From the Rabbi's Desk

For many of you reading this month's message, this will be old news. At our CBI Board of Trustees meeting this past June, I announced my plans to retire at the end of June 2025. My contract with Congregation Beth Israel

requires a minimum of 18 months' notice, allowing plenty of time for CBI to plan for its future. By my having made the decision now, CBI will have even more time to prepare for this significant change.

To answer some of the questions I have already been asked, yes, Susan and I plan to remain on the Monterey Peninsula. We love our home, our community, and our many friends here. We will continue as members of CBI, and I am committed to supporting our congregation and the new rabbi as much as possible. Wanting to support whoever the congregation hires, I will participate as much or as little as the clergy team requests. I certainly do not want to interfere with the new rabbi's role at CBI.

And, yes, it is time for me to step down as the senior Rabbi of Congregation Beth Israel. By the end of June 2025, I will have served CBI for 31 years and worked as a rabbi for 38 years. Over my time on the Monterey Peninsula, I have officiated at approximately 300 student B'nai Mitzvah and 150 weddings and conducted over half the funerals of those people buried in Gan HaZikaron, CBI's Jewish cemetery. Joining with so many of you in these sacred life cycle moments has been most meaningful for me.

Since arriving in Carmel, I have shared approximately 1600 sermons, written 360 Shofar messages, and led thousands of religious school programs. I do not know how many candy bars I have handed out for birthdays and anniversaries or how many bagels I have picked up for Shabbat studies and Sunday school snacks.

Nothing will change over the next two years. And, starting in July 2025, hopefully you will see me often on the tennis court or at the gym or walking around our beautiful trails with Susan. Maybe you will read a published book containing Moshe the Monkey stories for each Torah parsha. I pray that, working with CBI's leadership, together we will make this transition a healthy process with minimal stress for all of us. Amen.



From Cantor Alisa

In the month of August, our Jewish calendar helps us transition from mourning the losses suffered by the Jewish people throughout our history to comfort, hope, and rebuilding. Our ritual calendar is also meant to help

us reflect on the story of our lives, providing meaning, hope after loss, and rebuilding after destruction. No matter how distant we may feel from a world filled with justice and compassion, we are instructed to act justly, to walk a path of blessing and gratitude, and to remember we are not alone.

The month of Elul (which begins on August 19 this year on our Gregorian calendar) offers us the opportunity to tap into this knowing more fully, to feel that we are supported and loved by a "never-ending love." The Rabbis say that E-L-U-L is an acronym for Ani I'dodi v'dodi li—"I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine" which is a verse from the Song of Songs, the love poetry of the Tanakh. The month of Elul is a time for opening up more fully to the truth that we are a part of a love that holds this world together, that we are interdependent, and that our existence depends on forces beyond ourselves. When we take time to pause in this knowing, how can we not feel a sense of awe and wonder? This is the work of t'shuvah, the practice of turning and returning to a deeper sense of connection, to gratitude, to longing, and to who we really are. This is the preparation for Yamim Nora'im—the Days of Awe, our High Holy Day season.

On Friday nights during the month of *Elul*, beginning with *erev Shabbat* on August 18 and continuing through the High Holy Days, CBI will use a special prayerbook, the *Mishkan HaLev* (sanctuary of the heart), to prime and prepare us for the approaching Days of Awe. May all our *Shabbat* gatherings throughout *Elul* bring us a deeper sense of connection and well-being, grounded in a love that reveals itself in every breath we take.

Family Shabbat Outdoor Services

(CBI's playground will be open for children who may need to play quietly during parts of our service.) Be sure to dress warmly (or in layers) as the evenings can get chilly. After our *Erev Shabbat* service, we will enjoy an *oneg* in our social hall. If possible, please come 10-15 minutes early to take a few chairs down to the basketball court. And, at the close of our service, we hope that many volunteers will help to return our chairs and *siddurim* (prayer books) to the social hall.

the Congregation, and handle various other matters that ensure the continued smooth operation of our beloved CBI. This year's meeting will take place at CBI on **Sunday**, **August 6 at 11 am.** In person attendance will be rewarded with a delicious nosh.

