The beginning of this week's Parsha is the Parsha of the Avadim. It says **כי בני ישראל, עבדים**. We must remember that we are Avadim to HKBH. The Gemara Kiddushin says this pasuk is the reason for the commandment that an Eved Ivri that wants to remain an Eved has to have his ear drilled. This ear that heard **כי לי בני ישראל, עבדים** at Sinai will have his ear drilled if he decides to remain an Eved to a person.

However every Aveira we do is a violation of what we heard at Har Sinai. If so for every Aveira we do we should drill our ear for not listening to what we heard at Sinai. Why is **כי לי בני ישראל, עבדים** connected to drilling the ear more than any other violation?

The Pachad Yitzchak on Sukkos writes what is worse - Someone who is blind or someone who is deaf? On the one hand, Suma k'meis -- A blind

person is considered as if he is dead. We don't find that type of expression by a deaf person. On the other hand, the Gemara Bava Kamma 85b says that the financial penalty for causing someone to go deaf is much higher and more stringent than the penalty for blinding someone. It seems from the Gemara that one who is deaf is in a worse condition than one who is blind, which contradicts the Gemara of Suma k'meis.

Rabbeinu Yonah in Shaarei Teshuva says sight is inherently more important. A Suma is k'meis. However, when it comes to the halachos of Mazikin, those halachos are tied to the value of a person to be sold in the market place as an Eved. When we talk about blinding or making someone deaf, we estimate the value based on being an Eved. To be an Eved, hearing is the most important tool because if you can't hear instructions, you can't be

an Eved. If he can't see, there are the master can instruct him to do certain tasks. For the average person, sight is more important; but for an Eved, hearing is more important.

So, with **כי לי בני ישראל, עבדים**, we refer to Klal Yisrael being Avadim to Hashem. To be an Eved, hearing is the priority; listening and accepting is the most important thing. When it comes to being Mekabeil Avdus, we say if you don't understand **כי לי בני ישראל, עבדים** and you want to be an Eved to another person, your ear needs to be drilled. You are using the Koach Ha'shmia improperly. Therefore, the ear is more connected to an Eved than to anything else.
