This week's parsha craft will be an edible mizbeach. The answer to last week's riddle was the **כהן גדול** had 12 names of the **שבטים** on the **חושן**, another 12 engraved on the 2 **אבני שהם** on each shoulder strap of the **אפוד** which makes 24 names. For the bonus answer there is also the name of Hashem on the **ציץ** which was on his forehead, another name of Hashem on a parchment inserted in the **חושן** called **אורים ותומים**. Additionally according

to **מדרש** the names of **יצחק** **אברהם** and **יעקב** were engraved on the **חושן** as well, plus an engraving on the **חושן** saying the **שבטים** of Hashem. So the grand total of names could be up to 30!

This week's question is: I'm shorter than those next to me, that may be true, but the message I give is about one very great, who considered himself small.

The Ramban in his introduction to Sefer Vayikra says that Hashem commanded us to bring korbanos as an opportunity for forgiveness to prevent our aveiros from causing the Shechina to leave Klal Yisrael. There are several difficulties with this notion that the purpose of the korbanos are limited to just keeping the Shechina in the Mishkan. First, a korban is called a 'rei'ach nichoach' in Parshas Noach well before the Mishkan was built. From this we see that Korbanos are brought not just to remove a chisaron, but to provide a benefit as well. Second, there are several Gemaras that give reasons for the korbanos. For example, the Gemara Rosh Hashana 16a says to offer the Sh'tei Halechem on Shavuos to garner blessing among the fruits of the year. The korbanos are a source of beracha that don't simply prevent the Shechina from leaving -- it actually brings specific beracha, something positive. A Korban Todah, which

is a korban of thanksgiving, is clearly more than just a kapparah for an aveira. The Shem MiShmuel explains with a beautiful yesod from his father, the Avnei Nezer. In the Torah the place we built for Hashem's Shechina is called the Mishkan, but when Shlomo HaMelech builds it, it is called the Beis Hamikdash. However, these names are used interchangeably. 'V'asu li mikdash' refers to the Mishkan. So, we have two names -- Mishkan and Mikdash -- which are used interchangeably, but in the midbar it is primarily called Mishkan, and in Eretz Yisrael it is referred to as Mikdash. Says the Avnei Nezer, each name represents a particular function of the Mishkan and Mikdash, respectively. Mishkan denotes the residence of the Shechina among Klal Yisrael; it represents a place where korbanos are brought for forgiveness to prevent the Shechina's departure. Since the Shechina came upon us in the midbar, the Mishkan was, as the Ramban explains, an inyan of kapparah for the Eigel, so

the primary name used in the midbar is Mishkan. However, Mishkan is not only a place of kapparah and prevention; it is also a Mikdash, a place that brings increasingly higher levels of kedusha. Mikdash denotes this second aspect - a place of incredible beracha and nachas ruach to Hashem. This attribute is characterized in the name Mikdash. This is the duality of Mishkan and Mikdash. The Ramban's introduction is explaining the transition of Shemos to Vayikra, and so, his explanation is true for the Mishkan aspect -- to preserve a place where there is forgiveness and interaction between G-d and Klal Yisrael. Yet, there is also the Mikdash component of facilitating growth to higher levels of kedusha. Thus, there is a Mishkan and there is a Mikdash; the place of kapparah, and the place of fostering a closer connection with G-d. These are the 2 aspects of Avodas Hashem, the 2 aspects of this special place where the Shechina resides.