Our agenda includes "State of the Synagogue" reports by Rabbi Bruce and leaders of our Congregation, and we will also honor some of our dedicated volunteers. Our president, Malina Breaux, will discuss our rabbinical transition process and present plans for exciting building improvements.

Did you know that CBI is also a founding member of the Interfaith Outreach Council, which operates the Joining Hands Benefit Shop at 26358 Carmel Rancho Lane in Carmel? Joining Hands is staffed almost exclusively by volunteers and, from the store's proceeds in 2022, donated almost \$130,000 last year to organizations that provide resources for our homeless population and work to reduce homelessness in Monterey County. Joining Hands is open every day except Sunday from 10:00 am-4:00 pm and is always looking for volunteers to staff two- or three-hour shifts.



Meet Louise and Riddle Riddell-Kaufman

Louise and Riddle arrived on the Monterey Peninsula from Ithaca, NY in 1984 just in time to celebrate their first wedding anniversary. Joining the synagogue was one of the first things they did upon their arrival.

Within a few months, Louise was driving out of the fog in Pacific Grove into the sunshine for her job as the Executive Director of the Carmel Valley Community Youth Center. They fell in love with the Village community and bought a home there a few years later.

When the Congregation walked the Torahs from Park Ave to our current home in Carmel Valley in 1987 their son Jeremy participated from a snuggly. That year, Louise established a Cradle Roll group for the large number of babies of the B'nai Mitzvah class of 2000.

Louise and Riddle have participated in the Jewish Food Festival from the beginning. Louise co-chaired the Children's Area for many years and then chaired the entire event a few times. Recently she has overseen the runners and checked in the volunteers. Riddle worked in the coffee booth, and then as a bus driver. He was soon recruited to help with setup and tear down of the "Village", working with the sound engineers during the festival itself.

Louise helped to create the playground behind the synagogue building, a requirement to create a Jewish preschool. Shalom Preschool opened in 1995 just in time for their daughter Anya to attend.

Louise chaired the CBI dinner/ auction for a couple of years, served on the board of directors as the Youth Trustee for a short period, and later served on the Social Action committee. In addition, she volunteered on a local Domestic Violence Crisis line and served as a YWCA board member. She earned a certification in mediation.

In 1993, Louise began co-teaching in CBI's PreK/Kindergarten Religious School class. In 1997 she was asked to step in as CBI's Director of Education. She developed as an educator through various conferences, eventually earning her MA in Jewish Education from HUC in 2015. She retired in 2020.

As an initial member of the Women's Torah Study group, Louise participated in monthly meetings, annual Women's Seders, and a few weekend retreats with this group. Currently she is a member of the Women's Mussar Group.

Both Louise and Riddle became Adult B'nai Mitzvah. Riddle formally chose Judaism in 2003 to receive an Aliyah at Louise's Bat Mitzvah. He became a Bar Mitzvah a year later.

Meanwhile, Riddle moved between computer companies due to the industry's volatile nature. He was very lucky in avoiding the Silicon Valley commute or move that faced many of his colleagues. He retired in 2015. He practiced Aikido, earning his black belt in 2000. Playing electric bass, Riddle joined several musicians to create a band, The DoDads (the Dads that Do), which has since morphed into The UnDecided.

Riddle is a founding and current board member of JCM United (Jews, Muslims, Christians Unitied) and is a weekly participant at Abraham's Tent (the soup kitchen run by JCM). He enjoys projects around the house and researching Al and other topics that catch his interest.

Louise is a member of two non-CBI bookclubs, a study group with her nephew, and about six monthly Zoom social meetings with friends and family. She also participates in the weekly Biblical Hebrew Class and a weekly exercise class on Zoom (with Riddle)

They have recently purchased a camper van and are looking forward to camping as they travel to music festivals and to Colorado to visit children and grandchildren.




