## THE KING IN THE FIELD!

The month of Elul is compared to a time when the king is met by the people out in the field; no need for formalities or protocol, as in the city. The Shofar serves as a spiritual wake-up call, a preparation for Rosh Hashanah. We traditionally blow the Shofar every weekday of the month of Elul.

## CHAI ELUL

Elul 18 (September 18)

- Birthday of the Baal Shem Tov (1698-1760), founder of the Chassidic movement, known for his boundless love for every Jew.
- Birthday of the Alter Rebbe, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812), founder of Chabad Chassidism.
- Passing of the Maharal of Prague (1512-1609), a great luminary of Jewish Law and Mysticism.

## **ROSH HASHANAH**

Tishrei 1 - 2 (September 30 – October 1)

- We renew our acceptance of G-d's sovereignty over the universe at large and over each of us in particular.
- · Light holiday candles on both days of Rosh Hashanah.
- Eat symbolic foods like: apple in honey & head of a fish on first day, and pomegranate on second day.
- Hear the Shofar on both days.



## THE FAST OF GEDALIAH

Tishrei 3 (October 2)

A fast day, mourning the assassination of the Jewish royal Gedaliah ben Achikam, governor of the Land of Israel in 423 BCE.

## YOM KIPPUR

Tishrei 10 (October 8 - 9)

This is the holiest day of the Jewish year. See times for when fast begins and ends below. Light candles before sunset on October 8.

## SUKKOS

Tishrei 15 – 21 (October 14 - 20)

- The festival of Sukkos, commemorating G-d's enveloping protection of the Jews during their 40 year journey through the desert, is celebrated for seven days.
- Light holiday candles.
- Eat all meals in a Sukkah starting the evening of October 13 until October 21.
- Shake the "four kinds" every day, aside from Shabbos.

## SHMINI ATZERES

Tishrei 22 (October 21)

- Light holiday candles.
- Yizkor Memorial Service.

## SIMCHAS TORAH

Tishrei 23 (October 22)

- Light holiday candles.
- Today is Simchas Torah ("Rejoicing of the Torah"), on which we conclude, and begin anew, the annual Torah reading cycle.



## Mar-Cheshvan 7 (November 5 )

The last of the pilgrims to Jerusalem for the Sukkos festival would return to their homes.

## Mar-Cheshvan 11 (November 9)

Yartzeit of Rachel, our matriarch. Died in childbirth on this day in the year 2208 from creation (1553 BCE) while giving birth to her second son, Benjamin. Jacob her husband buried her by the roadside, in Bethlehem; there, "Rachel weeps over her children, for they are gone [in exile]" (Jeremiah 31:14). Her tomb has served as a place of prayer for Jews for more than 35 centuries.

## Mar-Cheshvan 20 (November 18)

The fifth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Sholom Dov Ber Schneerson (known as the "Rashab"), was born on the 20th of Cheshvan in the year 5621 from creation (1860).

#### Kislev 1 (November 29)

This date is the anniversary of the Rebbe's first public appearance after the heart attack that he suffered on Simchas Torah 1977.



## THE FAST OF THE TENTH OF TEVES

#### Teves 10 (January 7)

Teves 10 is observed as a day of fasting, in remembrance of the siege on Jerusalem.

#### Teves 20 (January 17)

Passing of Rabbi Moses ben Maimon in 1204, known in the Jewish world by the acronym "Rambam" and to the world at large as "Maimonides."

#### Teves 24 (January 21)

Passing of the Alter Rebbe, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812). He was the founder of Chabad and the author of the book of Tanya and the Shulchan Aruch.

## FEBRUARY/ФЕВРАЛЬ 2020 SHEVAT/ADAR 5780

#### Shevat 10 (February 5)

- · The sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn, passed away in Brooklyn, on Shabbos morning, the 10th of Shevat, in the year 5710 from creation (1950).
- Our Rebbe, the Lubavitcher Rebbe, assumed leadership of Chabad in 1951. At a gathering of Chassidim marking the first anniversary of the passing of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, the late Rebbe's son-in-law. Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, delivered a Chassidic discourse entitled Basi L'Gani ("I Came into My Garden"), signifying his formal acceptance of the leadership of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement.

### TU B'SHEVAT


#### Shevat 15 (February 10)

The "New Year for Trees". This is the day in which the earliest-blooming trees in the Land of Israel emerge from their winter sleep and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle.

We mark the day by eating fruit, particularly from the "seven kinds" that are singled out by the Torah in its praise of the bounty of the Holy Land. These 7 kinds are: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates.

