From the Rabbi's Desk

One of my favorite activities as a rabbi is adult education. I know that I am teaching people who want to be there and who want to learn. While many of our Hesed Academy students enjoy their studies, some

of our young students will say they are only attending religious school because their parents are making them! They don't yet appreciate how the Jewish education they are receiving might assist them. They cannot comprehend how Judaism might serve as an anchor in their lives when troubles arise. Unfortunately, they perceive Judaism as more of a burden than a gift.

But those who join me in our adult studies classes enjoy and celebrate the richness and pleasure that our traditions have to offer. Recently in our Biblical Hebrew class we studied a verse describing God's search for a partner for Adam. The text uses the words "Ezer C'negbo" which we learned can be translated to mean a variety of things. We learned that the Jewish Publication Society translation of "fitting helper" doesn't fully grasp the significance of those two words. We looked at many other translations that revealed that Adam's partner might best help him by challenging him. A fitting partner would, when needed, support and at other times when needed push. Our class began to discuss what are the best ways we can serve as companions to others? By the end of our lesson I certainly felt enriched and uplifted. The discussion continued even though I had to leave for my next appointment.

Similarly, I enjoy how our Shabbat Torah study discussion transitions from the social hall into the parking lot almost every week. As I am closing down the synagogue and locking the door, the study/discussion/debate continues. Those who participate find our wrestling with the text and the values in our teachings stimulating. As Tevye describes in "Fiddler on the Roof," having the time to sit and study our tradition is the greatest joy of all.

I realize our last Adult B'nai Mitzvah class was held before the start of COVID, over 5 years ago. If you have never celebrated becoming a Bar/Bat Mitzvah or want to review and renew your Hebrew and Jewish studies, then join me. Classes will begin late in the fall season and will be held weekly throughout the school year, date and time to be determined! Together we will strengthen our Hebrew skills and study some of our wonderful Jewish traditions and customs. Those who choose to do so might join in leading a Shabbat service and even chanting from the Torah scroll. Please call me if you are considering participating in our upcoming Adult B'nai Mitzvah class. Together may we celebrate the joy of Judaism.



From Cantor Alisa

Dear Friends,

After offering our "first fruits" and experiencing the revelatory spirit of the season at our Shavuot celebration and study in May, we move into the summer months, a

season of enjoying time off from school, going to camp, and vacationing with loved ones. On the Jewish calendar, however, summer is also a time of deep reflection—throughout our history, Jews have faced destruction and experienced great tragedies in the months of *Tammuz* and *Av*.

Beginning with the 17th of Tammuz (falling on July 6 this year), we commemorate the breach of the walls of Jerusalem just before the destruction of the Second Temple, the center of Jewish life, where our people experienced G-d's presence. This date marks the beginning of a period known as the "Three Weeks," leading up to Tisha B'Av (the 9th of Av, which falls on July 26), which is considered the saddest day on the Jewish calendar. It is a day of mourning over the destruction of both Temples and the brutality inflicted upon our people, including sages such as Rabbi Akiva, during the Roman occupation. Over time, this date has been linked to other tragedies that befell the Jewish people, including the expulsion of Jews from England, the Spanish Inquisition, and the Holocaust.

This period is intended to sensitize us to the broken times of our past as well as the brokenness in our world today. Our weekly services include special haftarah readings of Divine comfort to remind us that we have never been, and never will be, alone in our despair. A somber period, yes, but, as with many of our holidays, it offers us an invitation to pause, go deeper, and, at this time, reflect not only on our collective trauma but also on the tragedies and losses

in our own lives. In their endeavors to draw meaning from this period, our Sages of past and present offer us teachings about what happens when things fall apart. Who are we when everything we know to be sure and sound comes tumbling down? Might we find a reliable and stable inner refuge in the midst of change and uncertainty? Might some walls need to come down, whether personal or societal?

