We are pleased to have learned that [Jevaia Oral Health Care](#), a non-profit organization in Nepal and recipient of a Tikkun Olam grant, has been able to use our donation to purchase a dental chair for its new clinic in the village of Lwang Ghalel. Jevaia was co-founded by its executive director Laura Spero (niece of Susan Spero) and has established dental clinics in rural Nepal. The impact of COVID - 19 in the area had delayed plans to open this clinic after efforts to launch it on the part of local health officials.
