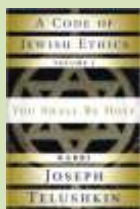

## IT'S ALL ABOUT ETHICS

Dear B'nai Jacob family,

When Paula Adams and Ruth Minkoff asked if I would offer a class using Rabbi Joseph Telushkin's book, *A Code Of Jewish Ethics*, I was excited. After all, every book that Rabbi Telushkin writes is an absolute gem, not only because of excellent content, but also by the manner he elucidates the Torah's teachings in a very clear and enjoyable read.

Imagine what a pleasant surprise we all had by the tremendous turn out and the fantastic discussions that occurred! We are setting this special "book club" up in a way that promotes sharing and discussion. The study guide that I downloaded and sent to you covers many areas that allow this to easily happen.

Some of the ideas we covered from the study guide included: Rabbi Telushkin's teaching that "in the absence of G-d, all that people can express about morality are opinions." "Unfortunately, the belief that reason will lead people to morality is itself unreasonable."

"G-d's central demand of human beings is to act ethically."

We spoke as well about those who practice a religiosity centering around faith and ritual, yet miss the necessity for following an ethical way of life! And, we even entertained a question which went into the realm of the "stuff" from which science fiction movies are made. What if we could time travel and find Hitler before he rises to power? What if we had the opportunity to eliminate him at the early stage of his life? Would we be acting ethically or just the opposite?

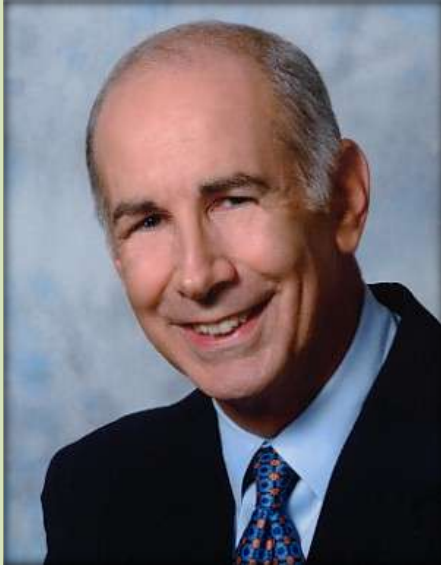

He has been true to his Jewish roots throughout his public career. He hosted a weekly Jewish affairs program on NBC in Chicago for a decade. In addition, he produced and hosted telethons, videos and events for the Chicago Federation and other charitable and non-profit organizations.

Mike speaks throughout the country on topics of Jewish interest. He is yeshiva-educated with a bachelor's degree from Brandeis and a master's degree from Syracuse University's Newhouse School of Communications.

You can read the papers, scour the Internet, and watch all the TV channels. But...there is no way for you to know *what isn't being reported*.

For more than 40 years, Fort Wayne native MARK LAVIE reported from Israel, the Palestinian areas, Egypt and surrounding countries for NPR, NBC, CBC and The Associated Press. Though he was based mostly in Israel, he spent two crucial years in Cairo covering Arab Spring. After leaving the profession this year, embittered and frustrated, he published a book, *Broken Spring*, to explain what the West doesn't understand, what the media don't report, and why.

He'll tell all in his lecture, illustrated by his photographs taken on assignment. You'll never see the Mideast in the same way again.