Rabbi Allan Lew (z"l) suggests that preparation for the High Holy Days actually begins on the 9th of Av, not the beginning of the month of Elul. The period of Tammuz and Av is intended to be a wake-up call to help prepare us for the wake-up call of the Shofar, sounded every day of Elul and on Rosh HaShanah. R' Lew discusses the practice of t'shuva as not just one of forgiveness but as a returning to our true and essential nature—a time to ask who we are beneath the surface, how do we face the reality of impermanence, and is there something we can count on in an ever-changing world? In his incredible book, This Is Real and You Are Completely Unprepared: The Days of Awe as a Journey of Transformation, R' Lew invites us to explore what happens when the constructs of our lives begin to crumble. With selfinquiry and guidance, R' Lew helps us face the reality of impermanence so that we can tend and strengthen the spiritual home within us and truly cherish the gift that life is.

May we learn from the lived wisdom of our ancestors and the inner temples of their hearts when our communities and our very lives were on the verge of destruction and, from that place draw strength, compassion, and the courage to ask "what is the true meaning of life and what is the world we wish to rebuild?"

Our Very Own Sam Helfont Inaugurates CBI's new Speaker Series:



Introducing the CBI Legacy Circle





Meet Steven River Gurtin

River was born in Jersey City, New Jersey but spent his early school years unhappy with his surroundings and looking for a change. Not sure what he wanted to do with his life, he hitchhiked around the country in 1968. He had numerous adventures, even living for a time in Haight-Ashbury and northern California communes during the height of the hippy revolution.

Finally, River moved to Big Sur, where he lived and worked for the next two years. This is also where he received his spirit name "River" during a ceremony to inspire his persistence in pursuing his creative nature and honor his nurturing soul. River relocated to the Monterey Peninsula and attended business classes at Monterey Peninsula College. During this time River also performed as a mime in the Jan Kessler Mime Troupe along with his sister, the talented Andrea Carter. She came out from New Jersey to join the troupe. They performed together around the Monterey Peninsula and Berkeley. When the troupe ended, River began to consider opening a bagel bakery as his new career.

River immersed himself in the world of bagels. He traveled back to New York and New Jersey and apprenticed at some well-established bagel bakeries to learn the trade. While there he also met the love of his life, Diana Case, during a whirlwind romance. While it took a few years before Diana could come out to California, they formed a bond that would carry them together for the rest of their lives. Armed with a head full of knowledge and a book full of diagrams and drawings, River traveled back to Monterey and joined with a local educator and businessperson, Bill Leone. The new partnership began to build the first bagel

bakery on the Monterey Peninsula. The business opened in 1976 and quickly earned praise and a strong local following.

During this time, River became a member of Congregation Beth Israel when it was located in Monterey. He was glad to re-establish his Jewish identity and connect with the Jewish community. River continued to work hard to build his bagel business. More stores were built, and the business continued to grow. River went on to establish a bagel consulting business and trained people throughout the country to open their own bagel bakeries.

When it was time to sell their interest in the bagel business River looked around for his next passion. He spent some time being a photographer, winning awards for his efforts, but, in 2001, when the 9/11 World Trade Center disaster occurred, River knew he had to help. He joined his wife Diana in volunteering with the Red Cross, traveling to New York to assist. When that disaster settled down, River continued volunteering with the Red Cross with an additional 12 deployments to help with other national disasters, including Hurricane Katrina. River also took a leadership role with the local chapter, becoming a trainer, a client casework supervisor and serving as Disaster Chair. During this time he also served on the Board of CBI's Jewish Food Festival, first as a director in charge of purchasing and then as a "Captain of Captains." River really enjoyed his involvement with CBI's Board of Trustees and the annual creation of CBI's justly famous Jewish Food Festival.

In 2015, River was diagnosed with an aggressive form of prostate cancer. Long years followed with various treatments and medications, including an experimental drug treatment program at Stanford. Throughout, River kept his positive attitude, and supported by his loving wife, did what was needed to maintain his health.

During the pandemic, River took up jogging most mornings and discovered that his creative spirit had returned when he began to create poetry while he jogged. He ultimately produced two books of his photography/poetry.

Recently River and Diana sold their Monterey home and settled in at The Park Lane, a senior retirement community. River still attends services at CBI when he can, sometimes by Zoom and other times in person.




