- Eat symbolic foods like: apple in honey & head of a fish on first day, and pomegranate on second day.
- Hear the Shofar on both days.

#### THE FAST OF GEDALIAH

Tishrei 3 (September 12)

A fast day, mourning the assassination of the Jewish royal Gedaliah ben Achikam, governor of the Land of Israel in 423 BCE.

#### YOM KIPPUR

Tishrei 10 (September 18-19)

This is the holiest day of the Jewish year. See times for when fast begins and ends below. Light candles before sunset.

#### SUKKOS

**Tishrei 15 – 21 (September 24-30)** 

- The festival of Sukkos, commemorating G-d's enveloping protection of the Jews during their 40 year journey through the desert, is celebrated for seven days.
- Light holiday candles.

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
- · Eat all meals in a Sukkah.



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

Yortzeit of Rachel, our matriarch.


Died in childbirth on this day in the year

The anniversary of the printing of the Tanya.



Teves 10 is observed as a day of fasting, in remembrance of the siege of Jerusalem.

#### Teves 20 (December 28)

Passing of Rabbi Moses ben Maimon in 1204, known in the Jewish world by the acronym "Rambam" and to the world at large as "Maimonides."





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



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#### JANUARY/ЯНВАРЬ 2019 TEVES/SHEVAT 5779

#### **Teves 24 (January 1)**

Passing of the Alter Rebbe, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812).

#### Shevat 10 (January 16)

The sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn, passed away in Brooklyn, on Shabbos morning, the 10th of Shevat, in the year 5710 from creation (1950).

Our Rebbe assumed leadership of Chabad. At a gathering of Chassidim marking the first anniversary of the passing of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, the late Rebbe's son-in-law, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneersohn, delivered a Chassidic discourse entitled Basi L'Gani ("I Came into My Garden"), signifying his formal acceptance of the leadership of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement.

#### TU B'SHEVAT

Shevat 15 (January 21)

The "New Year for Trees". This is the day in which the earliest-blooming trees in the Land of Israel emerge from their winter sleep and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle.

We mark the day by eating fruit, particularly from the "seven kinds" that are singled out by the Torah in its praise of the bounty of the Holy Land. These 7 kinds are: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates.

#### Shevat 22 (January 28)

Rebbetzin Chaya Mushkah Schneersohn born 1901, wife of the Lubavitcher Rebbe, passed away on the 22nd of Shevat of the year 5748 (1988).

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The 10th day of the Jewish month of Shevat (Yud Shevat in Hebrew) corresponding to January 16, 2019, is the anniversary of passing (yortzeit) in 1950, of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe,

#### RABBI YOSEF YITZCHAK SCHNEERSOHN.







#### FEBRUARY/ФЕВРАЛЬ 2019 SHEVAT/ADAR I 5779

#### LEAP YEAR

This year is a leap year on the Jewish calendar. The Jewish leap year, which occurs 7 times in a 19-year cycle, has thirteen months instead of the regular year's twelve months. This is so the lunar-based Jewish year should remain aligned with the solar seasons (12 lunar months make up a total of 354 days -- slightly more than 11 days short of the 365.25 day solar cycle). The added month is called "Adar 1" and is inserted before the month of Adar (termed "Adar 2" in leap years). The festival of Purim celebrated on the 14th of Adar, is in Adar 2 on leap years, while the 14th of Adar 1 is marked only as "Purim Minor." Similarly, birthdays and most other anniversaries are marked in the second Adar, unless the actual event occurred in the first Adar during a leap year.


#### 7 Adar I (February 12)


Moses was born in Egypt on the 7th of Adar of the year 2368 from creation (1393 BCE) and passed away on his 120th birthday -- Adar 7, 2488 (1273 BCE). According to one opinion, the year of Moses' birth was a "leap year", and he was born in the first Adar.

#### **PURIM MINOR**

#### 14 Adar I (February 19)

In regular years, the 14th of Adar is Purim, the festival that celebrates the salvation of the Jewish people from Haman's evil decree in the year 3405 from creation (356 BCE). In a leap year which has two Adars, Purim is celebrated in Adar 2, and the 14th of Adar 1 is designated as Purim Katan, the "Little Purim."






