Elul is the twelfth and final month in the Jewish calendar. It is a month that connects the past year with the coming year; a time when we reflect on where we stand and where we should be going.


THE KING IN THE FIELD!

The month of Elul is compared to a time when the king is met by the people out in the field; no need for formalities or protocol, as in the city. The Shofar serves as a spiritual wake-up call, a preparation for Rosh Hashanah. We traditionally blow the Shofar every weekday of the month of Elul.

CHAI ELUL

Elul 18 (September 21)

- Birthday of the Baal Shem Tov (1698-1760), founder of the Chassidic movement, known for his boundless love for every Jew.
- Birthday of the Alter Rebbe, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812), founder of Chabad Chassidism.
- Passing of the Maharal of Prague (1512-1609), a great luminary of Jewish Law and Mysticism.













ROSH HASHANAH

Tishrei 1 - 2 (October 2 - 4)

- We renew our acceptance of G-d's sovereignty over the universe at large and over each of us in particular.
- Light holiday candles on both nights of Rosh Hashanah.
- Eat symbolic foods: apple in honey & head of a fish on first day, and pomegranate on second day.
- Hear the Shofar on both days.

THE FAST OF GEDALIAH

Tishrei 3 (October 5)

A fast day, mourning the assassination of the Jewish royal Gedaliah ben Achikam, governor of the Land of Israel in 423 BCE.

YOM KIPPUR

Tishrei 10 (October 11-12)

This is the holiest day of the Jewish year. See times for when fast begins and ends below. Light candles before sunset.

SUKKOS

Tishrei 15 – 21 (October 17 - 23)

- The festival of Sukkos, commemorating G-d's enveloping protection of the Jews during their 40 year journey through the desert, is celebrated for seven days.
- · Light holiday candles.
- Eat all meals in a Sukkah
- Shake the "four kinds" every day, aside from Shabbos

SHMINI ATZERES Tishrei 22 (October 24)

- Light holiday candles.
- Vizkor Memorial Service

SIMCHAS TORAH Tishrei 23 (October 25)

Light holiday candles

 Today is Simchas Torah ("Rejoicing of the Torah"), on which we conclude, and begin anew, the annual Torah reading cycle.













Mar-Cheshvan 7 (November 8)

The last of the pilgrims to Jerusalem for the Sukkos festival would return to their homes.

Mar-Cheshvan 11 (November 12)

Yortzeit of Rachel, our matriarch. Died in childbirth on this day in the year 2208 from creation (1553 BCE) while giving birth to her second son, Benjamin. Jacob her husband buried her by the roadside, in Bethlehem; there, "Rachel weeps over her children, for they are gone [in exile]" (Jeremiah 31:14). Her tomb has served as a place of prayer for Jews for more than 35 centuries.

Mar-Cheshvan 20 (November 21)

The fifth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Sholom Dov Ber Schneerson (known as the "Rashab"), was born on the 20th of Cheshvan in the year 5621 from creation (1860).






FEBRUARY/ФЕВРАЛЬ 2017 SHEVAT/ADAR 5777

Shevat 10 (February 6)

The sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe. Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneerson. passed away in Brooklyn, on Shabbos morning, the 10th of Shevat, in the year 5710 from creation (1950).

Our Rebbe assumed leadership of Chabad. At a gathering of Chassidim marking the first anniversary of the passing of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, the late Rebbe's son-in-law, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson. delivered a Chassidic discourse entitled Basi L'Gani ("I Came into My Garden"), signifying his formal acceptance of the leadership of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement.

Shevat 15 (February 11)

The "New Year for Trees." This is the day in which the earliest-blooming trees in the Land of Israel emerge from their winter sleep and begin a new fruitbearing cycle.

We mark the day by eating fruit, particularly from the "seven kinds" that are singled out by the Torah in its praise of the bounty of the Holy Land. These 7 kinds are: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates.

Shevat 22 (February 18)

Rebbetzin Chaya Mushka Schneerson born 1901, wife of the Lubavitcher Rebbe, passed away on the 22nd of Shevat of the year 5748 (1988).



Adar 6 (March 4)

Moses Completes the Torah (1273 BCE) On this day Moses completed the book of Deuteronomy, concluding his review of the Torah which he began several weeks earlier on the 1st of Shevat. He then wrote down the completed Five Books of Moses, word for word, as dictated to him by G-d. This scroll of the Torah was put into the Holy Ark, next to the Tablets of Testimony.

