As was announced at the annual meeting in June, Jaki Schreier has been named to be the next Executive Director of the Fort Wayne Jewish Federation. She will begin work September 1 and will take over the leadership role October 1.

It may be an old cliché, but Jaki truly needs no introduction to the Fort Wayne Jewish community. She has been a very active volunteer since she and her family – husband, Eric, and children, Abe, Mallory, and Brooklyn – moved to Fort Wayne in the 1990s. The Schreier family are members of Congregation Achduth Vesholom, Congregation B’nai Jacob, and the Fort Wayne Jewish Federation.

At the Temple, Jaki has been a religious school teacher and religious school chair, a board trustee, and has just completed a three-year term as president. She also has served multiple roles with Federation: as a board member; campaign chair; and, of course, as president. She has attended four United Jewish Communities General Assemblies, as well as a UJC-sponsored mission to the Former Soviet Union and Israel.

Now Jaki is ready to step up from volunteer to professional and become the next person to lead the Federation.

With a bachelor’s degree in sociology and business and a master’s degree in human resource management, Jaki has the educational background and the professional experience for the job. She is also in the process of earning an Executive Certificate in Strategic Planning for Non-Profits at IPFW. But what sets her apart is her passion for Jewish causes and her eagerness to serve and strengthen the Fort Wayne Jewish community.

Jaki says, “I am truly honored and delighted to be serving as the next Executive Director of the Fort Wayne Jewish Federation. I have had opportunities to see the amazing work done by our Federation for those Jews in the community and the value we have in the community as a whole.

Norman Kempler used an expression a number of years ago that has really stuck with me: ‘In order to do good, we must do WELL!’ This expression dictates the importance and relevance of ‘Tikkun Olam,’ or repairing the world.

Our Federation, I believe, has the chance to really DO well and make a lasting impact on Jews and our community if we persistently do GOOD.

I have had the chance to observe many instances of Tikkun Olam organized and carried out by countless Jewish Federations around the nation, and even around the world! IF we all glance at who we are and what made us US, we can see the impact our community has had on us and on our family. I am excited to put my energy and enthusiasm into something so meaningful and relevant.”

August is just around the corner and that means that Sunday School registration is just around the corner and that means it is time for you to enroll your student in the S.K.I.P. program.

Established in 1984, by the Federation in partnership with Achduth Vesholom and B’nai Jacob, and revised in November, 1999, the program has provided a savings vehicle for many families and has helped make a trip to Israel a reality for so many of our youth. The Federation portion of the savings plan is provided by income from the Federation Endowment Fund. Family membership is defined as a gift to the most recent Federation Annual campaign.

The Federation, for each year a child participates in S.K.I.P., contributes \$200 per year per child of current Federation members enrolled in the program. This is matched by a Congregational contribution of \$75 per year. Your parent contribution on behalf of each participating child is \$175 or more per year, per participating child. Family membership is defined as a gift to the most recent Federation Annual Campaign.

The program is available to local youth enrolled in their respective congregational religious schools in grades 1-10.

Each S.K.I.P. account is matched by a \$180 gift from the LORRY AND HY GOLDENBERG BIRTHRIGHT FUND. ☆
