A Vision for the Future of the Congregation Beth Israel Property and Building

With much anticipation and excitement, I am excited to preview the upcoming rejuvenation plans for our beloved Congregation Beth Israel. As we stand on the threshold of a new chapter, our intention remains to cherish the past while building for the future.

To ensure that our restoration captures the building's original essence, we've re-engaged the very architectural minds who brought it to life: the Paul Davis Partnership Architects & Planners. This decision is rooted in our desire to maintain continuity while infusing modern enhancements.

A project of this magnitude requires substantial financial support, and we are deeply humbled by Charles & Kerry Beren's significant donation to kick off our Building Capital Campaign. Their generosity is a glowing testament to the community spirit we hold dear at Congregation Beth Israel.

Here's a brief outline of the comprehensive approach that Paul Davis Partnership will undertake:

 Revisiting the Foundations: Utilizing the original construction documents, the team will create CAD files and integrate modifications from past projects. This ensures that all changes harmonize with the building's foundational design.

From the Rabbi's Desk

While we cannot completely ignore the various COVID-19 strains that remain a threat, it seems much safer for us to come together and support one another. This past month, I saw how comforting it was for our congregants to come together to process our thoughts

and feelings about the Israel/Hamas war. Just gathering in our social hall and sharing our hopes and dreams for a safe Israel and an end of suffering brought me so much solace.

And over the first two nights of *Chanukah*, the joy and celebration were palpable as we gathered the first night at Hacienda Hay and Feed and the second night in our CBI social hall and sanctuary. With close to 200 people enjoying the gathering the first night and approximately 100 people in our social hall the second night, the singing and laughter filled my heart with joy.

We need each other. We are a family. So, this month, I want to encourage us to do an even better job of caring for CBI members who need our support. For years, Congregation Beth Israel had an active Caring Committee. When someone needed assistance with meals, a ride to a medical appointment, or just a phone call, we had volunteers in place and ready to help. Once our building shut down due to COVID-19, our Caring Committee initially made some phone calls but slowly dissolved.

It is now time to re-create our Caring Committee. If you can help make a meal, drive someone to an appointment, or simply make calls to those who rarely get out, please volunteer. Donna Shore, our acting office manager, will keep a list of all Caring Committee volunteers until one or two of our members sign up to serve as the Chairs—a vibrant Caring Committee embodies our core Jewish values and should again be a vital part of synagogue life on the Monterey Peninsula.

This month, we begin re-reading the book of Exodus that describes how our biblical ancestors became a community in the wilderness, a community of former slaves who reemerged as the tribes of Israel. Together they crossed the sea and found their freedom. Together they accepted God's revelation. Together they built the Tabernacle. Together may our Congregation, the house of Israel, strengthen one another.

This secular New Year, I hope and pray our Congregation becomes an extended family to all our members. Amen.



From Cantor Alisa

Dear Friends,

I began a very different message to you for this month about the devastation we all feel and the questions swirling in my heart and mind about Israel, Gaza, the entire Middle East, and our future. The situation is so charged that I thought it

best to look to the light of *Torah* and our Jewish calendar for wisdom and guidance.

As of this writing, the festival of *Chanukah* has just come to an end. It's so hard to put away the *menorah*, especially this year. The hope and beauty of its light continue to linger for me as does its teachings. One of my favorites, shared by R' Ari Lev Fornari, is that the story of *Chanukah* is about stretching—stretching the resources we have and expanding their potential. The way the Rabbis tell it, it is the story of lengthening the use of a little bit of oil, realizing we can live with less, and making it last. Even though *Chanukah* has now come to an end, we too have the potential to carry the light forward and make it last.

Rav Abraham Isaac Kook, the first Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi of (pre-state) Israel, wrote, "Every person must know and understand that deep within them a candle burns, and their candle is unlike the candle of any other. There is no person without a candle. Every person must know and understand that it is upon them to toil and reveal the light of their candle for others. They must kindle them into a great torch that will illuminate the entire world." In Proverbs 20:27, it's written, "The soul of a human being is the lamp of God, searching out its innermost parts." It is taught that our soul is God's way of reaching and enlightening us. Our task is to open our hearts, to feel and to pay attention.

The *menorah* not only represents the light but also the "tree of life," nodding to the festival of *Tu b'Shevat* which approaches later this month. I love how reoccurring themes rich with our fundamental values weave our holidays together throughout the year, fixed times on our calendar to help ground ourselves in our essential values—seeing the divine in all things, honoring creation, paying attention to the seasons and the seasons of our lives, focusing on what matters most—gratitude for the gift of life, making life-affirming choices, loving our neighbor, loving the stranger, being a light unto the nations and a light to those around us.

Deciduous trees have lost their leaves but, stirring deep within them, their sap rises with the hope of spring. And so with us, may we tap into the light of our souls stirring deep within, allowing us to see with new eyes and illumine a way forward through pathways of pleasantness and peace (Proverbs 3:18). – Cantor Alisa

Our Adult B'nai Mitzvah/Fundamentals of Judaism class is underway, and classes start again on **Wednesday evening**, **January 3**, **2024**, continuing thereafter every other Wednesday evening from **7:15 pm-9:00 pm**.

Samuel Helfont is an Associate Professor of Strategy and Policy in the Naval War College program at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California. His research focuses on international history and politics in the Middle East, especially Iraq and the Iraq Wars. He is also interested in Israeli, maritime, and naval history. His most recent book is Iraq against the World: Saddam, America, and the Post-Cold War Order (Oxford University Press, 2023). His work has also been published by Foreign Affairs, The International History Review, The Middle East Journal, Texas National Review, Orbis, The Washington Post, The New Republic, The American Interest, and War on the Rocks, among other outlets.

Helfont holds a PhD in Near Eastern Studies from Princeton University and completed a post-doctoral lectureship at the University of Pennsylvania. He has held affiliations with the Abbasi Program in Islamic Studies at Stanford University and the Foreign Policy Research Institute in Philadelphia. In 2023, he received the Naval War College's research award.

In addition to his academic background, Professor Helfont served as an intelligence officer in the US Navy and Navy Reserve. An Iraq War veteran, he completed deployments both afloat and ashore in the Middle East. He also served on Middle Eastern and counterterrorism missions at the Defense Intelligence Agency, the National Security Agency, and the Office of Naval Intelligence, among other commands.


