

The Maharal in Parshas Devarim 1:22 asks a question between a Rashi in our Parsha with a Rashi in Devarim. Rashi in Devarim says the Meraglim are described as 'anashim.' They were Keshairim – good, chashuv people at the time they left. This seems to contradict a Rashi in our Parsha 13:26 which says that from the moment they left, they were intent on doing something improper.

The Maharal establishes a yesod that the Meraglim themselves were Keshairim when they left. However, they took on a job as a shaliach for Klal Yisrael, for the people who sent them who did not have good intentions. They sent Meraglim to Eretz Yisrael doubting that they could successfully capture the Land in the first place. Says the Maharal, a person who becomes a Shaliach is influenced by the agency which he has; he is influenced by the person who is sending him. Shelucho Shel Adam Kemoso -- a person's messenger is like the person himself. According to the Maharal, Shelucho Shel Adam Kemoso means a spiritual connection -- a connection in the sense that if someone sends me and I agree to be his agent, his intentions and desires influence me. Perhaps a source for this is the Mishnah Berachos 34b where it says it is not a good sign if you are davening and make a mistake in your request. Moreover, if you are a Shaliach Tzibur, it is a siman ra for those who sent you as well.

The Chasam Sofer says we find occasionally in Chumash that a Shaliach is called a Malach, an angel. When a person is a Shaliach for HKBH, then the word Malach is appropriate. After all, if we are going to say that there is an influence on an agent who is sent by man, certainly it should be so if you are sent by G-d.

What should the Meraglim have done? They were sent and affected by Klal Yisrael, and yet we blame the Meraglim. Says the Chidushei Harim, when they went, they should not have seen themselves as agents of Klal Yisrael. Rather, they should have seen themselves as Sheluchim from Moshe Rabbeinu, as Sheluchim from HKB"H. They should have seen themselves as going because HKBH was sending them.

When G-d is sending you, then the influence of Hashem is what guides you. Since they saw themselves as agents of the people, they retained the negative influence from the people. This is what was lacking in the Meraglim.

The Sfas Emes adds we now can have a new perspective on Gadol Ha'Mitzuve V'Oseh Li'Mi Sheino M'Tzuva V'Oseh -- greater is one who is commanded and does, then one who is not commanded and does. If you are commanded by G-d and you act as a Shaliach of HKB"H, it adds a whole different perspective to the mission.