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

#### 6 Adar II (March 13)

Moses Completes the Torah (1273 BCE) Moses completed the book of Deuteronomy, concluding his review of the Torah which he began several weeks earlier, on the 1st of Shevat. He then wrote down the completed Five Books of Moses, word for word, as dictated to him by G-d. This scroll of the Torah was put into the Holy Ark, next to the Tablets

of Testimony.

The Fast of Esther is held each year in commemoration of the three-day fast called at Esther's behest before she risked her life to appear without permission before King Achashverosh to save the Jewish people from Haman's evil decree.



#### 14 Adar II (March 21)

The festival of Purim celebrates the salvation of the Jewish people from annihilation.

#### PURIM OBSERVANCES INCLUDE:

- · Listening to the Megillah (story of Purim), in evening of March 20 and again during the day of March 21.
- · Giving charity to at least two, (but preferably more) needy individuals on Purim day.
- · Sending gifts of food to friends; send a gift of at least two different kinds of ready to eat foods (e.g., pastry, fruit) to at least one friend on Purim day.
- · Feast, Eat, Drink, and Be Merry. Purim should be celebrated with a special festive meal on Purim day.

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
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#### APRIL/ANDEAD 2019 ADAR II/NISSAN 5779

#### Nissan 11 (April 16)

The date of the Lubavitcher Rebbe's birthday in 1902. For more information about the Rebbe, visit www.TheRebbe.org.

#### **PASSOVER**

Nissan 15 - 22 (April 20-27)

On Passover we celebrate our liberation from our Egyptian oppressors on the fifteenth of Nissan in the year 2448 from the creation.

- Sell Chometz by morning of April 19
- Search for Chometz on the evening of April 18.
- Finish eating chometz by 10:39 am on April 19.
- Burning of Chometz by 11:47 am on April 19.
- · Light Shabbos and Holiday candles.
- Attend a Seder and eat Matzah on the nights of April 19, 20.
- On second night of Passover start counting the Omer.
- Do not eat Chometz until April 27 after 9:25 pm (this is to allow time for the Chometz to be bought back).

#### THE FEAST OF MOSHIACH

Nissan 22 (April 27)

The last day of Passover is particularly associated with Moshiach and the future redemption. The Haftarah (reading from the Prophets) for this day is from Isaiah 11, which describes the promised future era of universal peace and divine perfection. Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Tov instituted the custom of partaking in "Moshiach's meal" on the afternoon of the last day of Passover. In addition to the Matzah eaten at "Moshiach's meal", the Rebbes of Chabad added the custom of drinking four cups of wine, as in the seder held on Passover's first days.

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

#### MAY/MAH 2019 NISSAN/IYAR 5779

#### PESACH SHEINI -SECOND PESACH

Iyar 14 (May 19)

A year after the Exodus, G-d instructed the people of Israel to bring the Passover offering on the afternoon of Nissan 14, and to eat it that evening. There were, however, some people who had become ritually impure and could not, therefore, prepare the Passover offering on that day. G-d established the 14th of lyar as a "second Passover" for anyone who was unable to bring the offering on its appointed time in the previous month. The day thus represents the "second chance" achieved by teshuvah, the power of repentance and "return." In the words of Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak of Lubavitch, "The Second Passover means that it's never too late."

#### LAG BA'OMER

lyar 18 (May 23)

- Passing of Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai ("Rashbi"). On the day of his passing the 33rd day of the Omer - Rabbi Shimon gathered his disciples and revealed many of the deepest secrets of the divine wisdom, and instructed them to mark the date as "The day of my joy."
- The plague that killed 24,000 students of Rabbi Akiva ceased on this day.





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


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
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#### **JUNE/ИЮНЬ 2019** IYAR/SIVAN 5779

#### SHAVUOS -THE GIVING OF THE **TORAH**

Sivan 6 - 7 (June 9-10)

On the 6th of Sivan in the year 2448 from creation (1313 BCE), seven weeks after the Exodus. G-d revealed Himself on Mount Sinai. The entire people of Israel, as well as the souls of all future generations of Jews, heard G-d declare the first two of the Ten Commandments and witnessed G-d's communication of the other eight. through Moses.

