest among the Jewish community in sponsoring an Israeli wheelbarrow as part of a multicultural public art event called "The World on Wheels Garden Project". The project would showcase the rich and diverse cultures living in Fort Wayne through beautiful wheelbarrows being designed by local artists based upon conversations with cultural liaisons. After spending time on display in the community, the wheelbarrows would be auctioned during the International Blast on September 29th. Funds raised through the project would support refugee programs through Catherine Kasper Place, whose Fresh Food Initiative provides urban farming training and opportunities for refugees, immigrants, and asylees to grow culturally-appropriate food for themselves and for market.

Rabbi Kornspan went right to work and approached the Harry W. Salon Foundation, on behalf of the Jewish community in Fort Wayne, and received the necessary grant. Our talented congregant Iris Fuchs, a native of Israel, enthusiastically agreed to be the artist and cultural liaison for the wheelbarrow. Inside the wheelbarrow, Iris fashioned a clay sculpture of the Western Wall, a glass mosaic of the Mediterranean Sea (complete with shells and fish), a painted traditional prayer shawl, and a clay sculpture of Abraham looking into the starry night sky with Hashem's promise written above in Hebrew. Iris painted the outside of the wheelbarrow to reflect the sandy beaches and desert places in Israel and sprinkled throughout the sand: pomegranates; kova tembel hats; Sabra cactuses; and the tablets received by Moses. Between the handles are clay-sculpted olive branches and a gold menorah. Around the inside and outside edges of the wheelbarrow are painted Mediterranean-style decorative borders. The wheelbarrow was on display at B'nai Jacob and The Temple throughout the September High Holidays. (To see color photos of the wheelbarrow, visit B'nai Jacob's Facebook page.)
