From the Rabbi's Desk

Stimulating, challenging, exciting, overwhelming, interesting, and exhausting are just some of the words I use when asked what it is like being the rabbi for Congregation Beth Israel. While most people

know that my duties include weekly Shabbat services and Torah study and religious school, few know how much our congregation does on a regular basis. While we enjoy a weekly Adult Hebrew class that I teach, on any given month we usually have a handful of special programs that require my attention. Just in this month of June (which is a "quiet month") we have 3 Bnai Mitzvah services, lunch with the clergy, Best Years (with Cantor Alisa this month), and IHELP dinner that my Rotary club is hosting. Add in Board of Trustees meetings, a variety of committee meetings, Havdalah on Carmel beach and one realizes that there is little down time at CBI!

June also marks the month when this rabbi starts working on the High Holy Days (those sermons don't write themselves) as well as prepping for our next Hesed Academy school year that begins September 10. Last month Cantor Alisa and I started reviewing how we might revamp the high school program, strengthening the connection between the Aleynu classes with the Madrichim (teacher's aide) program and adding a confirmation component.

Hours are spent outlining the school curriculum for each of Hesed Academy's four classes. My current plans are to have the youngest students focus on Jewish Holy Days, starting with Shabbat and working through all the Jewish festivals. Our second and third graders will study "The Jewish Home" from what we might do Jewishly in each location from nighttime prayer in our bedrooms to Jewish foods in our kitchens to the mezuzot on our doorposts. fourth and fifth graders will study Jewish practices around the globe and the rich history of Jewish culture that has evolved from Jewish migration. Finally our sixth and seventh grade students will focus on Jewish decision making. Added to this pre-Bnai Mitzvah class will be an hour of Hebrew studies with Cantor Alisa every week as the children prepare for their Bar/Bat Mitzvah.

After adding in visiting patients at CHOMP and my community work through JCM United's soup kitchen and Rotary, I sometimes frustrate myself and others that I am not speaking to our members often enough. The challenge is finding the time to get everything done each day. But working as a rabbi remains rewarding. I know I am making a significant positive difference in some members of our community.

If variety is the spice of life, then my job and CBI certainly makes my life spicy! For allowing me to continue to serve in this role, I thank all of you. June marks the end of my 29th year serving CBI. I feel so filled with blessings. Amen.

Last fall, CBI members Danny Bernstein and Leslie Steinway started Monterey Bayachad to help our Jewish community connect

virtually in real- time, across the Monterey County. They chose WhatsApp because it helps bridge iOS and Android users and is a fully encrypted service. Bayachad is a play on the Hebrew word B'Yachad which means together. The group already has 70+ participants, including Rabbi Bruce, Cantor Alisa, Binie from Chabad, and many CBI congregants. The group has helped coordinate event participation, rugelach baking and delivery, locating round challah for Rosh Hashanah, lulav and etrog orders, and more. It's been called a "lifeline" for last-minute requests and problem solving.

We encourage you to scan the QR code with your phone camera and join the group. If you already have WhatsApp on your phone, joining the group is very simple. If you do not, you will be prompted to download the app and can then use your phone number to log in. The goal is 100+ members in 2023!






CBI Interest Free Loan

Sam and Beryl are proud parents to Lisa and Andie who live in New York with their husbands and fabulous children. As their grandchildren grew older, it became increasingly difficult for the Levingers to live so far away from them. So, eight years ago, they bought a small home in New York to be closer to family. They now regularly travel East while maintaining a vibrant presence on the Peninsula. Sam is an avid golfer, a Meals on Wheels driver, and an active hospice worker. Beryl left academia in 2020 to join an international organization that works to strengthen democracy and civil society throughout the US and global south. Both are grateful to be part of the CBI family and recognize that their lives have been incalculably enriched by fellow congregants and CBI's clergy.




