

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### Reckoning and repentance

This is an important step in righting wrongs and creating a new kind of culture among students and teachers.



his is not an easy article to write, but it is ▲ one I felt I had to write. In November, the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR), the seminary that trains all our Reform rabbis, cantors, and Jewish educators, shared a disturbing report that identified sexual abuse, misconduct, and harassment — as well as a culture that protected the abusers — over the past 50 years. If you read the Jewish press, you may already have heard about it.

Three of the four members of my immediate family are alumni of HUC-JIR - we are sad, we are angry, and yet, we are proud that the College-Institute finally took responsibility for doing an investigation and committing to change and t'shuvah — repentance. The report (which you can read here, is the result of hundreds of interviews with rabbinical, cantorial, education, and graduate students and staff who shared their traumatic experiences at the hands of HUC-JIR faculty, administration, and leaders. I am grateful to the courageous victims who came forward, and I deeply mourn the truths that came to light.

I am grateful that the College-Institute engaged a third-party organization to do the investigation, and that they have made it available to the public. This is an important step in righting wrongs and creating a new kind of culture among students and teachers. I hope that our seminary will serve as an example to other organizations within and outside the Jewish world.

As a result of the HUC-JIR report, the two other major institutions of our Reform Movement, the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ), and the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) have also commissioned similar reports. Their findings will also be public. I do believe that bringing these findings to light will help us to create healthier, safer institutions for the future, aligned with the Jewish values we hold dear.

I have struggled personally with the report. Even though I was not subject to some of the harshest allegations of abuse and harassment, I knew that some of the professors and administrators named specifically were bullies and could often be unkind to students, especially female students. I wonder if I could have done more to stand up to them and looking at my own ordination certificate is difficult these days, as some of those names appear there.

One of the professors named in the report was Bonia Shur, the Professor of Sacred Music at HUC-JIR in Cincinnati for many years. We have sung some of his music here at Har Zion in our worship, especially his morning Kedushah, and also his Hodu Ladonai and The Rain is Over. I have decided, in consultation with Cantor Littman, that we will no longer sing Bonia's music in our worship at THZ. We made a similar decision with the music of Shlomo Carlebach after serious reports of his sexual assaults came to light. At some point in the new year, I will hold a town hall to discuss the report and our decision, but for now, I don't feel comfortable worshipping to the music of these composers. Fortunately for us, our Music Director, Eleanor Ackerman Rice quickly wrote a beautiful new Kedushah, that we've been singing for over a month now. Please come to services or tune in online to hear and learn it.

If reading the HUC-JIR report is distressing or brings up painful memories, or if you have anything you want to share or talk about, please let me or Cantor Littman know, and we'd be happy to speak with you. May we all be strengthened on this journey of truth and healing in our movement. I hope that our seminary, and Reform Judaism, will come out stronger, more devoted to creating a healthy and safe culture for all our students, and where God's presence is always felt as we learn and grow together.

## Yasher koach and todah rabah!

Joan and Alan Dessau have been members of the Mitzvah committee for a total of 15 years, and Joan was head of the committee from 2015 until 2020. This year, they have decided to retire from the committee. Their years of dedication are very much appreciated. Joan and Alan often stepped in when other leaders were not available, going above and beyond for Temple Har Zion members and their families. If you know them, you know that any service they led would be suffused with calm, kindness, and warmth. They will be missed.

In normal times, when someone dies, the family of the deceased sits Shiva, and volunteer leaders from the Temple Har Zion Mitzvah Committee lead the *Ma'ariv* (evening) service each evening, for up to six nights. To my knowledge, no family in need of a shiva leader has

found themselves without one, and that is thanks to the committee.

Being a committee member is no easy task. Because our tradition is to bury the deceased as quicky as possible, service leaders are called on to lead on a few days' notice or less. Those who undertake to lead on the first couple of nights, do so on a day's notice. Many rearrange their schedules in order to serve.

Service leaders need to be comfortable reading in front of a sometimes-large group of people, many of whom may be strangers. They need to be familiar with the service, and confident to read Hebrew. It's often an emotional time for the leaders: they are generally active Temple members, and they often have a connection with the family in

mourning. In normal times, they travel to the home of the bereaved family after dinner, at a time when many of us are usually winding down.

For the past year-and-a-half, leaders have had the additional challenge of leading virtually: managing to convey warmth and sympathy while essentially reading through the service aloud in an empty room and scrolling through the service on a shared screen so the mourners can follow. Initially, the service text was a scan of the siddur, but it proved cumbersome and difficult to read; Dara Kideckel developed an updated version that was easier to both manoeuver and to read. The leaders, daunted as many were by the technology, adapted, stepped up, and continued to volunteer to lead.

The committee numbers about 15. If you think that seems like a large group, consider this: in normal times, some may be out of town. In COVID times, some have technology issues. At any time, some people will have obligations and commitments that prevent them from leading. And sadly, sometimes more than one family is in mourning at the same time. As a result, there are times when a member volunteers for more than one evening during a Shiva week. We would welcome more members. Long thought to be a language that was dying out, there has been a resurgence of Yiddish in recent decades.


