Elul 18 (September 9)

- Birthday of the Baal Shem Tov (1698-1760), founder of the Chassidic movement, known for his boundless love for every Jew.
- Birthday of the Alter Rebbe, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812), founder of Chabad Chassidism.
- Passing of the Maharal of Prague (1512-1609), a great luminary of Jewish Law and Mysticism.

ROSH HASHANAH

Tishrei 1 - 2 (September 20-22)

- We renew our acceptance of G-d's sovereignty over the universe at large and over each of us in particular.
- Light holiday candles on both days of Rosh
- Eat symbolic foods like: apple in honey & head of a fish on first day, and pomegranate on second day.
- Hear the Shofar on both days.

THE FAST OF GEDALIAH

Tishrei 4 (September 24)

A fast day, mourning the assassination of the Jewish royal Gedaliah ben Achikam, governor of the Land of Israel in 423 BCE.

The fast of Gedalia is normally the third of Tishrei, however since this year it is Shabbos, the fast is pushed off to Sunday, September 24 because we do not fast on Shabbos.

Teves 10 is observed as a day of fasting, in remembrance of the siege of Jerusalem.





Teves 20 (January 7)

Passing of Rabbi Moses ben Maimon in 1204, known in the Jewish world by the acronym "Rambam" and to the world at large as "Maimonides."

Teves 24 (January 11)

Passing of the Alter Rebbe, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812).

Shevat 10 (January 26)

The sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneerson, passed away in Brooklyn, on Shabbos morning, the 10th of Shevat, in the year 5710

Our Rebbe assumed leadership of Chabad. At a gathering of Chassidim marking the first anniversary of the passing of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, the late Rebbe's son-in-law, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, delivered a Chassidic discourse entitled Basi L'Gani ("I Came into My Garden"), signifying his formal acceptance of the leadership of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement.

TU B'SHEVAT

Shevat 15 (January 31)

The "New Year for Trees". This is the day in which the earliest-blooming trees in the Land of Israel emerge from their winter sleep and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle.

We mark the day by eating fruit, particularly from the "seven kinds" that are singled out by the Torah in its praise of the bounty of the Holy Land. These 7 kinds are: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates.

PURIM

Adar 14 (March 1)

The festival of Purim celebrates the salvation of the Jewish people from annihilation.

PURIM OBSERVANCES INCLUDE:

- Listening to the Megillah (story of Purim), in evening of February 28 and again during the day of March 1.
- Giving charity to at least two, (but preferably more) needy individuals on Purim day.
- Sending gifts of food to friends; send a gift of at least two different kinds of ready to eat foods (e.g., pastry, fruit) to at least one friend on Purim day.
- Feast, Eat, Drink, and Be Merry.
 Purim should be celebrated with a special festive meal on Purim day.

PASSOVER

Nissan 11 (March 27)







PASSOVER

Nissan 14 – 22 (March 30-April 7)

On Passover we celebrate our liberation from our Egyptian oppressors on the fifteenth of Nissan in the year 2448 from the creation.

- Sell Chometz by morning of March 30
- Search for Chometz on the evening of March 29
- Finish eating chometz by 10:53 am on March 30
- Burning of Chometz by 11:57 am on March 30.
- Light Shabbos and Holiday candles.
- Attend a Seder and eat round Shmurah Matzah on the nights of March 30 and 31.
- On second night of Passover start counting the Omer.
- Do not eat Chometz until April 7 after 9:00 pm (this is to allow time for the Chometz to be bought back).

THE FEAST OF MOSHIACH

Nissan 22 (April 7)

The last day of Passover is particularly associated with Moshiach and the future redemption. The Haftarah (reading from the Prophets) for this day is from Isaiah 11, which describes the promised future era of universal peace and divine perfection. Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Tov instituted the custom of partaking in "Moshiach's meal" on the afternoon of the last day of Passover. In addition to the Matzah eaten at "Moshiach's meal", the Rebbes of Chabad added the custom of drinking four cups of wine, as in the seder held on Passover's first days.

PESACH SHEINI - SECOND PESACH

A year after the Exodus, G-d instructed the people of Israel to bring the Passover offering on the afternoon of Nissan 14, and to eat it that evening. There were, however, certain persons who had become ritually impure and could not, therefore, prepare the Passover offering on that day. G-d established the 14th of Iyar as a "second Passover" for anyone who was unable to bring the offering on its appointed time in the previous month. The day thus represents the "second chance" achieved by teshuvah, the power of repentance and "return." In the words of Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak of Lubavitch, "The Second Passover means that it's never too late."



Sivan 28 (June 11)

On Monday, June 11, 1941 - Sivan 28 on the Jewish calendar - the Rebbe and his wife arrived in the USA after escaping Nazi-occupied Paris, and many perilous months in Vichy, France.

THE REBBE'S DAY

Tammuz 3 (June 16)

On the third of Tammuz in the year 2488 from creation (1273 BCE), our prophets teach us, the sun miraculously stood still in the sky over Jericho, delaying nightfall and enabling Joshua and the Jewish people to complete their victory over their enemies. In 1994 on this same date, millions of people around the world heard about the passing of the Rebbe. But the sun has not set. The Rebbe's radiant leadership continues to grow and illuminate the world. As the Zohar teaches, a righteous person, no longer bound by physical limitations, is more profoundly felt in this world then ever before.

Tammuz 12-13 (June 25-26)

Tammuz 12 is the birthday the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneerson of Lubavitch (1880-1950). It is also the day he was released from soviet prison.

Tammuz 17 (June 30)

The breaching of Jerusalem's walls and other tragic events that occurred on this day. The Roman general Apostomus burned the Torah and placed an idol in the Holy Temple. The fighting in Jerusalem continued for three weeks until the 9th of Av, when the Holy Temple was set aflame.