#### Sivan 6 (June 9)

- Passing of King David (837 BCE).
- · Passing of Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Toy (1760) founder of the Chassidic movement.
- On the first night of Shavuos (Saturday, June 8), we conduct an all-night Torah Study.
- Hear the Ten Commandments Sunday, June 9.
- It is customary to eat dairy foods on the first day of Shavuos because the Torah is likened to nourishing milk. Also, the Hebrew word for milk is Chalay, and when the numerical values of each of the three letters in the Hebrew word chalav are added together 8 + 30 + 2 - thetotal is forty. Forty is also the number of days Moses spent on Mount Sinai when receiving the Torah.








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#### JULY/MOAD 2019 SIVAN/TAMMUZ 5779

#### Sivan 28 (July 1)

On Monday, July 1, 1941 - Sivan 28 on the Jewish calendar - the Rebbe and his wife arrived in the USA after escaping Nazi-occupied Paris, and many perilous months in Vichy, France.

#### THE REBBE'S DAY

#### Tammuz 3 (July 6)

On the third of Tammuz in the year 2488 from creation (1273 BCE), our prophets teach us, the sun miraculously stood still in the sky over Jericho, delaying nightfall and enabling Joshua and the Jewish people to complete their victory over their enemies. In 1994 on this same date, millions of people around the world heard about the passing of the Rebbe. But the sun has not set. The Rebbe's radiant leadership continues to grow and illuminate the world. As the Zohar teaches, a righteous person, no longer bound by physical limitations, is more profoundly felt then ever before.

#### Tammuz 12–13 (July 15-16)

Tammuz 12 is the birthday of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn of Lubavitch (1880-1950). It is also the day he was released from soviet prison.


#### Tammuz 17 (July 20)


The breaching of Jerusalem's walls and other tragic events that occurred on this day. The Roman general Apostomus burned the Torah and placed an idol in the Holy Temple. The fighting in Jerusalem continued for three weeks until the 9th of Av, when the Holy Temple was set aflame.

#### THE FAST OF 17 TAMMUZ

#### Tammuz 18 (July 21)

Since this year the 17 of Tammuz falls on Shabbos, the fast is pushed off to Sunday, July 21, because we do not fast on Shabbos.






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

#### SHABBOS CHAZON

Av 8 (August 10)

The Shabbos before the Ninth of Av is called Shabbos Chazon ("Shabbos of Vision") after the opening words of the day's reading from the prophets. On this Shabbos, say the Chassidic masters, we are granted a vision of the Third Temple; we may not see it with our physical eyes, but our souls see it.

#### TISHA B'AV

#### Menachem-Av 9 (August 10)

Both the first and second Holy Temples which stood in Jerusalem were destroyed on Av 9: the First Temple by the Babylonians in the year 3338 from creation (423 BCE), and the second by the Romans in 3829 (69 CE).

#### FAST OF TISHA B'AV

#### Menachem-Av 10 (August 11)

Being that this year the 9th of Av is Shabbos, the fast is pushed off to Sunday, August 11 because we do not fast on shabbos.

Menachem-Av 15 (August 16)

A happy and joyous day.

#### SHABBOS NACHAMU

(August 17)

The Shabbos following Tishah B'Av is called the "Shabbos of Consolation," after the opening words of the day's reading from the prophets.

#### Menachem-Av 20 (August 21)

Av 20 is the day of passing of the Lubavitcher Rebbe's father, Rabbi Levi Yitzchak Schneersohn (1878-1944), in Alma Ata, Kazakhstan.






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
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


#### Elul 18 (September 18)

- Birthday of the Alter Rebbe, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812), founder of Chabad Chassidism.
- Passing of the Maharal of Prague (1512-1609), a great luminary of Jewish Law and Mysticism.

#### Tishrei 1 - 2 (September 30-October 1)

- We renew our acceptance of G-d's sovereignty over the universe at large and over each of us in particular.
- Light holiday candles on both days of Rosh Hashanah.
- Eat symbolic foods like: apple in honey
   head of a fish on first day, and
   pomegranate on second day.
- Hear the Shofar on both days.





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
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# Blessings for Holiday & Shabbas CANDLE LIGHTING

Women and girls above the age of three should light candles before every Shabbos and festival NO LATER than the time indicated on the calendar for that specific date. (If there is no woman in the house, the head of the household should light). It is customary to give charity before lighting the candles. Recite the appropriate blessings (as numbered), and then make your own personal prayer.

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

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


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


















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