Adar 7 (March 5)

Moses was born in Egypt on the 7th of Adar of the year 2368 from creation (1393 BCE) and passed away on his 120th birthday — Adar 7, 2488 (1273 BCE). According to one opinion, the year of Moses' birth was a "leap year," and he was born in the first Adar.

FAST OF ESTHER

Adar 11 (March 9)

The Fast of Esther is held each year in commemoration of the three-day fast called at Esther's behest before she risked her life to appear without permission before King Achashverosh to save the Jewish people from Haman's evil decree. Because Adar 13 (the day before Purim) falls on a Shabbos this year, the Fast of Esther, usually observed on that date, is moved back to Thursday since we do not fast on erev Shabbos or Shabbos.

PURIM

Adar 14 (March 12)

The festival of Purim celebrates the salvation of the Jewish people from annihilation.

Purim observances include:

- Listening to the Megillah (story of Purim), in evening of March 11 and again during the day of March 12.
- Giving charity to at least two, (but preferably more) needy individuals on Purim day.
- Sending gifts of food to friends; send a gift of at least two different kinds of ready to eat foods (e.g., pastry, fruit) to at least one friend on Purim day.
- Feast, Eat, Drink, and Be Merry. Purim should be celebrated with a special festive meal on Purim day.




On Passover we celebrate our liberation from our Egyptian oppressors on the fifteenth of Nissan in the year 2448 from the creation.


- Search for Chometz on the evening of April 9.
- Sell Chometz by morning of April 10.
- Finish eating chometz by 10:45 am on April 10.
- Burning of Chometz by 11:51 am on April 10.
- Light Holiday candles.
- Attend a Seder and eat Matzah on the nights of April 10 and 11.
- On second night of Passover start counting the Omer.
- Do not eat Chometz until April 18 after 9:25 pm (this is to allow time for the Chometz to be bought back).

THE FEAST OF MOSHIACH

Nissan 22 (April 18)

The last day of Passover is particularly associated with Moshiach and the future redemption. The Haftarah (reading from the Prophets) for this day is from Isaiah 11, which describes the promised future era of universal peace and divine perfection. Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Tov instituted the custom of partaking in "Moshiach's meal" on the afternoon of the last day of Passover. In addition to the Matzah eaten at "Moshiach's meal," the Rebbes of Chabad added the custom of drinking four cups of wine, as in the seder held on Passover's first days.

PASSOVER SHEINI -SECOND PASSOVER

lyar 14 (May 10)

A year after the Exodus, G-d instructed the people of Israel to bring the Passover offering on the afternoon of Nissan 14, and to eat it that evening. There were, however, certain persons who had become ritually impure and could not, therefore, prepare the Passover offering on that day. G-d established the 14th of lyar as a "second Passover" for anyone who was unable to bring the offering on its appointed time in the previous month. The day thus represents the "second chance" achieved by teshuvah, the power of repentance and "return." In the words of Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak of Lubavitch, "The Second Passover means that it's never too late."

LAG BA'OMER Iyar 18 (May 14)

- Passing of Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai ("Rashbi")
 On the day of his passing the 33rd day of the
 Omer Rabbi Shimon gathered his disciples
 and revealed many of the deepest secrets of
 the divine wisdom, and instructed them to
 mark the date as "the day of my joy."
- The plague that killed 24,000 students of Rabbi Akiva ceased on this day.

SHAVUOS -THE GIVING OF THE TORAH Sivan 6 - 7 (May 31 – June 1)

On the 6th of Sivan in the year 2448 from creation (1313 BCE), seven weeks after the Exodus, G-d revealed Himself on Mount Sinai. The entire people of Israel, as well as the souls of all future generations of Jews, heard G-d declare the first two of the Ten Commandments and witnessed G-d's communication of the other eight, through Moses

Sivan 6 (May 31)

- Passing of King David (837 BCE).
- Passing of Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Tov (1760)
 founder of the Chassidic movement.
- On the first night of Shavuos (Tuesday, May 30) we conduct an all-night Torah Study
- Hear the Ten Commandments Wednesday, May 31.
- It is customary to eat dairy foods on the first day of Shavuos because the Torah is likened to nourishing milk. Also, the Hebrew word for milk is chalav, and when the numerical value of each of the three letters in the Hebrew word chalav are added together (8 + 30 + 2) the total is forty. Forty is also the number of days Moses spent on Mount Sinai when receiving the Torah






Tammuz 17 (July 11)
