Yizkor services are held on Yom Kippur, Shemini Atzeret, the eighth day of Pesach, and the second day of Shavuot.

B'nai Havurah's tradition is to observe Yizkor on the Saturday prior to each holiday, with the exception of Yom Kippur. The second day of Shavuot is on May 17, which is why we will include a short Yizkor service on Saturday, May 15.

Rebirth, Renewal, and Revelation: A Community Shavuot Experience


Sunday, May 16, 6:00 - 11:00 pm

EarthLinks, one of our grantees and the featured grantee for our 2021 Tikkun Olam Shabbat, is one of the organizations supporting this program.

"Havurah Ruach was proud and excited to join in the Tikkun Olam effort in supporting people in the Denver area experiencing homelessness and poverty. Not only did we contribute toward a night of meals for women and trans-identifying individuals in need, but we supported the struggling restaurant industry, namely the SAME Café, which also supports and serves everyone in the high-needs community with dignity – a Triple Tikkun! We paid for, picked up, and delivered an aromatic and healthy catered meal (soup, salad, entrée, and dessert!). Scholars have advocated for reparations as an effective pathway to equity, and they have been used around the world to reconcile past atrocities. But what