#### Shevat 22 (February 17)

Rebbetzin Chaya Mushkah Schneerson born 1901, wife of the Lubavitcher Rebbe, passed away on the 22nd of Shevat of the year 5748 (1988)



The 10th day of the Jewish month of Shevat (Yud Shevat in Hebrew) corresponding to January 5, 2020, is the anniversary of passing (yortzeit) in 1950, of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe,

## RABBI YOSEF YITZCHAK SCHNEERSOHN.


It is also the day when, in 1951, the seventh Rebbe,

## MARCH/MAPT 2020 ADAR/NISSAN 5780

#### Adar 7 (March 3)

Moses was born in Egypt on the 7th of Adar of the year 2368 from creation (1393 BCE) and passed away on his 120th birthday -- Adar 7, 2488 (1273 BCE). According to one opinion, the year of Moses' birth was a "leap year," and he was born in the first Adar.

#### FAST OF ESTHER

#### Adar 13 (March 9)

The Fast of Esther is held each year in commemoration of the three-day fast called at Esther's behest before she risked her life to appear without permission before King Achashverosh to save the Jewish people from Haman's evil decree.


## **PURIM**

Adar 14 (March 10)

The festival of Purim celebrates the salvation of the Jewish people from annihilation.

Purim observances include:

- Listening to the Megillah (story of Purim), in evening of March 9 and again during the day of March 10.
- Giving charity to at least two, (but preferably more) needy individuals on Purim day.
- Sending gifts of food to friends; send a gift of at least two different kinds of ready to eat foods (e.g., pastry, fruit) to at least one friend on Purim day.
- Feast, Eat, Drink, and Be Merry.
   Purim should be celebrated with a special festive meal on Purim day.








- · Search for Chometz on the evening of April 7.
- Sell Chometz by morning of April 8.
- Finish eating chometz by 10:46 am on April 8.
- Burning of Chometz by 11:52 am on April 8.
- · Light Shabbos and Holiday candles.
- · Attend a Seder, drink 4 cups of wine, and eat Shmurah Matzah on the nights of April 8 & 9.
- . On the second night of Passover start counting the Omer.
- Do not eat Chometz until April 16 after 9:30 pm (this is to allow time for the Chometz to be bought back).

## THE FEAST OF MOSHIACH

#### Nissan 22 (April 16)

The last day of Passover is particularly associated with Moshiach and the future redemption. The Haftarah (reading from the Prophets) for this day is from Isaiah 11, which describes the promised future era of universal peace and divine perfection. Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Tov instituted the custom of partaking in "Moshiach's meal" on the afternoon of the last day of Passover. In addition to the Matzah eaten at "Moshiach's meal", the Rebbes of Chabad added the custom of drinking four cups of wine, as in the seder held on Passover's first days.



- · Passing of Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai ("Rashbi"). On the day of his passing - the 33rd day of the Omer - Rabbi Shimon gathered his disciples and revealed many of the deepest secrets of the divine wisdom, and instructed them to mark the date as "The day of my joy."
- . The plague that killed 24,000 students of Rabbi Akiva ceased on this day.

## SHAVUOS - The Giving of the Torah Sivan 6 - 7 (May 29-30)

- On the 6th of Sivan in the year 2448 from creation (1313 BCE), seven weeks after the Exodus, G-d revealed Himself on Mount Sinai The entire people of Israel, as well as the souls of all future generations of Jews, heard G-d declare the first two of the Ten Commandments and witnessed G-d's communication of the other eight, through Moses.
- On the first night of Shavuos (Thursday, May 28), we conduct an all-night Torah Study.
- Hear the Ten Commandments Friday, May 29.
- It is customary to eat dairy foods on the first day of Shavuos because the Torah is likened to nourishing milk. Also, the Hebrew word for milk is Chalay, and when the numerical values of each of the three letters in the Hebrew word chalav are added together - 8+30+2 – the total is forty. Forty is also the number of days Moses spent on Mount Sinai when receiving the Torah.



## SPECIAL DAYS

Tammuz 12-13 (July 4-5)

Tammuz 12 is the birthday the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn of Lubavitch (1880-1950). It is also the day he was released from soviet prison.

## THE FAST OF 17 TAMMUZ

Tammuz 17 (July 9)

A fast day, devoted to mourning the breaching of Jerusalem's walls and other tragic events that occurred on this day. The Roman general Apostomes burned the Torah and placed an idol in the Holy Temple. The fighting in Jerusalem continued for three weeks until the 9th of Av, when the Holy Temple was set aflame.

### SHABBOS CHAZON

Av 4 (July 25)

The Shabbos before the Ninth of Av is called Shabbos Chazon ("Shabbos of Vision") after the opening words of the day's reading from the prophets. On this Shabbos, say the Chassidic masters, we are granted a vision of the Third Temple; though we may not see it with our physical eyes, but our souls see it.

## TISHA B'AV

Menachem-Av 9 (July 30)

A fast day, devoted to the mourning of both the first and second Holy Temples which stood in Jerusalem which where destroyed on Av 9: the First Temple by the Babylonians in the year 3338 from creation (423 BCE), and the second by the Romans in 3829 (69 CE). The fast begins on evening of July 29 and ends at nightfall of July 30.






